It's all about the infrastructure!

Over the past five weeks, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been gaining a better understanding of community concerns over infrastructure. Following the consultation event in the Community Hall on 1 March, we've enjoyed very positive meetings with the Footpath Group and the Youth Council. Thanks to these varied opportunities, we are starting to pull together a list of priorities for infrastructure.

The Youth Council meeting was particularly helpful and instructive. Young people are rightly concerned to create safe routes to school – including the well known pinch points at either end of the village, where the road narrows and so does the footway.

TAKING THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Litter was also a concern and while we could look to put in more bins, we as a community need to take responsibility for keeping Market Lavington clean. We live in a beautiful part of England so we should take care of it – just as the Footpaths Group have been doing across the Parish. Members of the Group are passionate about the challenge of bringing improved connectivity across the community, using rights of way that are well-maintained and helpfully signposted.

Of course, the big topic is housing. Whatever housing comes to Market Lavington we want to make the most of it. That means ensuring house-builders address key issues of public concern, such as more affordable housing for young people, strong connectivity, public open spaces, and environmental features to mitigate surface run-off flood risks.

Please keep sending your thoughts so we can ensure the new Neighbourhood Plan delivers the best future for Market Lavington!

"Your Church, your voice

Every six years, each church has to draw up a new electoral roll - a register of people who are able to elect other people in the parish and have a say in decisions about the local church. Being on the electoral roll allows people a voice in decisions about the Church in your community. It isn't only for people who worship there, but gives everyone who cares about their local church the opportunity to have a say in its future.

For example, you might be a member of a Friends group that supports and cares for the Church building, or part of a group looking after the churchyard, or maybe one of your family attends the church school. Signing up to the church's electoral roll is simply a sign you care about the Church's future in your community.

You can join the roll if you are resident in the parish, aged over 16, baptised, and consider yourself broadly part of the Church of England, or another church in communion with it. Forms can be collected from Churches and returned to the person whose details are shown or put in a box in the church for the purpose.

Although the **electoral roll** is the closest thing the Church of England has to 'membership', joining the electoral roll doesn't commit you to anything and does not cost you anything..

It does give you a voice in the future of the church in your community.

You don't need to attend services or meetings, but if you care about our Market Lavington community and what the church can offer it, it ensures your voice is heard.

Signing up to the church electoral roll is simply a sign you care about the Church's future in Market Lavington.

Notes

General matters

- The only Churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign Churches, as listed in the Supplementary Material to the Canons (but note <u>Rule 85(5)</u> of the Church Representation Rules, which provides for any question as to whether a particular Church is in communion with the Church of England to be decided by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York acting jointly).
- 2 Membership of the electoral roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church of England.
- 3 Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can reapply. If you are not resident in the parish but were on the roll as a habitual worshipper and have been prevented by illness or other sufficient cause from worshipping for the past six months, you should complete declaration 2B or 2C as follows
 - (a) delete the first set of words in square brackets and
 - (b) at the end of the second set of words in square brackets, briefly state the reason for not having worshipped as mentioned.



Love so amazing

The crucifixion of Jesus was the supreme manifestation of human malice and hatred. Those who plotted his demise knew he hadn't done anything to deserve being executed upon a cross. Jesus proclaimed a message of love and showed that love in action by healing the sick and feeding the hungry. The ordinary people flocked to hear Jesus' preaching. That was the problem. The Jewish religious establishment were afraid that if this Jesus movement took off, they would lose their position in society. Innocent though he was, Jesus had to go.

There was only room for one king in the Roman Empire. It was on that basis the religious leaders manipulated the governor of Judea, Pontus Pilate into having Jesus put to death. "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend." They cried, "Everyone who makes himself a king opposes Caesar." Sure enough, Pilate handed over Jesus to be crucified. It was customary to attach a charge sheet to the cross of a crucified man. Jesus' read, 'The King of the Jews'.

We could see this as one of countless miscarriages of justice that have happened over the course of history to this day. What makes the crucifixion of Jesus unique is that this condemned man was the Son of God. The miracles he performed were signposts to his divine power. Why did Christ not use the power by which he healed the sick and raised the dead to extricate himself from being crucified? Jesus described his God-given mission to his followers in these words: "Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Jesus died for our sins that we may be forgiven and be put right with God. Yes, the cross of Jesus was an act of vile hatred on the part of his enemies. But more profoundly, it was a stunning revelation of the love of God. Paul could reflect, "I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

Isaac Watts's hymn When I survey the wondrous cross is often sung in church services at Eastertime. The hymn concludes on a note of wonder at the love of Jesus for his people:

Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all.

Appointment of an incumbent (Rector)

After a Priest leaves a post in the Church of England there is always a gap before a new Priest is appointed which gives churches time to reflect and prepare for their new Priest.

One of the most important tasks at the beginning of the Vacancy is to write a Benefice Profile which is a description of who we and where we are, physically and spiritually and the kind of Priest we are looking for. The written part of the Profile was completed on 17th March and sent to the Bishop for approval.

