

CORONAVIRUS (COVID) VACCINATION

As you are probably aware from recent press releases, a Corona Virus vaccine is on the horizon. This is going to be a huge operation to deliver to all of our patients and we will need your help in doing so.

At the moment all GP practices are preparing plans for delivering vaccination to their patients. We will work in pre-existing groups called Primary Care Networks, where several local GP Surgeries will plan together to provide vaccinations for the whole community from a central point. There will also be national larger sites as well, and you will be able to choose which one is more convenient for you.

It is likely that you will need 2 doses 3 weeks apart, **both doses have to be provided** at the same clinic location. Vaccination may or may not be available on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

All these plans have to be approved by NHS England before they can be used. Advice from NHS England and the Department of Health changes on an almost daily basis as plans are put forward, we are keeping up to date with the information received but please be aware guidance may change.

The vaccines have to be stored at very low temperatures before they are delivered to doctors. Once doctors receive them they will have to be used within five days. The government wants less than 5% of vaccines to be wasted, so it is likely that vaccine appointments will be offered at very short notice, and you may need to rearrange any

existing plans to be able to attend your vaccination appointments.

We are awaiting information on the vaccination schedule and the eligible patients will be contacted directly.

The best way you can help your practice deliver the vaccine is to ensure that they have the correct contact details for you, mobile phone, e-mail, and if you are housebound.





ECO-CORNER

Following the Lavingtons, Cheverells and Easterton Benefice's recent focus on creation care we have written a piece for our local news magazine with ideas about how we can all care for the environment in a better way and would like to share it with our neighbouring communities.

Christmas is a season of Christian celebration, good cheer and good will, but it has also become a season of increased commercialism, consumerism and waste with a negative environmental impact on the well - being of our planet.

Enviro Waste reveals some shocking Christmas waste statistics:

- Royal Mail delivers around 150 million cards and packets during the pre-Christmas period; it is estimated that 1 billion Christmas cards could end up in the bin after December 25th
- 125,000 tonnes of plastic packaging will be thrown out, rather than recycled
- six million trees are thrown out after Christmas, creating more than 9,000 tonnes of additional waste
- around 6,711 tonnes of fresh turkey and 12,472 tonnes of frozen turkey will be cooked almost 20,000 tonnes of meat while around 4,200 tonnes of aluminium foil used to cook the turkeys gets thrown away every Christmas in the UK Nevertheless, there are ways in which households concerned about the well-being of the planet can look to play their part (even if small) in support of an eco-friendly Christmas. Here are two ideas which you might like to consider.

1. Give gifts that are plastic free and will last

When considering gifts for family and friends, reduce waste by abandoning single use items that are immediately thrown away. Think of gifts that last or can be used again, e.g. good quality toys that can be passed on to friends, family and charity shops, giving them a second or even a third life. Try to avoid eco non-friendly products, such as plastic, and look for brands prepared with re-useable alternatives.

Alternatively you could buy a family gift which will benefit someone else. For example you could twin a toilet or a tap: for a donation of £60 you will fund a project in a poor community that will enable families to build a basic toilet, have access to clean water and learn about basic hygiene. 2. Be eco-aware with your wrapping paper

Choose recycled wrapping paper, brown paper, tissue or make your own using newspaper or magazines. Use the scrunch test to know if your paper can be recycled – i.e. when scrunched up and let go, if the paper stays scrunched up it can probably be recycled. If it does not stay scrunched up it probably contains nonrecyclable elements, like foil, glitter or plastic.

Recyclable wrapping paper can be quite hard to find but one source is the RSPB who are selling eco-recycled wrapping paper: https://shopping.rspb.org.uk/christmasgift-wrap/

According to Enviro Waste, over the Christmas period 83 sq km of wrapping paper will be thrown out or burnt in the UK. Instead of throwing away your wrapping paper, you can save it for future use or shred it to use as protective packaging for future gifts. Gift bags can usually be reused more than once with a new tag. Knot wraps - colourful fabric squares - can be re-used again and again.

Courier and Banking Fraud Warning After Spate of Incidents In East Wiltshire

We are reminding residents in east Wiltshire to be vigilant after a spate of banking and courier frauds recently.

In November officers were alerted to an incident where a woman in her 80s from Devizes had been targeted by fraudsters who were posing as bank employees. They convinced her to transfer a total of more than £50,000 to two different bank accounts. It follows a series of similar incidents in the Devizes and Marlborough areas recently.

In other crimes, fraudsters have posed as police officers and convinced their victims to withdraw thousands of pounds from their bank accounts and arrange for it to be collected by couriers.

PC Sue Ellway, from the Devizes Area Community Policing Team, said: "Sadly, these scams are very sophisticated and it is very easy for people to be duped by them. "Usually, the criminals pose as either police officers or bank employees and convince their victims that they are at risk of fraud, and that they need to follow their instructions to protect their money.

"We are urging people to be cautious, and to speak to elderly or vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours, so that everyone knows the simple steps they can take to keep themselves safe."

Our crime prevention advice includes:

- If you receive a call from anybody purporting to be from the police, bank, or any organisation you did not call, please take a telephone number and then put the phone down.
- Go and make a cup of tea or do something for five minutes (this stops any fraudster from keeping your phone line open) then call a trusted friend, relative or Wiltshire Police on 101 and tell them what has happened.
- Never transfer money or give the caller access to your banking details or cards. The bank or police would never ask you to do this



A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

"Christmas is coming", says the nursery rhyme, "The goose is getting fat!"

The goose, of course, is reference to the seasonal feast that, in more recent times, is associated with turkey. The implication is that this is a time of indulgence and consumption.

I hope you will get your share of feasting but, depending on your viewpoint, Christmas has many other meanings – faith, festival, family, etc. I fear, however, that the origins may also have reference to foresight of famine (I have worked hard on the alliteration here!).

In former times, starvation was common during the months of January to April, also known as "the famine months". The festival now associated with Christmas was the last feast before deep winter began. Most cattle were slaughtered so they would not have to be fed during the winter, and it was thus almost the only time of year when a plentiful supply of fresh meat was available. The wine and beer made during the year was finally fermented and was also ready for drinking at this time.

The festival follows the winter solstice when the days are short. However, you and I know that, whatever we may do, the days will lengthen and spring and summer will come so Christmas may be taken as reminder of better times ahead. As such, this is also a season of celebration and renewal.

But the nursery rhyme goes on to remind us of those in need.

Please to put a penny in the old man's hat.

If you haven't got a penny, a halfpenny will do.

If you haven't got a halfpenny, God bless you.


