August Reflections

On the 11th of July the Church celebrates the lesser festival for St. Benedict of Nursia, Abbot of Monte Cassino, Father of Western Monasticism and author of the Rule of St. Benedict.

Almost all of what is known about Benedict comes from St. Gregory the Great's Dialogues book II. We are told he was born about 480 in Nursia, north-east of Rome and it was to Rome that his family sent Benedict to study. What he found there disgusted and horrified him. Unable to accept the worldliness of the city, and the behaviour of his fellow students, he decided to renounce his education, his family and his inheritance to become a monk. He first went to Effide and later settles in Sublacus. It was here, amongst wooded hills and cold streams, he found his "desert" and lived as a hermit in a small cave. With only a monk's habit, food and the occasional company, Benedict faced his demons so well that his holiness was recognised and he was asked to become the spiritual father of a near-by monastery. This was a disaster and the community, finding itself with a zealot for an abbot, attempted to poison him. Benedict withdrew for a short time before establishing twelve monasteries, each with its own abbot and twelve monks back at Sublacus. Unfortunately, tensions within Benedict and problems with a jealous and obstructive parish priest caused Benedict to move on. He finally settled on the mountain top of Casinum, known to us as Monte Cassino, where he established his community, wrote his Rule and remained until his death.

It was for the benefit of his monks as a practical guide to help them to live up to the vows they had taken, that Benedict wrote his Rule for Monasteries. The idea of a rule for monks when living in community was not new and Benedict drew on a much longer document known as The rule of the Master as well as other such documents. What Benedict did was to give a rule that was focused on God in all things; scripture based, lived in accordance with the example of Jesus Christ and the teachings of the Gospels and Apostles, and took into consideration human nature.

Benedict wrote his rule for his monks who lived together in one physical place, remaining solidly faithful to each other and to that place over a great period of time. This is one of the reasons why the rule is so pertinent to our lives today. We all live out our lives in "community." In fact we live as part of many communities: family, friends, marriages, church, workplace, sports clubs, pubs, neighbourhoods, towns and cities. So it follows that like Benedicts monks, we need to look at our interpersonal relations – how we should treat one another and conduct ourselves to promote peace and harmony within the many and varied communities that make up our lives.

And finally, one last thought from Benedict.

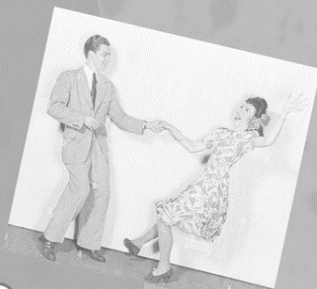

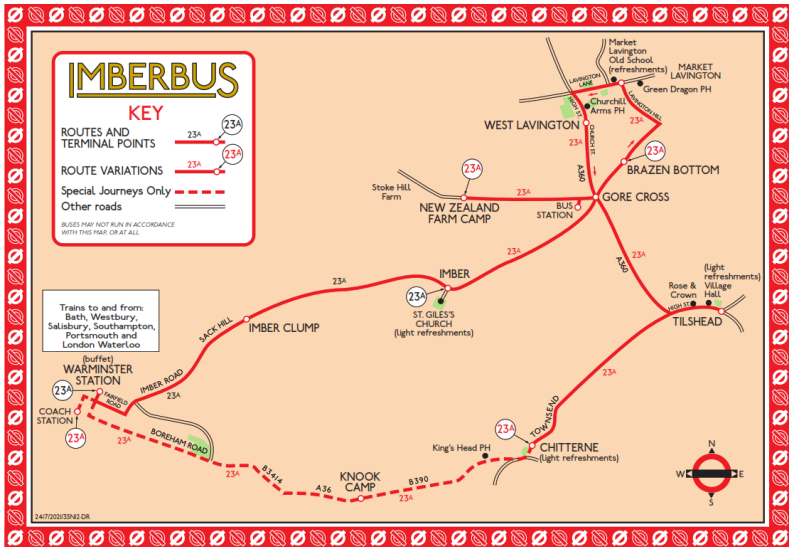

The only access to Imber on 17th August being on the buses operating the Imberbus service. Several vintage former London Transport Routemaster buses (plus a few newer ones) will again provide a bus service from Warminster Station to Imber and other isolated locations on the Salisbury Plain between 10am and 6pm.

