# Residents help shape village development

# Further consultation due on proposed Neighbourhood Plan



Villagers have been having their say on everything from the building of new homes to the need for road safety improvements as consultation takes place in preparation for a new Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan.

The current neighbourhood plan runs out next year, so Market Lavington Parish Council has asked a steering group of volunteers to draw up a proposed new Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan 2.

More than 150 people filled in the First Community Survey for the new plan and their views will help shape the proposed

new plan, along with those of residents who attended an exhibition at the Community Hall in March and various drop-in events.

Wiltshire Council are expecting more than 70 new homes to be built in Market Lavington – a figure which may be increased due to new Government policy to boost housebuilding. Having an up-to-date Neighbourhood Plan will help ensure the parish can influence where they are built and the type of properties.

A firm of independent specialists are currently assessing several potential housing sites, put forward following a 'call for sites' at the end of last year. Once their final report is available, the steering group will prepare a list of recommended housing sites, and these will go to public consultation, so residents can give their views.

The steering group will then draw up its draft Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan 2, which will be subject to a statutory six-week public consultation, and after any resulting amendments, it will be submitted to Wiltshire Council.

Wiltshire Council will publicise the draft plan and arrange for it to be independently examined. If it successfully completes the examination, Wiltshire Council will arrange a neighbourhood plan referendum. If there is a majority yes vote, the plan will be adopted and become part of the statutory development plan for the area.

On Time

Relax if you are given to tardiness. This isn't a piece on the importance of punctuality. Rather, I want to reflect on our relationship to time itself.

Although it has to be said that time isn't an easy thing to define. Early Christian thinker Augustine of Hippo puzzled over the question 'What is time?' saying, 'If no one asks me, I know what it is. If I wish to explain it to him who asks me, I do not know.' All he could say is that some events lie behind us in the past and some lie ahead of us in the future. If nothing at all existed there would be no present.

Augustine proposed that God did not make the universe in time, but with time. God is eternal, existing outside of time. He didn't wait around for ages before creating the world. The clock only started ticking as it were at the beginning of creation. Modern cosmology tends to agree on that point. Anyway, the thing is that we exist in time. Our lives are constantly moving from the past, through the present and into the future.

The trouble is that these days people only seem interested in the present. The past isn't worth thinking about. People did bad stuff back then. Slavery and that. The future will have to look after itself. In 2010 Deputy Prime Minister Nick Clegg dismissed the idea of building more nuclear power stations as they wouldn't be good to go for another ten years. I mean, who cares what happens in the 2020s? Maybe it's apt that after a career in politics Clegg went to work for Facebook/Meta.

Social media tends to make us focus on the present moment, rather than the past or the future. What's going on now captivates out attention, no matter how trivial. This is an age of momentary celebrity and throwaway fashion. Why bother with the time-consuming process of saving for major purchases? Much easier to take out instant credit to buy on a whim something that flashed before our eyes in an online ad.

There's no escaping time, however. We are all products of our past experiences. What we decide in the present will impact on how we fare in the future. But our history need not be our destiny. God entered our world of time and space in his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. He came to die on the cross that our past sins and failings may be forgiven. He rose from the dead that those who believe in him may have the hope of everlasting life. God gives us time to seek him while he may be found and call upon him while he is near.

# EVENING WALK: Milk Hill and Wansdyke Exploring Wiltshire's folklore

Join David (our Director) and Claire (folklorist and our Project Engagement Officer) to explore the archaeology and folklore of the North Wessex Downs. Hear stories of ghostly horses, solstice ceremonies and running around barrows to wake giants while discovering barrows, a causewayed camp and Saxon defences.

This evening walk takes us up into the Pewsey Downs, over Adam's Grave, before passing over the Alton Barnes White Horse. We will then follow the Wansdyke, before heading back down to the car park.

**Thursday 5 June at 6.30pm** at the small car park on the minor road between Lockeridge and Alton Barnes at grid ref. SU116638Hill. See note below re car sharing.

# A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

Well, what a month it has been! I was honoured to be re-elected as Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons at the beginning of the month and I look forward to continuing my work to support our communities. I have literally just come out of the first Full Council meeting since the elections in May. As you will have heard, the Liberal Democrats became the largest party in Wiltshire with the Conservatives a few seats behind them, followed by Reform, the Independents and Labour picking up the remaining seats. Today was the point at which all elected members came together to elect a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Leader of the Council (who then goes on to appoint their cabinet).