The other task is to prepare the accommodation for the new priest. The Vicarage was vacated last week, so the Property Department will visit in w/c 24 March to survey the property and prepare a schedule of work required. The time scale for this work to be completed will determine when the post is advertised.

Our Benefice receives patronage (financial support) from Christ Church Oxford. The PCCs met the new Patron, Revd Canon, Peter Moger, on 12th March and we have been very encouraged by his support for us.

During the Vacancy all of the PCCs have been working hard to keep the churches running as close to normal as possible. We have been blessed with great support from Revd Caroline Spindlow who is leading 2 Benefice Holy Communions each month, rotating around the churches. On the other Sundays, each PCC has agreed it's individual pattern of services led mostly by Lay Worship Leaders. The feedback from PCCs is that generally things are working well.

New Army Chaplain

Bishop Stephen has taken on the role of Sponsoring Bishop for the Armed Forces. This involves assisting potential ordinands and Licensed Lay Ministers who are serving members of the Armed Forces through the selection process, and training. Recently, Bishop Stephen was requested to ordain a regular Army Chaplain, who had been a minister in the Church of Scotland, as a Deacon and Priest in the Church of England. The Reverend Jim Francis was ordained in Bishop Stephen's chapel in South Canonry as a deacon, and later, ordained a Priest during a service in the Cathedral. The request for ordination came from the Bishop of Connor, as Jim will serve in the Church of Ireland.

The link between Christ Church College Oxford and St. Mary's Church

Prior to the English Reformation under Henry V111 landowners would give land and the rights to income from harvests (tithes) to the local church in return for a forgiveness of sins so that they would avoid purgatory. This income paid for the costs of the priest, building maintenance, and support for poor people in the Parish.

Many churches were under the control of abbeys and monasteries which would supply the priest and have responsibility for the use of the income.

After the reformation and the founding of the Church of England the responsibility for and income from the churches could be bought and sold. Purchases made hundreds of years ago can leave modern day liabilities.

You may have heard of chancel repair liability which is the requirement for some homeowners to pay towards the cost of repairs to the chancel of a nearby church which can be expensive.

Even in the 1920s there were many cases where the choice of priest would be in the gift of a local landowner, whose ancestors had purchased the control of the church, its tithes and land.

Also someone could be the Rector or Vicar of many parishes and employ parsons to take services while they retained all the income.

The teaching staff of many Oxford and Cambridge Colleges had to be both qualified priests and unmarried. If one of them wanted to marry he could not just be sacked and left with no income. The colleges acquired the rights to appoint the vicar of a Parish and appointed the newly married priest to the living. This happened in many parishes across England. St. Mary's in Market Lavington was one of these churches and Christ Church still has responsibility for maintaining part of the church, used to repair the vicarage/rectory (which some older villagers may remember as a farmhouse), and provide some financial support to the vicar. Until the Ecclesiastical Parishes started to be merged the vicar at Market Lavington was appointed by Christ Church, then after joining with Easterton the appointment alternated between Christ Church and the Bishop of Salisbury. Now with 5 Parishes the appointment has to be agreed by the Bishop of Salisbury, Christ Church College and the King (Church Appointments Team in the Cabinet Office .



Best Kept Village Judging Information


The judges are coming between May 12th and June 8th. We will not be told the actual date of the visit.





Wiltshire Police

By the end of April 2025, The Devizes Borough Police Station by the Wharf Car Park will close with the local policing team and detective cohort relocating to Police Headquarters, on London Road Devizes, where there will be a fully functional front desk open to the public.



The Neighbourhood Policing Teams will be enhancing their visibility in our communities by increasing the use of our mobile police stations, attending more local events and will continue to proactively publicise where they will be and how people can engage with them.

Over 100 were vehicles stopped during an operation to disrupt and deter agricultural machinery theft in the South West.

The third iteration of Operation Ragwort, led by Wiltshire Police, took place on Monday 3 and Tuesday 4 March across two of Wiltshire's major road networks, the A303 and the A419. Over the two days, officers from Wiltshire Police were joined by over 60 police officers and staff from Avon & Somerset Police Devon & Cornwall Police Dorset Police Gloucestershire

Rights of Way Working Group

Over the winter, the Rights of Way working group have started work on the mammoth task of clearing paths and bridleways by cutting back overgrown hedges. Unless there's an obstruction, this work is now halted until 31st August as it's bird nesting season. However, work will continue through the spring and summer to clear low growing vegetation for example and improve the general condition.

You may have noticed small white signs going up with a green arrow and writing, eg MLAV13. These are markers to identify routes and the Rights of Way number which we hope helps you establish where you are. It's also helpful if you need to report a problem, ideally on the MyWilts app as it goes straight to the right team, or to the Parish Council Clerk at clerk@marketlavingtonparishcouncil.gov.uk

The working group have met with members of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group to discuss the importance of our public rights of way in providing safe passages to facilities within the village, eg schools, shops, doctors, both now and with future developments in mind, and connecting us with surrounding villages.