If you have not travelled on the Imberbus service before and would like to know more about it, please visit our website at www.imberbus.org which contains details about the history of Imber and the background to the service.



How much does it cost to travel on Imberbus ?

Our fare structure has been simplified so that there are just two ticket prices – £10 for adults and £2 for children. These tickets will allow you unlimited travel on all the Imberbuses, so you can hop on and off them as much as you want and visit all the different places we serve.

Imberbus operates in the same way as an ordinary local bus service, so there is no facility to pre-book or to pay in advance – passengers just turn up and pay the conductor on the bus in cash (payment in £5 or £10 notes or £1 and £2 coins is always appreciated and there are cash machines available in Warminster town centre for those that needed them). To speed things up we will also have staff selling tickets outside Warminster Station during the morning, some of whom are able to accept payment by contactless credit/debit cards. We regret however, that we are unable to accept concessionary bus passes for travel on our buses.

Last year the Imberbus service raised more than £35,000, which was donated to various charities including St. Giles Church, the Royal British Legion, The General Artillery Volunteers, Guide Dogs for the Blind, Macmillan Cancer support, Salisbury Hospital Stars Appeal. Wiltshire Air Ambulance, Thames Valley & Great Western Omnibus Trust, The Bristol Omnibus Vehicle Collection, The London Transport Museum and various community groups in and around Salisbury Plain. We would obviously like to be able to improve on this figure in 2024 and so we do hope that you will be able to join us in August.

Faith and understanding

In the first Matrix film lead character Neo is hooked up to a virtual reality system where he is given a crash course in martial arts. On waking up in the real world Neo says with amazement, 'I know Kung Fu'. I once had a similar moment of dawning realisation in a maths lesson. Suddenly I understood algebra. Not when I was a kid, unfortunately. As far as I was concerned then, algebra was pointless mathematical gibberish. As for simultaneous equations...

That kind of stuff was fair enough I thought if you aspired to be a mad professor, filling up blackboards with an incomprehensible jumble of letters and numbers. I preferred Classical Studies. Homer and that. The Greek bloke, not Bart's dad. But then it dawned on me. I sat in on a Year 7 Maths lesson as a school governor. Suddenly algebra made sense. At least it did for a few blissful moments. Don't ask me now to explain why if $a = 3$ and $b = 4$ that $a + b = 57$. I simply can't remember, but it was nice to be able to say for once in my life, 'Wow, I know algebra'.

It's a bit like that with faith. The great Christian thinker Augustine of Hippo reflected, 'I believe, therefore I understand'. A person without faith often views the teachings of the Bible with incomprehension. 'God and Jesus, and stuff' they say, 'where's the sense in that?' But once a person comes to believe, everything falls into place.

C. S. Lewis wrote, "I believe in Christianity as I believe that the sun has risen: not only because I see it, but because by it I see everything else." Where Neo knew Kung Fu and I suddenly understood algebra, the believer comes to know God and see all things in relation to him. As it says in the Bible, 'By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.'

By faith we also perceive something of God's great love for us. He sent his Son the Lord Jesus to die on the cross for our sins, that we may in be forgiven by faith in him. To believe is to begin to understand what will always be beyond our grasp, 'to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge'.

Following the success of the previous schemes in 2022 and 2023, Wiltshire Council has launched a third solar together scheme with Swindon Borough Council and independent group-buying experts, iChoosr.

Solar Together is a group buying initiative where residents can club together to get the best prices for solar panels and installation as well as battery storage and EV chargers from trusted providers.

The process is straightforward with dedicated support throughout and residents can expect to make a 10-25% saving against the market average. The previous schemes have delivered 1,110 installations, totalling more than 10,660 solar panels and resulting in over £11 million invested by residents into the green economy. All of the schemes combined are also estimated to lead to a reduction of 22,000 tonnes of CO₂ over the 25-year guaranteed lifetime of the solar panels installed.

The scheme is a great way to reach the climate goals for the county and for residents to save money on their energy bills, and even sell excess energy back to the national grid.

