

Reflection for August 22

I wonder if you remember when everyone smoked. When smoking was almost seen as a rite of passage, a sign of adulthood. And the odd one out was the nonsmoker. I remember going to the pictures with my parents to see "The Sound of Music" only to cough through the second half of the film and not be able to see clearly through the smoke filled cinema. When we left, my eyes were stinging and my clothes smelt of smoke. I have never smoked, I didn't want too. I remember the peer pressure to join in with everyone else. 45 years later, it's the smokers that are seen as polluters and the health problems of passive smoking are uncovered.

Why am I thinking of the health problems of secondary smoking? It took us a long time to realise the dangers to family members and the general public of smoking. We don't, I pray, have to wait 45 years to see the dangers of our behaviour and the damage we have done to our planet. Global warming is here. We are now facing summer temperatures of 35 to 40 degrees and a more regular summer problem.

Why problem? The very old and the very young struggle to regulate the body temperature. Are we going to wait for high death rates before we act? In high temperatures, the ground gets dry and foliage becomes fire fodder. We have seen the fires on the news, not only here in this country but also in France and Germany. And then there is sunstroke and sunburn to think about and what about our water. In the seventies we ran dry; water was accessed via stand pips in the streets in many of our towns and cities. Is this the future of our summers? If it is going to take all of us changing the way we live, then isn't it time to start that change. What can and will you change to make a difference?

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

In the middle of July, during the hottest week on record, people from all over the area (and beyond) enjoyed the spectacular Market Lavington Vintage Meet. Emily and I took the kids along on the Sunday and were blown away by the variety of things on show. It took me a good forty minutes to survey the selection of beautiful old cars (much to the annoyance of my daughter!) but she got her turn with the birds of prey where we learnt a lot from the very knowledgeable experts in the tent. The gun dogs obviously put our Lab to shame, the fairground rides and steam engines were a big hit, and I am still rationing my way through the most delicious treacle tart I've ever bought! I must mention the fly-past of the military aircraft, the Lancaster being the one we watched from the Plain later in the afternoon which gave me goosebumps as it banked overhead. A massive well done to everyone involved in the planning of such a fantastic event – next year's is already in the diary!

As I write this, I am thankful to be sat in a slightly cooler room, yesterday's temperatures were record breaking and worrying in terms of the seeming rapidity of climate change. We are quite used to seeing fires in Portugal and Spain but to have areas of England ignite is far less common. Some of that will come down to stupid actions in such dry conditions, disposable BBQs on dry grass for example, so we do need to stop and think a bit more when the mercury rises.

...which leads me on neatly to the Plain! I have always known the Plain to catch fire at times, most years in fact. It is part and parcel of living close to such a huge expanse of grassland in the summer. That said, there are things that the MOD really need to consider more carefully. Correct land management and coordinated grazing to help cut down on grass height would help, so I am told. The obvious one is not to carry out exercises during particularly hot and dry spells. There is also the recurring issue of not being able to put out a fire when it takes hold because of unexploded bombs. Perhaps more thought needs to be given to prevention if it is known that a cure is unavailable.

And finally, whilst we are on the subject of things going up in flames, I will, for the first time (I think), mention Government which I always try to avoid. Most of you will know that I am a Conservative but if you know me personally you will have seen me shaking my head, often with my hands over my face, at the way some members of the party conduct themselves. I work incredibly hard for my community and I do it with a belief in Conservative values. It is clear to me that most of the previous Cabinet (before it fled the sinking ship at the last possible moment in such a self-serving way) should not have the right to call themselves a Conservative. Not all politicians are bad, most are dedicated to improving life for their constituents. We simply can't have a Prime Minister who lies and cheats his way through life, those are not the traits of a good leader, either domestically or on the World's stage. So, Boris is gone... (sort of) and whilst I really liked Tom Tugendhat for his honesty, voting record and "clean slate" approach, he is no longer in the running. Your guess for the next PM is as good as mine but I am confident in saying the only way from here is up.

Ebenezer Baptist Church A tough question

With Boris Johnson announcing that he is standing down as Prime Minister various candidates have been vying for his job. By the time you read this the list will have been whittled down to the final two. It will then be up to Conservative party members to decide which one of them will be the next occupant of 10 Downing Street. You would expect journalists to quiz the candidates on what they would do about the cost of living crisis if they gained power, would they cut taxes and so on. But these days it seems than no interview is complete without politicians being asked: 'What is a woman?'

The dictionary definition is 'adult human female'. No surprises there. But giving that answer could get a politician into hot water with those who believe that anyone who says they are a woman is a woman. Even if their anatomy suggests otherwise. Everyday words are changed to accommodate this. In guidelines produced by one NHS trust 'mothers' are renamed 'birthing parents', 'fathers' as 'second biological parent'. There is great concern over the number of children being referred to the Gender Identity Development Service because they believe they were born in the wrong body. Debates over the 'trans' issue have become a highly contested aspect of today's 'culture wars'.

Of course, people suffering from gender dysphoria should be treated with respect and given all the help they need. But there is no escaping biological reality. Each cell in our bodies either has two X chromosomes (female) or one X and one Y chromosome (male). That cannot be changed. It is the way God made us, "So God created mankind in his own image, male and female he created them." The Bible honours the created differences between men and women, but also insists that male and female are of equal value and worth before God.

