
It is time to update the Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan and we need your thoughts and comments.


This will be a shared plan, created by the community, with legal weight to guide the development of our village. It helps us to nurture our environment, choose where we want new development, and have our say in its design.

Ebenezer Baptist Church Talking about Generation Z

The Times has published an in-depth survey of the attitudes and opinions of 'Generation Z'. That's people born between 1997 and 2013. From what I can work out, I'm 'Generation X'. But unlike the song by The Who, we're not talking about my generation. The survey produced some troubling results. Apparently, 48% of Gen Zers think that Britain is a racist society. Only 11% would fight for King and country.

There is a lack of trust in our institutions such as the police and NHS.

The reasons why only 41% of twentysomethings are proud to be British are discussed in the paper. Kemi Badenoch blames lefty teachers for promoting a negative view of our history and achievements. Columnist Hugo Rifkind identifies difficult economic circumstances as the key problem, "Give them better lives, today and in the future, and their pride will follow."

Interestingly, the younger generation seems to be more attuned to the spiritual side of life. According to The Times, "62 percent of 18 to 24-year-olds identified as either 'very' or 'fairly' spiritual." Only 13% professed to be atheists, opposed to 25% of Gen Xers, who were born between 1965 and 1980. The New Atheist movement associated with Richard Dawkins is evidently petering out. One of their key advocates, Ayaan Hirsi Ali recently renounced her unbelief and now calls herself a Christian.

It seems that the secular vision of a world in which we can find meaning and satisfaction without God is failing on its own terms. Covid-19 lockdowns stalled economic growth. Rising house prices mean it's hard for young people to get on the property ladder. Social media has messed with their heads, as avid users compare their humdrum lives with the glamorous world of TikTok influencers. As one Gen Zeder quoted in The Times reflects, "I think once they hit that place of, 'I have tried and I am still not good enough,' that's when people are turning to Christianity."

In his great work, Confessions, Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD) charts his journey towards God. As a young man he tried all that the world had to offer to satisfy the deepest longings of his soul, but to no avail. He later confessed, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." But how may our wayward hearts find rest in God? It's certainly not a matter of being good enough. God deals with us on the basis of grace. He sent his Son, the Lord Jesus to die on

the cross so that we may be forgiven by faith in him. Jesus now says to all generations of people, "Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."



"Your Church, your voice

Every six years, each church has to draw up a new electoral roll - a register of people who are able to elect other people in the parish and have a say in decisions about the local church. Being on the electoral roll allows people a voice in decisions about the Church in your community. It isn't only for people who worship there, but gives everyone who cares about their local church the opportunity to have a say in its future.

For example, you might be a member of a Friends group that supports and cares for the Church building, or part of a group looking after the churchyard, or maybe one of your family attends the church school. Signing up to the church's electoral roll is simply a sign you care about the Church's future in your community.

You can join the roll if you are resident in the parish, aged over 16, baptised, and consider yourself broadly part of the Church of England, or another church in communion with it.

Most electoral rolls are being drawn up in March and April before the annual church meeting.



A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

It has been almost four years since I was elected to serve as your local councillor. Now that all the nonsense about mayors and combined authorities has been put to bed (for now at least!), Wiltshire will go to the polls on Thursday 1st May. This will be your chance to have your say as to who you want to represent you for the next four years. I am even more passionate about fighting for The Lavingtons than I was in 2021 and so I have decided that I will stand for election again.

In the next few weeks we will enter the pre-election period where everyone, from the Council to news outlets, must ensure that communications are non-political. This then is the last opportunity for me to talk about some of the things we have achieved together as a community of residents with shared experiences, frustrations and objectives. In my role as Vice-Chairman of the Devizes Area Board, I have awarded grants of more than £50,000 for local community projects across The Lavingtons. This investment has supported West Lavington Youth Club, Worton & Cheverell Football Club, Broadwell Play Area, Market Lavington and West Lavington Halls, and youth outreach work across the area.

You will know from my periodic updates here and on social media that I have delivered on my 2021 election promise to you concerning Black Dog Crossroads. My persistence resulted in the closure of the dangerous spur road and the addition of extra warning signs. The big win, of course, is the installation of traffic lights, which will begin in the next few months. My work with Black Dog is not done though! Next in my sights is a reduction in the speed limit on the A360 to 40mph through the junction; I believe I can deliver this for you in the next two years.

I've worked hard with the parish councils and Community Speed Watch groups to challenge the Chief Constable to increase police presence across The Lavingtons to combat speeding in our villages and we have seen increased patrols as a result. Road safety is incredibly important to me and I continue to champion improvements, including Market Lavington, West Lavington and Great Cheverell High Streets, Kings Road in Easterton and Spin Hill and Parsonage Lane.

I want to keep supporting you for another four years, not only with road safety and community projects, but also in Planning. I have spoken at numerous Planning committees to win refusals for contentious developments that threatened our communities. I remain on-hand to assist our parish councils (and you as a resident) with any Planning related issues we face.

The villages that make up The Lavingtons are very special and we have achieved so much in the last four years. I have plans for further improvements, in particular the surface of the B3098 through Market Lavington and Easterton, the crossing on Lavington Lane, HGV traffic through Great Cheverell and the strengthening of our Neighbourhod Plans.

Rights of Way Working Group

We hope that some of you have noticed the work that is being carried out on footpaths and bridleways recently. We're making the most of these winter months by cutting back hedges and overgrown areas to the fence line where possible, having liaised with adjoining landowners. This has two benefits. We're very aware that some stretches are extremely muddy and so by widening the path it's now possible to walk on grass. We're considering options to address this problem. We're also working with the Parish Council's footpath contractor as clearer footpaths make it easier for him to maintain them.

Together, we have cleared the following:

MLAV2 from Canada Woods towards the "Dauntsey crossroads" with MLAV's 7 $\&\,8$

MLAV6 from Spin Hill/Ledge Hill down past Wick Farm to the Dauntsey drive. MLAV26 from White St towards West Lavington MLAV27 from White St up to The Ridgeway

Our Public Rights of Way network is a pleasurable way for people to enjoy the beautiful views and rich biodiversity of our village. The landscapes around Market Lavington are influenced by the underlying geology, soils and landforms which impact the flora and fauna, and the ecosystems they create. In Market Lavington we have rights of way that pass over grassland, through woodland and alongside globally significant chalk streams. The farmed landscape provides habitat and food for wildlife along the hedgerows, field margins and in the field corners, small copses and dew ponds. The hollow ways / sunken paths evolved by the cumulative effect of thousands of years of people and animals moving along them, contain unique and complex communities of plants, fungi, insects and other microorganisms. There's such a wealth of things to see along the way at all times of the year, both near and far. Jayne Taylor