Nature Nurture

With the summer holidays upon us, thoughts inevitably turn to visits to the seaside, and the delights of fish and chips and ice creams on the promenade. And gulls - watching to snatch a chip or two from our hands, a feat they manage so expertly that they swoop in, get the booty and fly off without touching the person who'd been looking forward to lunch. To understand why they are now such a problem, we must look at the reasons for their urbanisation. In Scotland – Gull Central for our islands, a BTO study informs that there are numerous reasons for gull invasions, consisting mainly of Lesser Black Backed Gulls, Herring Gulls and Black Headed Gulls - such as loss of nesting sites, dwindling fish supplies, and warming seas. Urban rooftops provide safe nesting sites, with no predators. Although they have been recorded as nesting in urban sites since the early 20th century, it was the Clean Air Act of 1956 preventing landfill operators from burning rubbish, which provided gulls with their golden opportunity, which they seized. It is estimated that there are 1,000 pairs in Bath and 3,000 in Cardiff. With Wimbledon and Euro soccer now completed as I write this consider slowing down your lives for a few days in the summer sunshine by taking time after work and at weekends sitting in your garden in different places and at different times. As well as lessening stress and forgetting work problems for a while you will be surprised at what the wildlife is up to. Most birds will have finished breeding and will be skulking away in the undergrowth moulting – garden birds losing their tails and shedding feathers ready to meet all comers in the early autumn to claim territories – chasing away intruders, even those from their own broods: choosing vantage points from which to sing around their territories to announce that ‘this garden is mine.’ Also, you will be fascinated to watch the hovering species of wasps, bees and flies and others gyrating around favourite flowers and foliage – in fact, you may well be mesmerised. Overall garden birds have had a pretty rough year for survival and revival and many species are not keeping up with their annual numbers. Sitting silently outside today I caught a movement – something dark - about the size of a bumble bee, and as I watched it came again, climbing rapidly up the side of a planter, possibly attracted by the live mealworms we feed our garden birds – it was a pygmy shrew, and these smallest of British mammals need to eat three times their weight a day in order to survive, since as a prey species they use up a great deal of energy rushing about at great speed. And a fritillary butterfly landed briefly beside me, a great thrill as the Big Butterfly Count runs for the remainder of July until 4th of August, and reportedly 80% of our butterflies are diminishing in number, although there are encouraging reports about Red Admirals and Holly Blues bucking the trend. More on this next month.

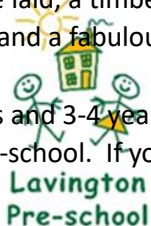

Near misses at the Parsonage Lane, Grove Road, Canada Rise Roundabout

Over the last few months there have been many reports of near misses at the roundabout and the council has received the speed count for Parsonage Lane

Notes from the Highway Code (184-190)

On approaching a roundabout take notice and act on all the information available to you. Adjust your speed and position to fit in with traffic conditions. Be aware of the speed and position of all the road users around you.

Drivers inside the roundabout have the right-of-way over drivers entering the roundabout.

When reaching the roundabout you should give priority to traffic approaching from your right, watch out for all other road users already on the roundabout; be aware they may not be signalling correctly or at all, look forward before moving off to make sure traffic in front has moved off.

The old Code said to signal right if using the last exit, otherwise do not signal, the new code says to signal if turning right. Be aware that some drivers coming down from Spin Hill will signal if turning onto Grove Road, others only if turning up Canada Rise.

The speed limit on the bit of Parsonage Lane coming from the High St, is 20mph right up to the roundabout. Cars from Grove Lane already on the roundabout have right of way even if no-one is coming down the hill. They should not be forced to break to avoid being hit by cars leaving the village via Parsonage Lane. Visibility between Parsonage Lane and Grove Road is poor and drivers on both roads will have little warning of traffic approaching the roundabout from other directions.

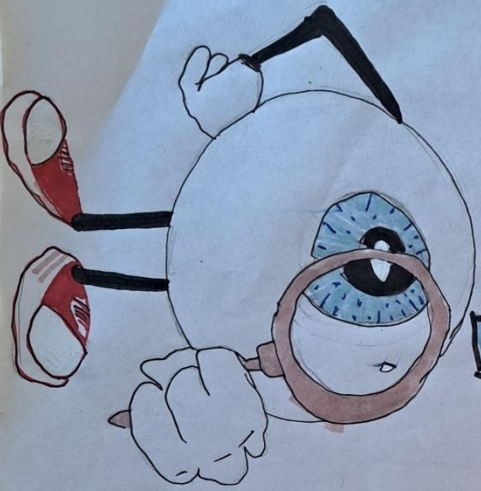
