A Time of Turning

September always brings a change of rhythm. Children and young people head back to school or off to college for the first time. Holidays end, routines return, and the light begins, almost imperceptibly, to soften and shorten. It can be a season of mixed feelings. For some, there is real hope: new classrooms, new opportunities, new beginnings. For others, there is nervousness — a new school, a new job, a step into the unknown. Some of us mourn the passing of long summer evenings and find the turning of the year quietly sorrowful. Others long for the crispness of autumn, the cooler days and fresher nights.

Both responses are honest, and both are welcome. Change can be exciting, full of promise. It can also be disorientating, even painful, carrying its own small grief.

The sixteenth-century saint Ignatius of Loyola encouraged Christians to seek "God in all things" — not just in church or in prayer, but in the ordinary texture of daily life. Noticing God, for Ignatius, was less about looking for the extraordinary and more about paying attention: to what stirs us, what unsettles us, what draws us closer to life and love.

That practice of attention feels well suited to September. The changing of the seasons, in nature and in our lives, can be a place to notice God. In the dimming evening light and the turning leaves, in anticipation and hope, and equally in anxiety and loss, God is present. The Psalms are full of this same honesty — praise and lament sitting side by side, often in the very same breath.

So perhaps this September, whatever this new season holds for you, it's worth pausing each day to ask, as Ignatius might: where do I see God breaking through today?

Whatever changes around us, we hold to this promise: seasons turn, circumstances shift, but God does not change — and God does not leave us to face the turning alone. This is the heart of the ancient Celtic tradition of prayer, echoed in the ancient breastplate prayer attributed to St Patrick, which speaks of Christ beside us, before us, behind us, beneath us and above us, in every direction and in every moment. Whatever this September holds for you — hope or hesitation, excitement or grief — may you know that same presence: God with you, in all things, every step of the way.

Reflections for September

Autumn is fast approaching, the heat waves of the summer will soon be a distant memory. Swifts, swallows and house martins, summer visitors will be starting their long journey to Africa. September 1st, for meteorologists is the beginning of Autumn, days start to shorten noticeably, children return to school. John Keats, the poet describes it thus:
“Season of mist and mellow fruitfulness”

So what can we expect in the weeks ahead -well seemingly just about anything! On September 1st 1906, the temperature reached 34c in Manchester, when Jimmy Conlin makes his debut for Manchester City, sporting a knotted hanky on his head. He and 4 other City players pass out from heat exhaustion. City finish the game with only 6 players and lose to Arsenal 4-1. Conlin will go on to play for England and become the second player in the world to be transferred for over £1000.

On September 11th 1919, temperatures of 32c were recorded, making it the hottest day of the year, but only 9 days later, on the 20th September wide spread snow falls!

It seems that at some time in the preceding years the country has experienced every type of weather possible, from mighty gales, hailstorms, thunderstorms and whirlwinds. So while this can be the finest, most settled time of the year, be prepared for extremes. Yet this is the month when nature yields its rich bounty, from conkers, hips and haws in the hedgerows, not forgetting blackberries, to all the fruits from our gardens. The crops from the fields, to be gathered in and safely stored. We have so much to be grateful for and we all need to take time to look at each day and see the beauty of it all, whatever the weather brings, be it the beauty of the turning leaves, or a raindrop settled on a spider's web, see the positive of what September brings and smile and say

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The Sirens' Song

I didn't like school. Most lessons held little interest for me. My attitude was, why should I waste time tuning in to double maths when I could be daydreaming. Suffice to say, school didn't much like me either and I left with a string of low-grade qualifications. My only decentish result was a grade C O-Level in Classical Studies.

That was my favourite subject. The teacher, Mr Hamlet was brilliant. He made the tales of ancient Greece and Rome seem vibrantly alive. I found Homer's Iliad and Odyssey so captivating that I may actually have done some revision for the Classical Studies exam. CSE Physics, not so much.

