

God meant it for Good

Happy New Year? 'Some chance of that', you might reply. The war in Ukraine doesn't seem like it's going to end any time soon. Inflation continues to eat into people's incomes. Unions are planning more disruptive strikes for early 2023. And then there's a host of as yet unknown challenges that will no doubt come our way in the year ahead. Given that is the case, how can we look forward to the next twelve months with confidence and hope? I know someone who may be of help to us on that front, the Bible character Joseph. You remember, the one with the coat of many colours. Joseph dreamed that one day he would be a great man. His own brothers would bow down to him. But after that everything seemed to go wrong. His brothers sold him as a slave and he was taken off to Egypt. Initially he did well for himself as a senior household servant. Then Joseph was falsely charged with assaulting the boss's wife and ended up in prison.

Joseph didn't realise this at the time, but this series of unfortunate events was all part of God's plan for him. He had to be in Egypt to forewarn Pharaoh that seven years of famine would follow seven years of plenty. He was given the task of making preparations for the years of scarcity. Eventually his own family came to john him in Egypt where he could make sure they were well provided for.

Joseph's brothers were concerned that when their father died it would be payback time, but he readily forgave them for treating him so badly. He explained, "As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today." (Genesis 50:20). God specialises in bringing good out of evil. The crucifixion of Jesus was the most wicked act. Yet it was by his death upon the cross that Jesus rescues us from sin and reconciles us to God when we put our faith in him.

Yes, bad stuff happens, but as Joseph came to see, God is able to bring good out of it. There is a great verse in Paul's letter to the Romans that has brought hope and encouragement to many believers faced with challenging and uncertain times, "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28).

Nurture Nature December 2022/January 2023

Many of you will have followed the daily postings from COP 27 (Conference of the Parties) which met in Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt 6-18 November. Hopefully the majority of readers of this column will have made some resolution of their intention to do their bit for nurturing nature, the environment and to endeavour one way or another to meet the minus 1.5 degrees C in temperature reduction by 2030. Should you not have done so you can make this your New Year Resolution! This article was written in mid November and all of us have probably contributed towards saving the Planet by not having the heating on as regularly due to the above normal seasonal temperatures, thus saving energy and the resulting pollutants. However, the higher than normal seasonal daily temperatures (in excess of 12 degrees C - Armistice Day was the warmest on record) in many parts of the British Isles have had a knock on effect for Nature affecting birds, mammals and plants. Some plants are flowering out of season, which is confusing the circadian rhythms of birds, mammals and insects. Some birds are even starting to build nests, bees are buzzing in unexpected blossoms, bats should be dormant but are taking the odd nocturnal flight, hedgehogs should be hibernating but are making nocturnal foraging sorties. The unseasonal weather is also influencing the behaviour of winter migrants, and fewer have been seen so far this year. This should change as the weather gets colder. However, birds, and especially seabirds, have been greatly affected by avian flu and coastal colonies have been badly depleted. So, please keep feeders and birdbaths clean (wash in warm water with a little washing up liquid). This is also the time of year when rats arrive seeking their winter quarters, so it is wise to take feeders down before dusk, and empty bird baths – rats are highly intelligent and are good climbers.

'The Holly and the Ivy when they are both full grown....' yes, Christmas is nigh, but please leave as much berry bearing holly and ivy as both provide valuable pop-up cafes with sustenance for birds and, in the case of ivy, insects too as the weather cools down. The seasonal flowers to plant for December and January include snowdrops, you might add the longer stemmed variety Galanthus Magnet, and the Christmas Rose (Hellebore), also Sarcococca – the Christmas box - and a selection of brightly coloured croci. Lastly, at the end of a momentous year which saw the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee, what about planting a native tree for the Queen's Green Canopy.

which answers many of the questions that have recently been posed on social media: Colin Osborn. Chair, Market Lavington Parish Council

With reference to "The Clays" in Market Lavington, officially recorded as "MLAV24" in the definitive map and statement as a "bridleway".

The public are entitled to the use and enjoyment of MLAV24 ("The Clays"). Wiltshire Council has a duty under the Highways Act 1980 (Section 130) to ensure usage is legal and may take enforcement action where it is not. Wiltshire Council may also refer misuse to the Police for enforcement under the relevant law.

