We are appealing to dog owners to be responsible when out enjoying the countryside and to keep all dogs on a lead when around any livestock.

As lockdown begins to ease and people start to go out and about again there is an increasing danger that dogs off the lead will worry sheep and other livestock. This is especially worrying as lambing season will soon be in full swing.



Livestock worrying is a criminal offence and the penalty can be six months imprisonment and/or a fine of up to £1000.

Sgt Greg Fergusson, Rural Crime Lead at Wiltshire Police, said: "We are asking all dog owners to help us to protect livestock in Wiltshire by putting your dog on a lead. "It can be traumatic for farmers who have to deal with the aftermath of an incident, not to mention the financial impacts it has.

"Whether your dog is large or small, naughty or well behaved, the message is simple: Your dog, your duty. Keep your dog on a lead when you are near livestock. "You can't assume your dog's good nature means it won't chase or attack livestock. If your dog's natural instinct to chase livestock kicks in it could be too late before you realise anything is wrong.

Livestock worrying is traditionally thought of as a dog biting/attacking livestock, but it also means:

Chasing livestock in such a way as may be reasonably expected to cause injury or suffering; in the case of ewes, this includes abortion or loss or reduction in the number of offspring she has

Not having a dog on a lead or under close control when close by, or in a field or enclosure with livestock.

On Monday to Friday, but excluding Good Friday and Easter Monday You need to be proposed by two people on the Parish Electoral Roll, and give your permission to stand as a candidate. You can book a time online to get your forms checked and recorded.

Parking Enforcement in Market Lavington during 2020

Every two or three years I make a Freedom of Information request for a list showing how many visits have been made by Parking Enforcement Officers and how many parking tickets have been handed out.

Looking at the listed totals we had 214 visits and 39 enforcement notices were given out. At first glance of the data it is noticeable that there were many short visits, with 104 of the visits lasting less than a minute. This is because of the way the visits are recorded. If the visits are grouped by date we get a clearer picture, for example on December 23rd we had 5 visits listed, 3 of 1 second, 1 of 16 seconds and one of 48 minutes and 4 seconds. On New Years Eve we had 4 visits totalling 10 seconds.

I now have a breakdown according to street visited, and some of these short visits can be explained by looking at roads visited. If when driving up Church St. there are no problems this registers as 1 or 2 seconds, if there are there is a second longer visit a few minutes later, and the same for Rochelle Court. Counting up the dates on which we were visited, we had 44 roughly half hour visits by the Parking Enforcement team.

During the early months of COVID we had 3 visits in 4 months, but more at other times of year. If you see an enforcement officer one day it doesn't mean that you are

safe for a week or so, because in August we were visited on 3 consecutive days. Each year we get more visits and more tickets are handed out. I hope that whoever is elected to represent us at Wiltshire Council will ensure that we continue to be visited to ensure a safe free flow of traffic and access for emergency vehicles.

DATES FOR EDINGTON MINI MUSIC FESTIVAL ANNOUNCED

The Edington Music Festival A Festival of Music within the Liturgy

There will be a live Festival of Music within the Liturgy in Edington Priory Church this year, to run from Compline on the evening of Thursday 26 August until Eucharist on Sunday morning 29 August.

Due to the strong possibility of ongoing government restrictions, Director Richard Pinel, in consultation with the church and community, has taken the decision to limit both the number of participants and the duration of the festival in order to create the safest possible environment for all involved.





Litter in Market Lavington

We live in a most attractive area of Wiltshire. Our village has a mix of housing and socially minded people and a little local employment. Most people of all ages travel to shop, work and socialise with the use of the car, but there lies a problem. Litter on the roadsides. To throw down, drop or otherwise deposit and leave litter in any place open to the air, including private land, is a criminal offence which could raise a fine of up to £2,500

Throwing beer, red bull and soft drink cans, plastic bottles, fast food takeaway packs, etc has long been a problem, particularly along the C20 from Devizes into the village, but in the last 12 months an antisocial element of our village, or their friends or associates are targeting our verges with litter. Every day more mounts up, particularly Carling Black Label, Red Bull and Stella cans are thrown out of cars. It looks disgusting and visitors and the majority of our residents must think we live in a deprived area.

