#### God's own field

Harvest, in the agricultural sense, is well past. All is safely (or soggily) gathered in and the appealing blocks of barley straw and hay baling our landscape into a pop-up sculpture park have all but disappeared. The Church's Harvest celebrations – extended as a 'Creationtide' season into October – are in one sense, then, a delayed thanksgiving for the yield of former months. That needn't trouble us, however, for they are just as much focused on a rather less specific future point: the anticipated end of the world believers know as the Last Judgement. For many, this is merely one of the vestiges of a Christian worldview with little bearing on present times, a sickle blade blunted by unbelief.

Nevertheless, the idea of a harvest that separates the righteous from the unrighteous often crops up in Jesus' teaching and has gained a new edge as we witness the ecological ends of our actions, more fearfully evident with each passing, and slightly warmer, year. The once-familiar Parable of the Wheat and the Tares tells us that good and evil inevitably grow together in this life: one is easy to mistake for the other and this fact should caution us away from prejudice or self-righteousness. But it is also a warning that the real myth is the one that imagines our actions have no lasting or eternal consequences. They do, they will - and to ignore this is simply to hasten the day.

On **Sunday October the 22nd** there is going to be a concert of words, music and THANKS following the generosity shown by local people to support the refurbishment of St Barnabas church organ.

If there is a hymn, reading or piece of music you would like to be played please let Sue Allen or Sue Somerville know by September 20th 813603 or 812538.

The organ will be re dedicated and the evening will conclude with drinks and nibbles.

This event starts at 6.00pm the organ will be played by Paul Skelton and a small choir from West Lavington will join us.

'Ban the Bomb' was a thing in the 1980s. The Greenham Common women protested at the presence of nuclear missiles at the Berkshire RAF base. A little more modestly, I braved being told off in school for wearing a CND badge. Those were the days. The prospect of nuclear oblivion haunted our teenage imaginations. In their number 1 single, Going Underground, The Jam lamented, 'You want more money, of course I don't mind/To buy nuclear textbooks for atomic crimes.' Fun, eh?

The man who wrote the 'nuclear textbook' was the subject of Christopher Nolan's blockbuster movie, Oppenheimer. Richard Oppenheimer brought together some of the most brilliant scientists of his day to develop nuclear weapons ahead of Nazi Germany. Winning that arms race was a massive scientific achievement. The resulting bombs were dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, ending World War II. Yet Oppenheimer was deeply disturbed by the weapon of mass destruction he had helped to create, 'I have become death, the destroyer of worlds', the scientist reflected.

You won't find me sporting a CND badge these days. Sadly, nuclear weapons can't be uninvented, although I certainly hope they will never be used again. Oppenheimer highlights what is best and worst about human beings. We are capable of the most astounding scientific breakthroughs, yet we are also capable of unleashing death and destruction on a massive scale. The Christian faith recognises that human beings are made in the image of God. Hence our exceptional abilities. But the Bible also testifies, 'All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God'.

Jesus came to deliver us from sin by dying in our place. Christ's resurrection from the dead brings the hope of a new creation for those who put their trust in him. The film Oppenheimer concludes on an ominous note, with the world teetering on the brink of nuclear oblivion. The Bible ends more hopefully, pointing us to Jesus as the one in whom there is life, the Saviour of the world. In the Book of Revelation John is given to see this glorious vision: 'I saw a new heaven and a new earth... and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain any more, for the former things have passed away'.







#### A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns, Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

I hope you had a lovely Summer! It wasn't quite the sun-filled July and August we were hoping for but we had a few good days interspersed by rainy ones. Plenty of people across Southern Europe and further afield would have gladly swapped their weather for ours. It's always important to keep some perspective.

With schools on holiday the Education teams at Wiltshire Council tend to quieten down which gives me more time to focus on local casework. I have been able to dedicate even more time to Victoria Park residents in Great Cheverell and I am pleased to see momentum in the MoJ's project to improve the infrastructure so that Wiltshire Council can finally adopt it. At the start of the Summer, I sat down with the Residents' Association, Parish Council, the MoJ project team and our MP Danny Kruger to thrash out the details - the project is moving!

I've also been working on resolving issues with footpaths, potholes, road safety and Planning across The Lavingtons alongside residents, parish councillors and Wiltshire Council officers. Waiting restrictions in West Lavington and Littleton Panell have been proposed and were out for consultation in August. Footpaths in Little Cheverell, Easterton and Market Lavington have been escalated to senior officers due to neglect from neighbouring landowners. Speeding in all the villages and Black Dog crossroads has been raised numerous times to Wiltshire Police with some further progress. The list seems never ending at times, but it is important we work together to find a way through complex problems.