Specific legal restrictions attached to MLAV24:

- 1. A public right exists for walkers, people riding or leading a horse and cyclists (though cyclists must give way to other users by virtue of the 1968 Countryside Act).
- 2. It is an offence under the Road Traffic Act 1988 (Section 34) to drive a mechanically propelled vehicle (MPV) on any road being a footpath, bridleway or restricted byway. The Police have the power to enforce this law. If you drive along any part of MLAV24 by MPV you may be liable to prosecution under Section 34 of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
- 3. Any person using the right of way should not interfere with the surface of it and no person should cause damage by their use. Wiltshire Council has powers in the Highways Act to repair damage and recover the costs of doing so.
- 4. Unlawful use of MLAV24 by MPVs may be controlled by the erection of barriers (applying the least restrictive access principals outlined in the Equalities Act 2010) under Section 66 of the Highways Act 1980.
- 5. The burden of proof for the possession of a "higher right" to use MLAV24 by MPV rests with the person asserting that right. If you do drive along it as a member of the public, you will need to demonstrate your lawful right to do so.
- 6. Historic use of a bridleway by MPV would likely not, on its own, constitute the possession of a "higher right" since the usage would have been contrary to the Road Traffic Act 1988 (Section 34) and therefore illegal.

Background information and research undertaken regarding the new drop-down bollard on The Clays

Just over a year ago, a number of The Clays residents who have lived there a significant number of years raised concerns with the Parish Council regarding the increasing numbers of vehicles using The Clays, many of which it appeared were using it as a short-cut to avoid congestion along the High Street. 'No through road signs' at either end of the Clays were being ignored by drivers, and regular reports of excessive speed and inconsiderate driving were being received. Vehicles using The Clays were damaging the surface, faster than residents could fill the holes.

The Parish Council recognised the importance of the Clays bridleway for pedestrians and other permitted users, as a safe alternative route away from the busy High Street; including children going to school, the elderly, people using mobility scooters and pushchairs etc. Following a full consultation with residents of The Clays, and with their support, the Parish Council therefore decided to investigate the matter further.

Enquiries with Land Registry, and notices in the Village Magazine were inconclusive in determining ownership of the Clays bridleway. With confirmation being received from Wiltshire Council that it was not their responsibility to maintain the bridleway, the Parish Council therefore agreed to take some responsibility, and improve the safety of the Clays for the benefit of the community.

There then followed a lengthy risk-based consideration of the issues, and possible solutions to improve safety on the Clays, with the matter having been discussed publicly at most, if not every Parish Council meeting, and some of the committee meetings, as far back as September 2021. There were several occasions during meetings where members of the public present took part in the discussions. Minutes from all Parish Council meeting are available to read on the Parish Council website. The Parish Council have now carried out surface improvements to fill the potholes and make the Clays surface safer and less uneven, and a new drop-down bollard has been installed to prevent unauthorised driving along the full length of the Clays. The bollard is dropped to allow for refuse collections, and properties and landowners along the Clays have all been issued with keys to the bollard to use as necessary. The bollard itself has a reflective cover, and a 'bollard ahead' warning sign has been placed at the Stobberts Road end to prevent drivers reaching the bollard and having to reverse back along the bridleway.

Enquiries included contacting Wiltshire Council Conservation, Highways, Refuse, and Rights of Way Teams, and the Emergency Fire Service. The formal response received from Wiltshire Council Highways provided the following information,

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

The Devizes Area Board is a panel made up of the seven Wiltshire Councillors from across the wider Devizes area. I sit on it and represent The Lavingtons, alongside Tamara Reay (Devizes Rural West), Simon Jacobs (Devizes South), Iain Wallis (Devizes North), Kelvin Nash (Devizes East), Philip Whitehead (Urchfont & The Cannings) and Laura Mayes (Bromham, Rowde & Roundway).

I love the work that the Devizes Area Board does to support the community. In our December meeting, which was really well attended by members of the public, we broke into groups to discuss a rapid local response to the Cost of Living Crisis. You will no doubt have heard about the Warm Spaces popping up across the area and we are desperate to supplement this with additional initiatives to help further. I will keep you updated via this magazine, my blog and Facebook page as more local support gets rolled-out. In the meantime, please do not hesitate to contact me if I can help.

An excellent example of the support that the Devizes Area Board provides was shared with the audience during our last meeting. I champion all things "Youth" on the board and was thrilled to tot-up this year's grants we have provided for projects involving young people.

We have helped kick start youth clubs in Bromham, Great Cheverell and West Lavington with grants of more than £9,000. We've supported Parish Councils with improvements to play areas by donating more that £13,000. We supported local youth sports initiatives with grants of £12,500

and we assisted schools and church groups with grants of £15,000 for youth work. In total, over the last year, the Devizes Area Board has awarded grants for local youth projects totalling £61,000!

I often harp on about communities uniting in order to build things together. That local, grass roots passion really is the best foundation to a successful project and when those initiatives make it to the Devizes Area Board to request financial support, we are often fighting each other for access to the cheque book!

In other news, I talked about the issues with the completely flawed 5 Year Housing Land Supply last month. Some good news has come from Westminster in terms of amendments to housing targets in response to a rebellion from MPs fuelled by pressure from communities like ours. As always, the devil is in the detail, so I await confirmation from Wiltshire Council officers to confirm that our local control over house building has been strengthened.

Finally, I want to wish you and your families a very happy and healthy Christmas and a positive start to 2023.