With all that in mind, I eagerly booked tickets for Christopher Nolan's film version of The Odyssey in all its stunning Imax glory.

One episode in Odysseus's epic journey home especially struck me. The sirens bit. You know, those beautiful creatures who sang a song so alluring that passing sailors were drawn to shore, where their ship was promptly dashed on the rocks. Odysseus desperately wanted to hear the sirens' song, but he didn't especially want to be shipwrecked. The solution? Odysseus had his crew stop their ears with wax and had himself lashed to the ship's mast. That way, he could hear the song but wasn't able to grab the tiller and send his ship careering toward the rocks. Clever, eh?

When they were safely out of earshot, Odysseus was set free, and the crew removed the wax from their lugholes. In the film version, our hero explains what the Sirens' song was all about to his curious shipmates,

"It was all the things you wanted it to be... then, all the things you wished you'd never wished for.... It told you what you most want is what you most can't have. And what you most can't have is what you already had and lost. It was the song of all the promises I failed to keep. And it told me I don't really want to go home." You won't find a song like that on Spotify. It speaks of the restless longing of the human heart. In the end, the pull of home won out for Odysseus. He risked all to get to his island kingdom of Ithica and his beloved Penelope, who awaited him there.

The Sunday after watching The Odyssey, we sang a song in church that was to my mind more wonderful than that of Homer's sirens,

There is a hope that lifts my weary head, - A consolation strong against despair,
That when the world has plunged me in its deepest pit, - I find the Saviour there!
Through present sufferings, future's fear, - He whispers 'courage' in my ear.
For I am safe in everlasting arms,- And they will lead me home.

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FREE PLACES FOR 11-18 YEAR OLDS AT CHORAL WORKSHOP

Edington Arts are offering free places to young people in secondary school for their 2026 Choral Workshop on Saturday 19th September in Edington Priory Church. This is a wonderful opportunity (for younger and older alike!) to get some excellent tuition on choral singing and vocal technique while learning music that is not usually part of choral society or choir repertoire.

The workshop will be led by Will Dawes, Director of Chapel Music at Somerville College Oxford. Will is a highly sought after choral conductor, and having sung with the elite choral ensemble Stile Antico for several years, is now also a very successful freelance singer. He will work on four pieces by British composers; Benjamin Britten, Harold Darke, Charles Wood and Samuel Wesley. The music is relatively straightforward to learn and very singable, but offers great scope for working the pieces up to a high standard. The day runs from Registration at 9.30 to a final run-through for friends and family after tea at approximately 4.30. The cost for adults is £25, and £10 for 18+ students, inclusive of music hire, tea or coffee on arrival and refreshments mid-morning. 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Based in central Wiltshire, our helicopter can reach anywhere in Wiltshire within 11 minutes – and the centre of Bath in just four.

So far in 2026, we have attended 595 missions, including 28 missions in Devizes and the surrounding areas.

February was our busiest ever, making it the first February in our history to respond to more than 100 missions.

The proportion of missions attended by a critical care doctor has increased from 61% in 2025 to 65% so far this year. That means more patients can receive advanced procedures and lifesaving interventions at the scene, bringing hospital-level care directly to the patient.

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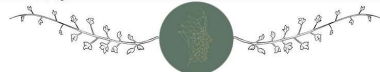

## Volunteers recognised for keeping policing accountable across Wiltshire and Swindon

Volunteers who independently examine how police powers are used, how detainees are treated and how decisions are made have been thanked for helping to hold policing in Wiltshire to account.

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) brought together volunteers at Wiltshire Police Headquarters in Devizes on Wednesday (12 August) for an event recognising the time and expertise they give to public oversight of policing.

The volunteers' work ranges from making unannounced visits to police custody suites and examining officers' use of powers to checking the welfare of police dogs and scrutinising governance, financial controls and misconduct proceedings.

Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson told those attending that independent scrutiny was an important part of policing by consent, giving members of the public an opportunity to question practices, identify improvements and provide reassurance when standards are being met.

