- We have just reviewed the **draft Housing Needs** survey from AECOM, an independent consultancy, which gives an idea of the mix of housing that we might need over the next 15 years. While this survey provides useful guidelines, it is not intended to set a definitive number of new homes and some areas rely on assumptions we consider impractical. Our feedback has already been provided to AECOM so that a final version can be prepared.
- SAECOM's assessment of all the sites suggested for housing by the Parish is expected soon. Once this report is received, the Steering Group will review it for accuracy before sending it back for final amendments. The completed report, which will include every site put forward, will then be made publicly available for consultation. This will be a vital opportunity for parish residents to share their views on the possible housing sites from which a shortlist will be created for inclusion in the Plan.

Won't Get Fooled Again

The Chapel I attended as a teenager in Rhiwderin near Newport, South Wales had a fascinating member of the congregation. His name was Bert Entwistle. Bert had a wonderful baritone voice and sang in local choirs. But that wasn't the thing that made him such an intriguing figure to my teenage friends and me. It was his son we were interested in. For John Entwistle was bass guitar player with The Who. The band have just announced their farewell tour, some sixty years since forming in the mid-1960s. Although only singer Roger Daltrey and guitarist Pete Townsend are still in the land of the living.

One of The Who's best known song is 'Won't Get Fooled Again', released in 1971. The air was full of revolution in the previous decade. Young people were busy throwing off the old order of deference and restraint. They demanded a less inhibited and more equal society. 'Free love' and all that. The heady idealism of that time had begun to peter out in 70s. In 'Wont Won't Get Fooled Again', Daltrey belts out Townsend's disillusioned commentary, 'Things look just the same, and history ain't changed'. At the climax of the song he roars, 'Meet the new boss, same as the old boss.'

That's the trouble with revolutions. The old order may be overthrown, but the new lot aren't necessarily a whole lot better. Which is the basic lesson of George Orwell's novels Animal Farm and 1984. Orwell had Soviet Russia firmly in his sights. The October Revolution may have got rid of the Tsar's corrupt regime, but you'd hardly call Stalin's Russia a bastion of justice, equality and freedom. Similarly with the so-called 'Woke Revolution'. The intention may have been good, to champion the cause of the oppressed and marginalised. But once the Woke Revolutionaries gained cultural power and influence, they soon became dab hands at doing a bit of oppressing themselves. In a now notorious case, Kathleen Stock was hounded out of her professorship at the University of Sussex for daring to insist that being a woman has something to do with biology.

Earlier this year the Supreme Court ruled that for the purposes of the Equality Act 2010 the terms 'man' and 'woman' refer to biological sex, not gender identity. Even senior politicians who seemed a tad confused about the details of male and female anatomy now accept this commonsense judgement.

But why is it that even the most idealistic people who believe they are on the 'right side of history' often end up acting in a pretty brutal way? Former Deputy Prime Minister Nick Clegg put his finger on it when commenting on why the internet seems to spew out so much fake news and other vile stuff, "This is the awful truth: we like misinformation, we like lurid headlines, we like gossip, we like mischief, we like people saying critical things of each other." Clegg added, "We are not nice. Human beings are not always nice and never ever have been." What Clegg calls "not nice" the Bible calls "sin". That is our wilful tendency to defy God and do damage to others.

That's why revolutions fail, and the new bosses soon become as bad as the old ones they removed. Accepting the Bible's realistic account of human nature will help ensure we won't get fooled again by people who promise sweeping change. The problem of sin is one what we cannot resolve on our own. That is why God sent his Son Jesus into our broken world. He came to rescue us from sin by dying upon the cross in our place and being raised from the dead. By faith in Jesus we can be forgiven and receive power to live a new life. The Christian Revolution is based not on human efforts to remodel the world, but the grace of God.

Edington Music Festival: August 17th-24th

The Edington Festival of Music within the Liturgy is celebrating its 70th birthday this year! Started in 1956 by the Priory Church's new vicar, Canon Ralph Dudley, over one weekend with half a dozen of his choral scholar friends, it was part of a bid to raise enough money to repair the church's very leaky roof. In its 69 years so far, and now with three choirs, 6 organists, over 70 participants in all, and over 8 days of services, the festival has raised over £250,000 for the benefit of the parish and the wider communities which host this wonderful event.

Its congregations now come from all over the globe, from New Zealand to North America, drawn to what is the oldest, and generally regarded as the finest, celebration of church music within the context for which it was written.

This year's theme, "The Ways of the Lord", follows journeys made along roads and ways in the Holy Land, with music celebrating the anniversaries of the birth of the leading composer of the late 16th century, Palestrina, and of some more recent composers, Sir John Rutter and Bob Chilcott, whose compositions for the season of Christmas feature in Tuesday's 'Road to Bethlehem'. In between, there is a wide range of music from Byrd, Gibbons, and Hassler, through to Warlock, Daley and McDowall, taking in favourites such as Stanford, Howells and Britten en route. Three choirs will sing at four daily services including Choral Evensong, recorded for later broadcast on BBC Radio 3, on Wednesday afternoon; a rare liturgical performance of Wood's Mark Passion on Friday evening; and Choral Matins on both Friday and Saturday mornings. Services are free, and everyone is welcomed to enjoy sublime music and spiritual solace.

The Festival Supper, the light-hearted demonstration of the relationship between festival and Parish, is an evening of food and music this year on Wednesday 20th August, and tickets can be bought from Hugh Hancock; musicalsupper@edingtonfetival.org.

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

Now that the Council is back in full swing following the elections in May (in Wiltshire at least; Kent is apparently not holding any meetings still) it has been interesting to receive some updates from the new administration.

A main issue that impacts us locally is Black Dog Crossroads. The electricity supply was due to be installed in June, however, has slipped back to August. I don't now why this has been delayed, potentially an issue with SSE who need to do the work, or a decision by the Council. The installation of the cabling will now commence in early August and is expected to last five weeks.

The actual signals will be installed towards the end of the cabling work and will commence in early September. In total the project includes 4-way traffic signals, junction resurfacing, and drainage improvements.

As we get closer to the completion of the project there will need to be some temporary closures for side roads (Worton and Broadway) and it is expected that over-height vehicle access to Broadway will be retained. My advice has been to limit closures to nights; further Informa!on will be published mid-July. I have also advised that work should move forwards as much as possible to coincide with school holidays.

We also have a new development of 47 houses being planned in West Lavington in the field behind White Street. This has been a shock to many residents and feels huge given the recent developments the village has seen At Holloway Rise and Hedges House. A consultation is being organised for the afternoon of the 9th July, at the Churchill Arms. Like many residents I will be in attendance to learn more about the proposal and discuss my concerns with the community; impact to the roads, schools and doctor's surgery surely top of the list.

Two worrying updates have come from Council officers in the last week. The first is that radioactive material with readings above the safety threshold was uncovered on a Council owned site (a former RAF base in Melksham). What is really alarming is that officers found out about this in January and kept it from councillors and the local community until June. The same week we found out about this, councillors were also told that the balanced annual budget that officers had forecast at the end of the last quarter had miraculously turned into a £5m overspend. I accept that this represents just 1% of the overall budget, however, it is inexcusable that £5m in costs can magically appear between the point the previous administration shut the doors and turned the lights off and the new administration entered the building. Something doesn't add-up (excuse the pun) and so the upcoming Cabinet meeting will be very uncomfortable for officers, the new Leader and his team.
