Your kingdom come ...

The season of Advent began on Sunday the 27 November. Like Lent, it is a penitential season when the liturgical colour is purple and a time of preparation to celebrate the feast of the Incarnation without which there would be no feast of the Resurrection. Advent is not as long as Lent and it seems to be more about feasting than fasting! In a way it's 'Lent-lite' but for many of us one of our favourite seasons of the year as we watch and wait in anticipation of the joy and excitement of the celebration of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem and also contemplate the realisation of God's eternal Kingdom at the end of time. It is becoming something of a cliché to list the crises that presently beset us: climate, war, recession, refugees etc in a world already feeling unsettlingly different post-Covid. At times we can begin to feel overwhelmed and turn in on ourselves rather than remaining outward facing as is the Christian's orientation. God in Christ became a human being not to be served but to serve. Christ the King is with us still – here and now. His kingship is not based on human power but on serving and loving others. We are called to exhibit those Kingdom values in their lives until at last our prayer will be answered and God's Kingdom will 'come on earth as it is in heaven.'

As part of our on-going discernment of a new vision and strategy for the diocese, the Dean, the Very Revd Nicholas Papadopulos, has kindly written some prayers for us all to use as a Diocese this Advent in our personal prayer time and when we meet together in church or on other occasions [see

www.salisbury.anglican.org/Advent]. They are beautiful and I commend them to you most warmly. They recognise the situation in which we find ourselves but remind us that we are never alone and that our calling is to join in where God is

already at work in his world. May the God of peace make you completely holy, ready for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Bishop of Salisbury Rt Revd Stephen Lake. An Advent Prayer for the Diocese: Faithful God, your world is full of fear. Hunger, cold, and loneliness are all around. Your children are hurting. Into our darkness comes the child of Bethlehem -Jesus, the light who cannot be overcome. He is with us always. He speaks words of hope and words of truth. May his Spirit fill our hearts this Advent and awaken us to your purposes: making us generous in giving, active in serving, and alert to your reign of justice, mercy, and peace, which he calls us to bring to birth - here, and now. Amen.

'Glory to the New-born King!'

So says the chorus of a favourite carol, Hark! the Herald Angels Sing. But why should glory be ascribed to the new-born Jesus? After all, he would have looked much like every other baby. Cute, yes, but worthy of the angels' praise? I know artists often portray the infant in the manger as if he glowed in the dark with heavenly splendour, but that has no basis in fact. If anything, the Bible stresses how ordinary looking was Jesus. He 'took the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men' wrote the apostle Paul. As with any other baby, Jesus was weak and totally helpless, 'tears and smiles like us he knew'.

Yet Christians believe that he who as an infant was cradled in his mother Mary's arms, was also the eternal Word of God who upheld the universe by his divine power. He is fully God, the Father's only Son as well as fully human. That is why angels worshipped the new-born King. They recognised him as their Maker made flesh. Another reason for worship is what Jesus was sent into the world to do. AutoSpeedWatch Device – Notice of installation on Spin Hill

There is still an ongoing problem with speeding on Spin Hill, despite the presence of the Speed Indicator Device (SID) reminding drivers of the speed they are travelling. The SID regularly records vehicles travelling above 60mph, well in excess of the 30mph speed limit.

The Parish Council takes the issue of speeding, and the subsequent safety risk for pedestrians and other road users very seriously, and as such, has purchased an AutoSpeedWatch device (ASW) to support the effectiveness of the Speed Indicator Device.

The ASW device will become fully operational at the end of November and will take still image photographs of the rear of speeding vehicles, identifying Vehicle Registration Numbers. Details of speeding vehicles, and evidence may then be reported to the Police by the Parish Council.

Traffic Enforcement Officers attending this location, Spin Hill, on 28th October and caught 4 vehicles speeding. Top speed recorded was 42MPH and all being processed for usual enforcement action. FLY TIPPING

Can we please remind residents that although garden waste is biodegradable, it is classed as waste, and it is still an offence to illegally fly tip it onto amenity land, or into woodland areas etc.

Whilst it might seem that putting green waste into these environments is innocuous and not harmful, it will have the effect of disturbing the fragile balance of the flora and fauna systems in the area where it is dumped.

There are a variety of ways to dispose of garden waste legally:

- You can take it to any Wiltshire Council recycling Centres
- Wiltshire Council offers a garden waste collection service, for a modest annual fee
- You can compost your garden waste on your own land. Home composting provides an excellent opportunity to use your garden waste in a resourceful manner and put nutrients back into your garden

We recognise that most people are disposing of their garden waste properly and legally, and therefore thank you in advance for your consideration and cooperation.

MARKET PLACE CARPARK TEMPORARY CLOSURE WEEK COMMENCING 5TH OF DECEMBER 2022

The Parish Council have arranged for the resurfacing of the carpark in the Market Place during the week commencing 5th of December 2022.

For safety reasons, and parking requirement for the contractor's vehicles, there will unfortunately be no parking available in the carpark whilst the resurfacing work is being carried out.