## Chippenham Film Festival – Vinyl Listening Night

A new addition to the programme for this year is a vinyl listening night at the Old Road Tavern, on – unsurprisingly – Old Road, Chippenham, Wednesday 9th September. This will be a relaxed evening for film and music lovers to bring along their favourite soundtrack, score or film-related record, put them on the turntable and swap stories over a drink. This will take place in the 'Tavern's Barn'.

## **People's Emergency Briefing screening**

Thursday 17th September at 6.30pm All Saints' Church, West Lavington

It's been a very hot summer – and perhaps this will help us all focus more clearly on the climate and nature crisis that threatens all aspects of British life.

### **If you care about:**

extreme weather, local flooding, air pollution, the cost of living  
food prices, health

then please come to our People's Emergency Briefing screening. This film has hard facts but points towards hopeful solutions.

Following on from the screening at Market Lavington, it was agreed that this was such an important topic that we should show the film again, and have the discussions, in West Lavington.

Brothers Simon and Nick Oldridge, who are climate funders and communicators with a background in business started this initiative by inviting 12,000 politicians and leaders from business to a briefing in Westminster. From that briefing came the impetus to hold these smaller briefings to inform the general public of the current situation and to press for a national televised emergency briefing to be held. Their aims are to: enable informed discussion on the crisis, enable society to respond to the climate and nature crisis at the speed required, work together towards solutions, each a societal tipping point towards genuine emergency action and a better future.

The film features Chris Packham, Deborah Meaden, and others. You can only see this film at in-person screenings – not online. After the screening there is a facilitated discussion to help everyone air their views on what they have seen and what they would like to see happen next.

This briefing at All Saints' church is open to all. It comes from a scientific background, not from a faith background. There is no faith presentation in this screening.

However, for those who are interested on the Christian perspective on the climate and nature crisis, you are invited to our benefice services, all at 10.30am, which follow up this theme:

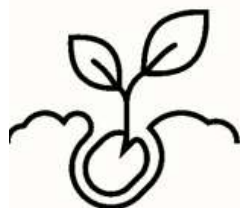

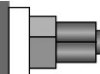

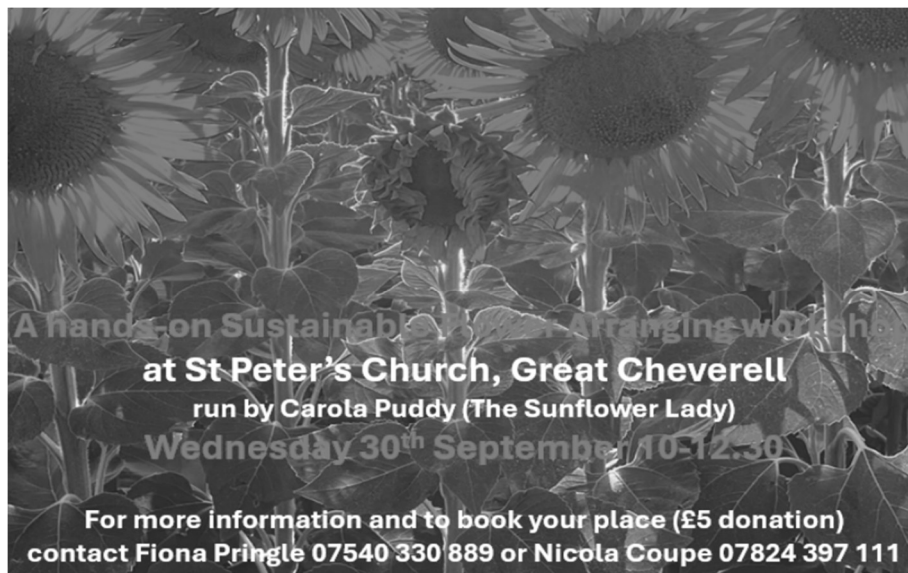
