#### **Bonfires and smoke pollution**

During the COVID -19 crisis we are asking residents to be sensitive to those living nearby and avoid having bonfires wherever possible. You can stockpile green waste, Reducing your waste and composting to rot down material for use as a soil improver, sign up for a garden Garden waste collections from Wiltshire Council or take it to the house hold recycling centre.

Never burn garden waste that is still green or recently cut, and never burn any other household waste.

Allotment committees and users, as well as householders have a particularly important role in ensuring responsible behaviour by their members.

Wiltshire Council receive more than 150 complaints a year about smoke from garden bonfires, domestic flues and chimneys and about smoke emanating from commercial premises.

Bonfires can cause a nuisance to other people:

- · by making asthma, bronchitis or other respiratory conditions worse
- · by affecting visibility for drivers on nearby roads
- because fire can spread to nearby fences or buildings

There are no byelaws restricting bonfires in Wiltshire's Area and there are no specific times of day restricting bonfires.

However if smoke is caused by a bonfire is creating a nuisance, the council has powers to take action under the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

If a bonfire is causing smoke to drift across a road, please contact the police

Individuals can also take action through a Magistrates' Court.

During the current COVID-19 crisis if you are affected by smoke from a bonfire, we would recommend that you discuss it initially with your neighbour, if this is possible while observing social distancing and self-isolation rules. Always try to be reasonable, otherwise your discussions may end up in further arguments and create unwanted future neighbour tension. Explain the details of your concern and try and agree a reasonable solution or compromise.

But National Service placed him in the army where he learnt a trade in electronics with the REME (Royal Electrical and Mechanical engineers) He played for the army teams in football and athletics winning many races in the latter discipline. But football became his first choice when stationed in Tywyn in North Wales, especially when he played away games he was paid more than his weekly army pay! His time in the army put him in good stead to enter civvy street where he obtained his qualifications at night school in Electronics while working in many different jobs during daytime. He went into the Electronic/Electrical world, first of all based in London, latterly for Westinghouse in Chippenham working on battery storage design, travelling extensively to advise companies throughout UK.

When he came to Treetops in Easterton Sands, the previous owner introduced him to gardening where he excelled growing flowers and vegetables. Another 'trade' he refined was the art of brewing his own beer and wine (the latter was quite potent from fiery to brain numbing!) latterly he did enjoy a 6X.

After retirement, he took up Bowls and short mat bowls playing in teams for Devizes, Easterton and Urchfont. The last time he played was in Easterton Village Hall just before Lockdown in 2020 and introduced me to the game. He will be sadly missed by all of us who had the privilege to meet him he was a true Gentleman, my neighbour and friend to many. Judy Boyt

It is with all God's blessing that I look forward to seeing you in Church soon.



## A Library of Things

"Holy Trinity Church in Weymouth has been actively engaging on how to support people in the local community as we come out of lockdown – conscious that there is a lot of deprivation, loneliness, struggling families and business' in the parish.

"As word has got around, we were approached by some local people within our community who were starting up an new support business, the Weyshare 'Library of Things' project. It has been started by a 23 year-old local man, Connor Hansford, and encourages people to reduce waste and save money by loaning and borrowing items.

"Because the newly-formed business had little funding and was looking for premises, the church offered to support the new business by letting out part of the church crypt as a place to drop off and store all kinds of things from pressure washers, fridges, bikes, tools – all kinds of things! Things that some people could not afford to purchase but could borrow and return after use.

"People can take part in the scheme by signing up to the project's website, which then gives access to an online catalogue. Items can be borrowed for seven days, and can be dropped off and collected.

"Libraries of things enable communities all over the world to borrow all kinds of donated goods and other items for a fraction of what they would cost to buy, saving people money and reducing waste. We at Holy Trinity church are proud to support this initiative and hope in the future to be able to use our church space, not only for worship, but to serve God in other people more effectively.

"Connor has since re-engaged with his faith and is discerning whether he has a vocation to become a priest. He is a member of Holy Trinity church and hopes to get more involved in the months ahead."

**Alzheimer's Support** has opened four new carers' groups to offer support and a social outlet for relatives and friends of people living with dementia.

New members are invited to join the groups which meet monthly in local eateries across Wiltshire. The informal get-togethers give carers the chance to spend time with others in a similar situation, learn more about dementia or to simply chat and make new friends.

The meetings are hosted by trained dementia professionals, who can answer any questions members have about dementia or signpost to other beneficial services.

# WILTSHIRE LINK SCHEMES

Link Schemes are community based, volunteer run charities based predominantly in Wiltshire, which aim to improve the quality of life for disadvanataged, elderly or infirm people providing transport and good neighbour serviices. Link Schemes help to keep local communities connected to vital services by connecting drivers, using their own cars, with passengers who have limited access to transport. Depending of volunteer availability, this can involve taking someone to a medical appointment, shopping or providing 'good neighbour' services like prescription collection. A donation is requested from the passenger using the Link volunteer car to support the cost of running the service. Each Link scheme is run by a group of local volunteers managed by a local Link Co-ordinator. People wishing to use the service, simply call thier co-ordinator who will endeavour to arrange for a volunteer to carry out the task.

The villages of Easterton, Market Lavington & Urchfont form one of the vital Link Schemes

These essential services provide a safety net for those unable to access services in other ways. Link Schemes aim to complement other services, statutory & voluntary, and clients will be directed to another service if appropriate. Link Schemes operate as small independent charitable organisations & generally have a Management Committee, Co-ordinator and Volunteers. Each Link Scheme responds to the needs of itsss community and uses the skills offered by its volunteers.

Your local Link Scheme needs volunteers to help both as drivers & committee work. A few hours each month can be of immense help. You don't have to be a committe member to be a drivers and vice versa.

# **Small Adjustments Big Impact**

Increasingly we are all realising the importance of nature in our lives for mental health and wellbeing and how fragile our eco system can be and the huge negative impact the human population has had; perhaps like me you have begun to understand that our very survival as a species depends on what we do and don't do now, it can feel quite overwhelming at times. There are however some really simple adjustments we can make to have a positive impact on our wildlife which in turn supports our existence.

Hedges, large shrubs, Leylandii and the like – don't cut them between March and August as recommended by the RSPB, this is when birds are nesting, and in fact it is against the law to cut a hedge where a bird is nesting. In August we still had Blackbirds and Robins in our hedge and hazel bush.

Leave a wild area in your garden, even a small area, maybe the edge of a lawn would be of great advantage to wildlife, for example a stinging nettle supports over 40 insect species, which we absolutely need to support wildlife and in turn us. A little bit of a compromise can go a long way and perhaps we can learn to coexist in a more balanced and thoughtful way, and feel a little bit better about ourselves knowing we've been considerate in our approach. 

# **ECO-CORNER**

# On route to COP 26

On Tuesday 20th July, the first time the UK has ever experienced an extreme hot weather warning, a group of very hot and weary walkers arrived in West Lavington after walking 13 miles from Trowbridge. Why would anyone walk this distance on such a hot day?

Well, the Young Christians Climate Network (YCCN) is leading a relay from this year's G7 summit in Cornwall to the Climate Change Conference, COP26, in November in Glasgow. Young people, in particular, feel their generation is at stake and YCCN, among them, is calling on world leaders to take urgent action.

On July 20th the pilgrims' main route passed through our area and made an overnight stop in West Lavington before heading for Shrewton and Salisbury. 
