New Agricultural buildings – Proposed Cllr Steele, seconded Cllr Stevens:  Whilst the Parish Council has No Objection to this application, could we please make an observational request, and insistence for inclusion of the following condition for any approval granted:  1) Insisted inclusion of condition – That use of both barns be restricted to solely agricultural activities i.e., as detailed in the application (the eastern smaller Building is to be secure for machinery, vehicle and implement storage whilst the other northern one used for hay, straw, fencing and less valuable materials associated with the Agricultural land use).</li> <li>2) Observational request - The height of the proposed barns does cause a visual impact on the area, and the Parish Council would like to request that the entire eastern face of the machinery barn be clad with timber, rather than concrete blocks to the lower section, and timber boarding to the upper section, as that has less of a visual impact and will mellow with time.</li> <li>ii.