It is the responsibility of the Council to keep our streets and roadsides clean, but everyone should have a social care how their community looks. The Council always have limited funds and there isn't the manpower to clean up after 'litter louts', so for those people who feel minded to throw cans, bottles, sweet papers, cardboard cups, etc out of cars before getting home – stop it. You are breaking the law.

If you care about how your village looks and see anyone dropping litter perhaps a word in their ear might help. If you see it being thrown from a passing vehicle record the index number and type of vehicle and report it to the police. We have a village Facebook so you may think it appropriate to 'name and shame' You may feel inclined to pick it up and take it home or place it in a litter bin. Whatever, let's try to have pride in where we live.

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Hello April!

There are many quotes about this season that I love. One of my favourites is by Harriet Ann Jacobs:

"The beautiful spring came; and when Nature resumes her loveliness, the human soul is apt to revive also."

I cannot remember a time when a revival of the soul is more needed than this spring. Dare we dream of our release from lockdown? Meeting friends and family? Going places? Eating out? Shopping? Even holidays?

There are many historical analogies that have been quoted for what we have suffered. The worst pandemic since the Spanish Flu of 1918-21. The greatest leap in public debt since the Second World War. The biggest drop in economic productivity since the Great Depression. We survived all of those and historically even worse - even the Great Plague of 1665 and the Black Death of 1346 to 1353, which was the worst pandemic in human history.

In that context, I am impressed that Geoffrey Chaucer wrote The Canterbury Tales quite soon after the Black Death, yet his stories are immensely positive, characterful and racy! The Prologue starts delightfully:

Whan that Aprille with his shoures soote, The droghte of March hath perced to the roote, And bathed every veyne in swich licóur Of which vertú engendred is the flour ...

I must apologise for the spelling, but Chaucer was writing in "Middle English". The verses refer, eventually, to pilgrimage to Canterbury, which was the main tourist attraction of the day, particularly the shrine of St Thomas a'Becket.

We have links to Thomas a'Becket in this area. The church at Tilshead is dedicated to him. There is an A'Becket chapel in All Saints, West Lavington. And, of course, our local vineyard is at A'Beckett's Littleton Panell. I am not sure how we connect but, apparently, Thomas did stay at Ivychurch Priory near Salisbury, which had a link with Tilshead.

Most interestingly, for me, is the fact that Chaucer's characters are so like people we can all recognise now. One difference is that, in those times, the world was getting cooler following the Medieval Warm Period of the previous century. And, of course, we are not fighting a Hundred Years War with France.

If you want to be an elected Parish Councillor the forms are available at <u>https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/media/5016</u>

The forms need to be printed off and completed by hand then delivered to Wiltshire Council between Monday 30th March and 4pm on Thursday 4th April..

You need to be born before May 6th 2003, a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen, and either

Registered as an elector in the Parish

Lived in the Parish or within 3 miles of it since before April 4th 2020

Or

The Parish has been your main or only place of work since April 4th 2020 You cannot stand for election if you:

• Are the subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order

• Have within five years before the day of the election, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a prison sentence for a

period of over three months without the option of a fine

• Work for the council you want to become a councillor for.

If there are more than 12 candidates in Market Lavington or 7 in Easterton there will be an election.

If not all those standing will be considered as elected councillors.

If there a shortage of candidates after the election, those elected will consider applications from people who would like to be co-opted onto the council.

HOW BIG IS YOUR CARBON FOOTPRINT?

A carbon footprint is defined as the amount of carbon dioxide released into the atmosphere as a result of the activities of an individual, organisation or community. Almost everything you do releases an amount of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. For example the food we eat accounts for 20-30% of our annual household carbon footprint. The emissions come from the processes involved in the production and transport of our food. (Ref: Climate Stewards https://www.climatestewards.org/reduce/). Reducing the amount of meat that you eat and where possible eating locally grown, unprocessed food will reduce your carbon footprint. Choosing a renewable electricity provider will significantly reduce your carbon footprint.

The Climate Change Act 2008 established a target for the UK to reduce it emissions by at least 80% from the 1990 level by 2050. In 2019, following the Paris Agreement, the target was changed to net-zero by 2050 ie 100% reduction in emissions. According to the Committee on Climate Change, in 2016 household emissions of CO2 accounted for 40% of all UK emissions. In 2016 the average UK household's emissions were 12.19 tonnes – this includes the impact of housing, heating, diet, transport and lifestyle.