After a tied vote (via secret ballot) for Chairman, 48 voted for the Conservative nominee and the same number for the Liberal Democrats' nominee, the casting vote saw Laura Mayes (Conservative) appointed as Chairman of Wiltshire Council. There then followed another secret ballot where Ruth Hopkinson (Liberal Democrat) was appointed as Vice-Chairman of the council. Then came the all-important vote for the Leader of the Council which saw Ian Thorn (Liberal Democrats) voted in, beating Richard Clewer (Conservatives) by a wafer thin margin of just five votes.

The latter part of the meeting was fairly anti-climactic since Cllr Thorn had already publicly announced his Cabinet two weeks ago, which included an Independent councillor (Jon Hubbard) who gave his vote to the Liberal Democrats in exchange for a paid Cabinet position (so much for independence!).

Having had a chat with many returning and new councillors of all parties after the meeting, I am very pleased to see an administration formed so that the hard work of running the council can continue. I wish the new Leader and his Cabinet every success in their respective roles.

It has been an absolute pleasure to serve my community as your local Wiltshire Councillor since May 2021 and I look forward to working with many of you over the coming four years!

We are encouraged not to mow our lawns in May to allow the wild flowers to grow and bloom. This was especially relevant this year with the Met Office informing that this is the driest spring on record. Some gardens have seen cowslips flowering early, so we are advised not to have the mower blades set too low so as to allow the wild flowers to set their seed. There are many insect hatches at this time of the season, including unwelcome greenfly and blackfly, Please don't use chemical sprays, we use washing up liquid + water in a spray bottle, which does the job, although it has to be done probably the next day, etc. Better still is to let the birds, especially the tits and some finches, major on them to feed their young. Washing up liquid won't harm them. An enthralling sight in our garden was the discovery of a web full of a dense ball of tiny spiderlings all clustered together. They dispersed on their own gossamer lines when discovered, but soon reclustered again. These minute babies transpired to be baby garden spiders, being yellow with black on their rear ends. Remember to keep feeders and bird baths scrupulously clean, as some of the less well trained birds have dirty habits, and foul the water. Such contamination can infect other birds with diseases, viz bird flu. It's difficult to say at the moment how the nesting season is going, as there are many predators and scavengers about. It's doubtful that some species will even be able to keep their population numbers up. Certainly hirondine numbers are down, we have only seen two swifts and three swallows so far, with no house martins, heard no cuckoos, seen no flycatchers doing their aerial displays, no nightingales and fewer warblers singing, apart from chiff chaffs. Species numbers of garden birds are generally low, although robins appear to be doing reasonably well. Think what it will be like for birds and animal species in the many war zones around the world. A recent piece of interesting raptor news is from the peregrine falcon nest on Taunton Minster, where a last year's fledgling, now an adult, has come back to help feed the nestlings in this year's nest. It remains to be seen whether the parents will welcome this help, or maybe chase him away as an intruder, one who is possibly looking to take over the territory. Has any reader heard of this unusual behaviour anywhere else? One can watch live feed from the web cam on the peregrine nest on Salisbury Cathedral to see how the chicks are fed and as they grow, we saw four. We didn't have any hedgehogs using our hibernaculums, and have only seen one hedgehog so far this year – has this been the experience of readers generally?

#### Who has priority when passing parked cars?

Sometimes there's enough room for two-way traffic to navigate past a parked car—but often there isn't. In these cases, there are two rules for working out who has right of way when passing parked vehicles.

The first is communicated in Rule 163 of the Highway Code:

give way to oncoming vehicles before passing parked vehicles

#### In practical terms, that means:

If the parked cars are on your side of the road, then you should give way to oncoming traffic.

If the parked cars are on the opposite side of the road, you have priority **However, this rule is qualified by another rule: commitment.** 

If you've already started your overtake, oncoming traffic should give way to you. Likewise, if an oncoming driver has committed to an overtake, you should give way to them. In either instance, which side of the road the vehicles are parked on doesn't matter.

You're committed if you:

Have started the overtaking manoeuvre.

Are too close to the parked car to move back in behind it and then back out again safely.

Would have to reverse in order to let the oncoming driver through Of course, if you're both committed, one of you will have to reverse. That should be the driver who will be least inconvenienced. Usually that'll be the person who has the shortest distance to reverse, but you should also take into account whether either one of you has traffic behind you. One car moving backwards is less inconvenient than a line of drivers having to reverse.
