



WHAT IS COURIER FRAUD?

Courier fraud occurs when a fraudster contacts victims by telephone purporting to be a police officer or bank official. To substantiate this claim, the caller might be able to confirm some easily obtainable basic details about the victim such as their full name and address.

The caller may also offer a telephone number for the victim to telephone or ask the victim to call the number on the back of their bank card to check that they are genuine. In these circumstances, either the number offered will not be genuine or, where a genuine number is suggested, the fraudster will stay on the line and pass the victim to a different individual. After some trust has been established, the fraudster will then, for example, suggest;

- Some money has been removed from a victim's bank account and staff at their local bank branch are responsible.
- Suspects have already been arrested but the "police" need money for evidence.
- A business such as a jewellers or currency exchange is operating fraudulently and they require assistance to help secure evidence.

Victims are then asked to co-operate in an investigation by attending their bank and withdrawing money, withdrawing foreign currency from an exchange or purchasing an expensive item to hand over to a courier for examination who will also be a fraudster.

At the time of handover, unsuspecting victims are promised the money they've handed over or spent will be reimbursed but in reality there is no further contact and the money is never seen again.

PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone or offer to pick up your card by courier. Hang up if you get a call like this.
- If you need to call your bank back to check, wait five minutes; fraudsters may stay on the line after you hang up. Alternatively, use a different line altogether to call your bank.
- Your debit or credit card is yours don't let a stranger take it off you. You should only ever have to hand it over at your bank. If it's cancelled, you should destroy it yourself.

Great Cheverell has also built a team of youth club volunteers and received funding from Wiltshire Council. The final piece of the puzzle is in gaining the support of the Pavilion Trust to offer the youth club a home. Fingers crossed the Trust will support the community by opening the Pavilion's doors.

Local casework has kept me extremely busy this month, but I can honestly say, as exhausting as it is, it remains a pleasure to represent my community. I thought it might be interesting to share some of the things I am working on behind the scenes. I continue to work with the Police & Crime Commissioner and Community Speed Watch coordinator to finalise my plan for a significant update to the way we can tackle villagebased speeding. My focus is maintained on preparing representations to the Eastern Area Planning Committee regarding two local Planning proposals. I've had site meetings in West Lavington with Hayfield Homes, developer of the Lavington Lane site, to negotiate goodwill contributions to the community in the form of improvements to local infrastructure (in addition to the statutory CIL payments). I've also met with our Planning Enforcement Officer and residents across Great Cheverell, West Lavington and Market Lavington to resolve local issues involving rights of way and land encroachment. Alongside regular attendance at monthly meetings, I've also tried to support our local parish councillors across The Lavingtons who give significant energy to making our villages better places to live. I work with Danny, our local MP, on joint initiatives such as the resolution of issues in Victoria Park and the poor standard of service offered by certain housing associations, Aster being a key focus for us at the moment. I'm proud to say I continue to frustrate Wiltshire Council's Cabinet as well as certain council officers with my constant championing of issues you raise with me, primarily on the Highways front! Then there is of course the county-wide Education portfolio which I look after which brings a whole mountain of challenges as schools across Wiltshire face rising costs at the same time as trying to catch-up after so much schooling has been missed due to the pandemic.

Market Lavington Annual Parish Meeting

The council and parishioners welcomed representatives from the Co-Op (Colin) and the developers of the field beside The Spring (Sean) who came to give a brief outline of a proposal and answer questions put by parishioners.

- The proposed site for a new Co-Op store would be beside the existing houses on the former Shires Garage site.
- If it went ahead there would be 15 houses built on the rest of the field, instead of the 20 that are currently planned.
- The new Co-Op would have additional storage space and nearly 3 times as much shelf and cold cabinet space as now, but be small enough to open all day on Sundays.
- With more storage space, there would no longer need to be daily deliveries as part of a larger load going to a big store. One smaller lorry, less often.
- The development will only go ahead if parishioners show that they are in favour
 of this happening. If parishioners do not support the development, the existing
 Co-Op would stay open.
- The Neighbourhood Plan is a legal document, changes from the plan would need, I believe, to be agreed by a legally binding vote. Either through a completely new Neighbourhood Plan, or on a variation. Wiltshire Council law officers would have to tell the Parish Council what would have to happen.
 - It would take many years for the development to happen.





The Queen and The Prince of Wales planted the first Jubilee tree in the grounds of Windsor Castle in March this year, to launch the Queen's Green Canopy, a not-for-profit tree planting project to mark her Platinum Jubilee and which aims to raise funds that will go towards creating green spaces in deprived urban areas and schools in the UK.

It invites and encourages individuals, Scout and Girlguiding groups, villages, cities, counties, schools and corporates from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee" and will dedicate a network of 70 Ancient Woodlands across the United Kingdom and identify 70 Ancient Trees to celebrate Her Majesty's 70 years of service.

However, taking part in the Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) seeks, in addition to honouring the Queen, to benefit our children, grandchildren and future generations in the face of imminent climate chaos, due to the fact that trees support our natural wildlife, provide cleaner air, reduce pollution, have a positive effect on lessening soil erosion, improve biodiversity and landscape, host insects, and mitigate the effects of climate change.

The official tree planting season is between October to March but, if you haven't already considered, or been able to get on with planting a tree and wish to support the Queen, our planet and our youth, it's not too late! Tree planting will commence again in October 2022 through to the end of the Jubilee year.

Then in October, if you wish, you will be able to become part of the digital legacy of green canopy projects to commemorate the Jubilee by uploading your Jubilee tree to the QGC MAP, a digital record of the Jubilee tree planting projects across the United Kingdom. Alternatively, you might wish to order a QGC freestanding plaque to accompany your tree in situ. Gifting a tree through the QGC to benefit future generations is also a possibility. Everyone is encouraged to play their part for the environment. In West Lavington/Littleton Panell, where we live, the village Streetscene volunteer team, responsible for planting colourful tubs of flowers throughout the two villages, has already done so with a QGC sapling at the corner of Holmfield. 