If you would like to estimate your household's carbon footprint the WWF has a quick and fun way to calculate this which will show you how your emissions compare to the average person in the UK: https://footprint.wwf.org.uk/#/

Once you know how big your carbon footprint is, you can think about areas where you can reduce or eliminate aspects of your household's emissions. Those things which cannot be eliminated can be offset by compensating financially for your emissions. Carbon offsetting schemes invest in environmental projects around the world. The money you give to offset your CO2 emissions is used to support climate friendly initiatives in the developing world such as tree planting in Kenya and smokeless stoves in Nepal. Climate Stewards provide some really helpful suggestions about how you can reduce your carbon emissions and a simple route to offset the rest. https://www.climatestewards.org/offset/

Wiltshire Climate Summit

If you missed the Wiltshire Climate Summit on Friday, February 19th links below will allow you the chance to catch up!

The cross-party Summit was hosted by Danny Kruger MP.

Speakers in the morning session were Minette Batters (Wiltshire farmer and President of the NFU), Emma Dawnay (economist and Green Party candidate for Devizes in 2019), Joe Brindle (a student leading a national campaign to have climate science fully taught in schools), Lt. General Richard Nugee (Ministry of Defence lead on climate change), Richard Clewer (Deputy Leader of Wiltshire Council), Tim Wade (local farmer), Louisa Davidson (Climate Change Lobby), Juliet Davenport (founder of Good Energy), Graham Martin (Sustainable Devizes), Jemma Batten (an agrienvironmental consultant) and Evangeline Rowe (Wiltshire Climate Alliance Youth Group).

Some 400 local farmers, businesspeople, students, activists and other concerned residents attended the Summit to learn about the issues and to voice their views regarding what can be done, locally and nationally, to combat climate change. Polls were conducted for each speaker to gauge the views of the audience.

Andrew Griffiths MP, the UK's Net Zero Business Champion for COP 26, closed the morning session with a brief talk and Q&A.

Sarum Class



Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan

Will be the subject of a local referendum and every elector of the parish is entitled to vote on Thursday 6th May 2021.



The Plan covers the whole of Market Lavington Parish. Its policies aim to protect the existing character of the Parish and its surrounding landscape setting, and also to plan for necessary sustainable growth up to 2026.

The Plan's policies seek to:

- Define areas for new **housing development** of the appropriate size and type to benefit the local community, preserve the village and its facilities and meet local needs.
- Maintain and improve the local infrastructure including foot & cycle paths, car parking and community facilities
- Maintain local **retail services** in line with our designation as a local service centre
- · Protect our important local areas of green spaces

Adoption of the plan will facilitate a positive vision of how the community area is developed. The parish will also receive 25% of the planning levy charged on new developments in the Neighbourhood Plan area for spending on infrastructure and local facilities.

Savernake Class

This term in Savernake Class we have been focusing on Roald Dahl and we have enjoyed many of his stories; we used our 'magic Matilda powers' to make objects move around the classroom, we created our own potions inspired by George's Marvellous Medicine and became creative whilst making dream jars. In class we have been focusing on our well-being, making discussion around feelings achievable for all, and enabling an understanding of one another, in order to complete some excellent learning together. We have enjoyed exploring the book 'How to Train a Dragon' and we have spent time covering areas such as fractions, money and measure in Maths. The children have enjoyed exploring how to use money in the real-life setting of a shop within the classroom, where children were able to write shopping lists, work out the total cost of their items, and provide each other with change, as well as explore discounts using fractions.

Stonehenge Class

It has been a wonderfully busy and fun few weeks for the children in Stonehenge Class and we have all really enjoyed getting back together as a class. Our literacy learning this term has been focused on planning and writing explanation texts. The children have been able to learn a text about the demise of dragons, and understand and apply key Talk for Writing features to prepare them to write their own explanatory texts. In our Maths work this term, we have enjoyed consolidating our knowledge and understanding of rounding, multiplying, dividing and using our problem-solving skills within our White Rose Maths learning.

Our topic for this term has been the "Maya Civilisation", which the children have thoroughly enjoyed. So far, they have had the opportunity to learn about the Mayan way of life, the Mayan alphabet and the number system. They have designed and made Mayan artefacts like jade coloured jewellery and ceramics, based on research carried out, and have enjoyed exploring the geographical locations of the Mayan civilisation.