I think I have a fairly good idea of what is important to residents in The Lavingtons, partly because I live here too and speak to friends and family across the villages every day. I also attend most parish council meetings where I get to hear from residents on all sorts of issues. However, it is always good to be able to take a broader more analytical view of what residents think. With that in mind I will be delivering a survey over the next few months so that you can tell me directly what things matter most to you in our villages. Once it is ready, I will publicise it via the parish magazines, Facebook and my website so that you can let me know what matters most to you.

Lastly, to all our students who have been studying hard and got their results recently, well done! I hope you achieved what you wanted to, however, if you didn't, don't panic! Speak to your school or college who are always on hand to offer advice on where to go from here. You are never on your own and what feels like an insurmountable challenge now is often overcome with a fresh pair of eyes.

#### **Nurture Nature September 2023**

Variable weather conditions in July and August made it difficult for our garden birds to nurture their broods. A cock blackbird was a very good parent and when the fledglings eventually came out into the open they looked well fed and in good condition. Blacky has now disappeared, probably on an internal migration to South Devon as some local blackbirds have been known to do, and other 'resident' species too. Many water birds including mute swans succumbed to avian flu, hence numbers have declined this breeding year. You might have been lucky to have seen dragon flies quartering your garden for insects (they are carnivorous) putting on a wonderful balletic display in the sun beams more contemporary in style than classical. Another swift fact, secret even to established bird buffs – swifts breeding in Beijing and other parts of Asia travel on average 30,000 kilometres annually, nearly double the distances flown by the swifts we see in the British Isles. (BTO Research 2022). There have been some good sightings of butterflies in our gardens, of Red Admirals particularly, but other species are fewer in number (Ref.www.bto.org/butterflies for more information). Moth hatchings have been very disappointing; leaving the outside door open with the light on used to attract many species of moth but this year hardly any entered to flutter round light sources when the writer did this on several occasions. What has been encouraging this year is the increase in grasshoppers, maybe because lawns and grassy areas are being kept longer before cutting. Some are green, others brown as they camouflage themselves according to the herbage they live in. Males tend to be more brightly coloured. One such, soaking up the warm sun in the open doorway of a summer house had to be persuaded to move by putting a finger near its back end, it then proceeded to jump out a distance of four feet (120 cms approx). The grasshopper was only an inch long (2.5 cms), so perhaps some interested physicist or general scientist could calculate the equivalent of a human doing this by comparing the power ratios or whatever the formula is for such. Readers should be on the lookout for a non native species to their gardens (No, not ring necked parakeets this time, which have become common in London parks and gardens especially) - but this new invasive species has been arriving in England, viz Wiltshire and Somerset, it's the colourful striking sub tropical Red Billed Leiothrix which could become a threat to our garden birds which already depend on us to survive our winters, as they will be attracted to our feeders and compete with our native birds. monitoring of the Red-billed Leiothrix in Britain will be crucial in determining its prevalence in this country, the public are asked to to report sightings via the British Trust for Ornithology's BirdTrack app. Now, the last words will be given to a great champion of the British countryside – who sadly died earlier this year aged 80, Robin Page. He was a forthright commentator on country matters and his weekly newspaper columns were strong on defending the countryside and its way of life. His journalism and books are never dull reading. 

### **CANADA WOODS**

The regeneration programme has been postponed until Mid-October; the exact date will be displayed in the usual ways nearer the time. The delay is due to access requirements for Adam and his team at Wiltshire Forestry, and a complication with the logging horses. Importantly, it means the woodland will be open to the public for the rest of the summer.

Could we just remind you that all the necessary checks have been made in respect of protected species both in Canada Woods and Easterton Brook. The contractor will always 'nest check' prior to felling. There have been concerns raised to the variation on our felling licence. The variation considered and issued by the Forestry Commission was for permission to fell 200 trees. The variation is to allow us to remain compliant should there be 'collateral damage' whilst felling takes place or unmarked trees are felled due to disease noticed by the contractors. This variation was advised by our highly qualified woodland consultant as our original felling licence was too precise.

Under the Forestry Commission terms of licence, a maximum of 30% is the normal felling total specified. We have no intention or need to fell 30% of the trees in the area designated as compartment 2 on our felling licence. 200 trees being approximately 30% of the total trees in that compartment. There are less than 100 trees marked for felling in compartment 2.

The ecological integrity of Canada Woods depends on this regeneration programme. When the wild flowers establish, the canopy is opened and the understory begins to grow we can look forward to many species using the habitats this programme aims to provide and the return of native flora and fauna previously recorded within the woodland which has been missing for many years.
