#### Concerns Over Proposal Which Includes Removal of Key Historic Connecting Footpath Between Littleton Panell and West Lavington

A village planning application PL/2021/09496 is requesting planning permission to build a coach car park which includes the severing of the legal footpath that enables villagers to move safely between the back of Littleton Panell through to West Lavington. This Right of Access has been used since the 1800s, predates the school and provides safe passage for adults, children and dog walkers avoiding the dangers of walking along the very busy A360 High Street. Residents refer to it affectionately as 'the bypass'

The proposal includes preventing users from walking on the part of the footpath that runs from the kissing gate opposite St Joseph's Catholic church (on the B3098), through the school playing fields. Instead, users will be re-routed onto the dangerous A360 narrow High Street pavements.

#### The Way of Forgiveness

'Unforgiveable'. That might well be our reaction to the cruel murder of the MP David Amess. By all accounts he was a decent and honourable man who sought to do his best by the Southend constituents he was elected to serve. The culprit will no doubt face justice. Questions will be asked about the effectiveness of the deradicalisation programme, Prevent. Yet the MP's grief-shattered family called not for recriminations, but asked that "people to set aside their differences and show kindness".

Kindness and forgiveness seem to be in short supply these days, especially on social media. Step out of line and you might find yourself 'cancelled', with little hope of redemption. But who of us is 100% correct when it comes to our thoughts, words and deeds? The Christian faith reminds us that we are all sinners. Every one of us falls far short of God's perfect standard of righteousness and truth.

That is why we need forgiveness. The wonderful thing is that God has provided the way of forgiveness through his Son, Jesus. He was 'cancelled', condemned to death by crucifixion. There on the cross Jesus died for the sins of the world. All who believe in him are forgiven and put right with God. Jesus taught his followers to pray, 'Father, forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us.'

As a society we desperately need to recover the idea that the lost can be found and the guilty forgiven. The cross of Jesus is a good place to start.

#### The fuller story.

In the October magazine I wrote a short piece about police action om speeding. I was contacted by a reader and sent him a longer explanation. Since then a new Police and Crimes Commissioner (PCC) has been elected.

In October a police officer parked on Spin Hill for an hour with equipment for recording evidence that could be used in a prosecution.

The timing was based on the months of data sent to the police, which predicted the time of day when there would be the greeatest number of speeding vehicles. The Officer decided that the streetlights were too far apart on that section of road for it to count as urban, so without repeater signs prosecutions would fail. The officer parked there and did nothing until the hour was up.

This led to a short flurry of e-mails and conversations between the Cllr Muns, Wiltshire Highways and Wiltshire Police.

The police now accept that repeater signs are not needed to ensure prosecutuion. In November a police officer visited Spin Hill for half an hour and one driver was stopped and given advice.

At the October Parish Council meeting councillors were told that the current police policy is to fund the traffic officers through fines collected for speeding, so they will be targeted to places and times offering the highest income. If income is high enough more will be employed.

Since then the new PCC has announced that 3 Automated Speed Watch cameras have been purchased. Pictures of speeding cars are collected and downloaded to police laptops using wifi. The computers can then access number recognition software and the DVLA database to ensure prosecution. Profits from the cameras would then be used to buy additional cameras.

He has also announced a system of co-ordination of Community Speedwatch teams based on the eight Community Police Team Areas.

#### **Eco-Corner**

As we watch Cop 26 unfold in Glasgow this month when more than 120 countries join the global climate race to zero carbon-emissions, we are encouraged not to forget Cop15 which is convening governments from around the world - online from 11 October with more detailed discussions in Kunming, China, in April - to agree new goals for nature for the next decade.

Global biodiversity losses pose a threat to human wellbeing, affecting food, health, security, and increasing the likelihood of pandemics. Natural History Museum considers that ecosystem losses pose as much of a threat to the planet as the climate crisis and that the solutions are linked.

Worryingly for the UK, an analysis by the Museum has revealed that the UK, with an average of only 53% of its biodiversity left, is in the bottom 10% of the world's countries and last in the G7!

To help policymakers compare the state of local ecosystem biodiversity among countries, the Museum has developed the Biodiversity Trends Explorer to track biodiversity change. So what actions might we as individuals take for nature?

The UK needs millions more trees to reach its 2050 carbon net-zero target. By digging in with the Woodland Trust, we'll help bring the UK (and the Queen in her Jubilee Year!) nearer this important goal:

Drinks and cake will be available, plus the opportunity to chat to members of the Julia's House care and fundraising team.





#### A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns

#### Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

This month I met with several local residents who are passionate about the fight against climate change whilst many more sent me ideas and comments via email following the publishing of Wiltshire Council's Climate Strategy.

The Council has made great strides in reducing its carbon footprint over the last few years and the Climate Strategy signposts the way forwards to achieve even more. That said, I think there is more that can be done and the pace with which we do it can be picked-up too. From the feedback I have received, this seems to be a view shared by many residents and I have passed all comments to my fellow councillors who are tasked with constructing and driving forwards policy on the subject.

I am reminded by the red leaves on the Virginia Creeper and Stag's Horn in the back garden that the year is rapidly drawing to a close. As we prepare for Guy Fawkes night I have been asked by a few residents to raise the issue of bonfires which create a lot of smoke and can cause issues for anyone with respiratory issues. Whether it is a November 5th bonfire party or general garden fires, please be considerate of neighbours by waiting until after dark before lighting fires. It would also help not to burn green wood which creates more smoke and ideally have the Council collect garden waste so that it can be disposed of in a more environmentally friendly way.

Please also be mindful that many of us are pet and livestock owners and might need warning of fireworks in order to minimise stress to our animals. Again, please be courteous where possible and tell your neighbours if you are planning on letting off fireworks or use a local Facebook group if you prefer. We rarely see fireworks throughout the year until November and December but when they do arrive they can cause significant stress despite the occasional sound of mortars and machine guns that we are used to! I don't believe it is fair to suggest people should be unable to enjoy a short firework display at home, however, that courtesy should be reflected by those choosing to light some fireworks by giving a little nudge to those living around them. As with everything, life is all about give and take, tolerance and courtesy.

As a parent of younger children I am conscious that darker evenings make simple road crossings on the way home from school or the park a lot more dangerous. Speeds through our villages are, at times, ridiculous. With slippery roads and poor visibility the chance of a very serious incident is increased dramatically. Please can all drivers keep in mind the impact on stopping distances that Autumn and Winter brings and be respectful of our village speed limits. If you do have younger children it might be worth having a chat with them about road safety so they understand the difference between Summer and Winter when it comes to vehicles and their ability to see and stop.

Get those log piles stacked and oil tanks topped-up, stay safe, have a happy Halloween and bonfire night and please do not hesitate to contact me about anything I can help with.
