

April Reflection

In obedience to their laws, Jews have spilled into the city from all over Israel and still more, entering by every gate. People packed into the narrow streets. Walking under rows of washing hanging high across the streets to dry in the heat of the day and breathing in the smells wafting out from the open doorways as they pass. Women trying to keep hold of excited children. The elderly looking to see if old friends or family have arrived yet. Men at all the city gates, conducting business. Herdsmen bring in the lambs for slaughter. The temple full of the comings and goings of Priests, Pharisees, Sadducees, temple guards and men, conducting business. Traders everywhere selling their wares, eager to cash in on so vast a crowd. And the roman soldiers looking on. Watching, waiting, ready to stop trouble before it can escalate into something more.

And in to this heady mix of excitement and tension underlined with the fear of an occupied country, come the cries of children's voices calling Hosanna. The voices become louder and men and women join in, "Hosanna to the son of David" and "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" and "Hosanna in the highest."

Now you can see the crowd, some running ahead, some waving branches, some spreading their cloaks on the ground before.... before what? Then you see him, the rabbi, the one everyone has been talking about for the last year or so. This gentle and humble man, RIDING INTO JERUSALEM ON A DONKEY.

Palm Sunday marks the start of Holy Week. A week when Christians everywhere re-enact, read about and reflect on the events of the last week in the life of Jesus. It starts with a celebration and ends with another celebration on Easter Day. But in between is a roller coaster of emotions waiting to carry us all the way to the foot of the Cross and the heart wrenching death of Jesus. BUT on Easter Day, that very first Easter Day, the whole world was given the hope of a new life.

We have a range of services to celebrate this important event. Starting with our Benefice Palm Sunday services on 2nd in All Saints Church, followed by our Agape supper in Easterton recalling the events of Maundy Thursday on 6th. On Good Friday we have our service of Christ's final hour in West Lavington. And on Easter Sunday we celebrate with all Christians the Hope of the World and the promise of eternal life.

We welcome you to join us thin Easter.



Climate change – the effect on gender equality

The theme for International Women's Day (8 March) this year was "Gender equality today for a sustainable tomorrow."

According to UN Women, advancing global gender equality in the context of climate change and disaster risk reduction is one of the 'greatest global challenges' of the 21st century.

The reason? Roles as primary caregivers and providers of food and fuel make women more vulnerable when flooding and drought occur. Men go to the towns, leaving them to look after the community. Women are then working harder to feed and care for their families without support. Girls often have to leave school to help their mothers manage the increased burden.

Jocelyne Razafiarivony, the Mothers' Union provincial coordinator for Madagascar, speaking about the relationship between climate change and gender inequality at the UNCSW66, said: "Because of famine, the men left the region to go to the capital of Madagascar in a massive rural exodus. Women could not go anywhere. They were a burden so they had to stay. As caregivers, they were not able to feed their families any longer. They were only eating cactus and boiled water. They were really starving."

So, climate change isn't just changing our weather; its consequences are a daily reality for millions of people. When women and girls are displaced, they are also at greater risk of violence, including sexual violence, the tragic reality of their lives as migrants or refugees, the increased danger of human and child trafficking, and early and forced marriage, which women and girls on the move endure. However, many organisations now advocate that women must be part of the

solution. Women Deliver says: "The first step towards tackling the challenges of climate change is empowering women to safeguard the environment": https://womendeliver.org/investment/invest-women-tackle-climate-change-conserve-environment/ and The World Economic Forum reports that when women are involved in decision making about the climate more effective and equitable outcomes are generated: https://www.weforum.org/agenda/2022/02/womengender-equality-climate-change-leadership/

CANADA WOODS UPDATE

Canada Woods regeneration felling was postponed late last year due to the wet conditions. Despite our initial disappointment it gave the Parish Council the opportunity to explore different options.

The decision has been made to start the felling in September 2023 when all the marked trees will be felled in line with the Parish Council's Felling Licence issued by The Forestry Commission last year and by a well-qualified contractor.

The thinning process will open the woodland canopy and allow natural regeneration of our broad leaf trees. With our climate continuing to change we need to future proof Canada Woods for future generations to enjoy, increase biodiversity and protect and maintain the flood plain.

The Woodland Management Team have invited Dorset Horse Logging to assist in our project. Once the trees have been felled two working horses will be used to extract the timber from the woodland. The use of horses will minimise the impact to our woodland floor and they can be used in all areas of Canada Woods.

This does mean that Canada Woods will need to be closed to the public while works are carried out. It is estimated that this will be for approximately one month. The Parish Council apologises in advance for any inconvenience caused by this temporary closure.