Jesus counted women as well as men among his early followers. According to the gospel accounts it was women who first discovered that Jesus' tomb was empty and saw him risen from the dead. At the time of the early church society was deeply divided between ethnic groups, salves and masters, men and women. Yet the Christian message was one that brought people together. It teaches us that we are all sinners, but through Jesus we can be forgiven and be put right with God. To believe in him is to belong to his people, where there is "neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Despite the severe weather warnings, large numbers of people came to the Vintage Meet 2022. There was lots to see and do, and many exhibitors who were happy to talk about their vehicles, or crafts.

The highlight for many was the visit by the Lancaster Bomber on Sunday.

Thanks are due to the committee members who worked all year to organise the event, and the volunteers who started setting things up on Saturday 9th, and finally finished taking things down and packing them away on Tuesday 19th.

Thanks are also due to the following businesses for supporting the event. G.K. White Property Services, Mr Brian Watling, Mr & Mrs L Fricker, Mr Paul Bowyer, Mr O Sharpe, Atwell-Wilson Motor Museum, Rangebourne Pet Care, Checkpoint Tyres Devizes, The Green Dragon Market Lavington, Wadworth Brewery, Superior Plants, TH White Group, Sewfantastic, Courtyard Surgery, Homestead Stables Holiday Lets Wiltshire, Devizes Motor Panels, Aussie Dave's Carpentry, Easterton Vehicles Ltd Barefoot Signs, JJB Images, St Barnabas C of E Primary School.

Over £11,000 was taken at the gate, £3,000 from catering, and smaller amounts from crafters, sponsors and stall holders. Total income was around £17,000. An event like this also has expenses, mainly linked to ensuring that everyone who attends is safe. There are still some bills to come in, i.e. credit card fees, but expenses so far are about £11,000, roughly equal to the money taken on the gate. This means that there will be about £6.000 to be divided between Wiltshire Air Ambulance and The Chairman's Fund which provides grants to local organisations.

More details about grant applications will go onto the event website during August. The last time grants were made available these were limited to £500, but no decisions have been made yet. Decisions are made by a group of independent residents and Parish Councillors, and voted on at a Parish Council meeting in the Autumn.

The Edington Music Festival A Festival of Music within the Liturgy

THE EDINGTON FESTIVAL IS BACK!

After two decidedly different and unusual festivals due to Covid and Covid restrictions, the Edington Music Festival returns on Sunday August 21st for its official 65th outing.

The festival will run for its usual eight days – Sunday 21st to Sunday 28th August, with four services a day, three choirs of top-flight singers under three of the country's leading choral directors, all under the direction of a new Festival Director, Robert Quinney, Director of the Choir at New College Oxford (and former Festival Organist and Director of the Nave Choir.)

Robert has themed the music for this special festival under the heading "Creation and Recreation", a nod both to its re-emergence and to its capacity for promoting relaxation and fulfilment.

The week will follow the traditional form starting each day with Matins (plainchant), followed by Eucharist, then Evensong and ending with Compline by candlelight, also plainchant. Wednesday 24th will be both the return of the BBC recording, (to be broadcast at a later date), and the Festival Supper in the evening; the Friday evening service will be a Requiem Mass (by Michael Haydn, younger brother of Joseph), and the week will also include Vaughan Williams' 'Mass in G Minor', Copland's 'In the beginning', and Dove's 'Seek him that maketh the Seven Stars'.

Leaflets containing the whole programme and other information are being distributed, with updates on the website, **www.edingtonfestival.org**, as and when available.



Reversing the Nature Crisis

Sir James Bevan, Chief Executive of the Environment Agency, began his speech on 12 July by quoting from the opening lines of Rachel Carson's Silent Spring, the 1962 book that sparked the modern environmental movement.

"There was once a town in the heart of America where all life seemed to live in harmony with its surroundings. Then a strange blight crept over the area. Everywhere was a shadow of death. It was a spring without voices. On the mornings that had once throbbed with the dawn chorus of robins, doves, jays, wrens, and scores of other bird voices there was now no sound; only silence lay over the fields and woods and marsh. No witchcraft, no enemy action had silenced the rebirth of new life in this stricken world. The people had done it themselves."

Sir James went on: "Sixty years on we are closer than ever to that silent spring happening....

"Since 1970, 41% of our species have decreased in abundance and 15% of all our native species in the island of Britain are now threatened with extinction. "The position is even worse for the mammals, birds, butterflies and moths designated as priority species – those about which we have the greatest concern. They have declined in abundance overall by 61% since 1970. Since that date butterflies and moths have decreased in average abundance by 16% and 25% respectively."

Members of the public are currently being encouraged to join **The Big Butterfly Count**, a UK-wide survey aimed at helping to access the health of our environment simply by counting the amount and type of butterflies (and some day-flying moths) we see. The Count is intended as well as an early warning system helping scientists understand how environmental changes are affecting insects.

First, you can download the handy butterfly ID chart or free app for iOS and Android to identify and record the butterflies you see. Then between 15 July and 7 August you just need to choose a place to spot butterflies and moths. Watch for 15 minutes. Then record which species you observe and look at the interactive map provided to find how your data is contributing to conservation science and research.