All vehicles will please need to be removed from the carpark by 7.30am on Tuesday the 6th of December at the very latest, to ensure that the work can commence on schedule.

The Parish Council recognises that many homes do not have off-street parking, and rely on the Market Place carpark for overnight parking, and that finding an alternative parking location may be challenging. Whilst some distance away, the Parish Council is able to offer the Elisha Field carpark, off Drove Lane as an alternative place for parking vehicles whilst the work is being carried out.

The contractor will make every effort to carry out the work as quickly as possible, and weather permitting, it is hoped that the carpark will be able to have a staggered re-opening on Friday the 9th of December.

We very much apologise for any inconvenience that this resurfacing work may cause, but hope you will appreciate, and benefit from the improved surface when the work is finished.

Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson's Column

Policing has been under the microscope in the last year and I don't see this scrutiny letting up any time soon – and neither should it. The public want their police force to keep them safe, protect vulnerable people, put victims first, catch the criminals responsible, produce quality investigations and lock the bad ones up. Wiltshire Police has had its fair share of criticism. It has received a poor PEEL inspection report and is currently in 'special measures'. I can reassure you progress is being made and my scrutiny of that performance is ongoing.

We have had some solid successes too. You told me road safety and speeding was a key concern. I have committed investment into the roads policing unit, increasing the number of officers and cars by 20%. We also tripled the capacity of the speed enforcement team, with extra police staff and state-of-the-art cameras. With this joined up approach, there are more traffic officers on our streets and there has been an increase of 42% of the number of people caught speeding and given tickets. There is still more to do but our roads will become safer as the deterrent of speeding tickets and prosecution starts to bite.

The rural crime team has also doubled since I committed investment in the team and in extra equipment. I was also pleased with the force's commitment to visit all victims of home burglary – let me know if this doesn't happen and I will act on your behalf to scrutinise that commitment.

We are also in the process of recruiting the next Chief Constable of Wiltshire Police and I hope to have them confirmed in post by mid January. We look forward to welcoming them to the county.

In the meantime, our current Chief will carry on implementing the improvements needed to satisfy HM Inspectors and provide stability so the force can continue making Wiltshire safer for all.

Please also make sure you take part in my survey, taking place in December and January, which will ask you about your confidence levels in Wiltshire Police and about the policing precept for 2023/24.

It is important we capture as many people's thoughts as possible and you will find this on my website from mid December.

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

I'm always incredibly busy fighting for the needs of our villages and residents. Often it involves a huge amount of cage-rattling and negotiating with many groups including Wiltshire Council officers, Cabinet, Wiltshire Police and our MPs. This month has been positive on several fronts.

Our Police & Crime Commissioner responded to my pleas for speed enforcement in Market Lavington by ensuring patrols came out to hold numerous speed check sessions recently. Speeds of up to 92mph in a 30mph zone were recorded by one Speed Indicator Device this year and, thanks to multiple police visits, this number has fallen dramatically. Wiltshire Police will continue to make regular appearances around the villages over the coming year. I have also been lobbying hard throughout Wiltshire Police and Wiltshire Council for the adoption of ANPR cameras to equip parish and town councils with the means to independently deal with speeding. I am not a fan of speed cameras in open countryside, however, I am far less impressed by people hitting 90mph in a village during school pick-up time. It looks as though, after a lot of hard work, I have won the battle and Wiltshire Council will allow cameras to be fixed to existing posts to catch evidence of the most idiotic driving. The photos and calibrated speeds will be uploaded as evidence to Wiltshire Police for enforcement and parish councils also have the option of publishing photos of vehicles and speeds on social media.

Last week I met with parish councillors and our senior Highways engineer to look at possible improvements across the villages. Lots of good ideas were shared for making our roads safer. It was also useful to discuss what is not possible whilst being stood at various sites watching traffic movements. I will continue to support our parish councils in bringing requests forwards for Highways improvement funding.

To support Development, we have a "Core Strategy" document in Wiltshire by which we judge all planning applications to ensure building projects are in keeping with their environment, have infrastructure support, don't overload roads or schools etc. Some of our villages also have a Neighbourhood Plan or a Conservation Area Statement to further build "local" perspective into Planning decisions. Sadly, a lot of our local priorities are thrown out because of a Government target known as the "5-Year Housing Land Supply". Essentially, if we aren't hitting this target in Wiltshire, our sensible and reasoned rejection of poor applications can be (and have been) overruled at appeal. Some large developers know this and sit on projects to restrict supply and keep us under the 5-year target. Manipulation of the housing supply means we end up with developments we don't want. Together with Cllr Philip Whitehead, I wrote a letter which is going out to all parish and town councils in Wiltshire for them to amend and send to their local MP. Danny Kruger has been briefed and will be handing letters over to Michael Gove asking for the 5 Year Housing Land Supply target to be scrapped. I aim to get this letter across to neighbouring authorities so that every parish in the country joins my campaign. I am optimistic that we can influence the Government to change this flawed system and protect our local decision making on how and where we build houses.
