## Reflection for February 2023

What is happening to our weather? Seasons, not that long ago, could be relied on.

The winter months were cold, sometimes with a period of snow in late December or early January with frosty morning and star filled night skies. We would see a modicum of rain and the odd winter storm. Spring temperatures warmed the earth and brought bulbs to flower. We would dodge the showers of rain and enjoy the lengthening days and the promise of summer's sun to follow.

Now rain floods the fields as the water table is exceeded. Rivers break their banks and wild seas batter the shoreline. Two guests came to the January Parish Council meeting. The first guest was Anthony, the consultant working with West Lavington Parish Council on the review of their Neighbourhood Plan. Soon Market Lavington will have to review its neighbourhood plan as well. If Wiltshire Council does not demand additional building on top of that already in the plan then the review date can just be rolled forward. If landowners that own land agreed for residential development no longer want their land made available or Wiltshire Council want more land for residential development then a formal review will have to happen. Large parts of the plan would be retained and so the review process would be simpler than the original development. Grants will be available to cover costs and all villagers would be asked to feed their views into the plan.

The second guest was Sophie, Her partner Liam who was given permission to metal detect on Parish Council land, but and was held up at work.. Sophie brought along a collection of finds from Canada Woods, including a butter knife, a crucifix, and various coins dating from Roman times through to 1964. The council recognised that they had no financial or monetary value but asked for items to be presented to the museum.

### **The Co-op has confirmed plans to relocate its Market Lavington store to a new, larger spot in the village.**

The current store is on the High Street, but the supermarket chain has announced plans to build a new shop at The Spring. It means a larger store built with wider aisles, a larger range of products available, a bigger instore bakery and 15 dedicated car parking spaces.

Locals people will have an opportunity to voice their opinion on the move.

A Co-op spokesperson said: "Co-op is committed to serving and supporting the community and has shared details of its proposal to relocate to a new and improved store with enhanced range, choice, and services to better serve members and customers in the area.

Co-op say that because the plans are to increase the size of the village's store all current staff will retain their jobs and more jobs will be created for the local community.

If the planning application is successful Co-op plans to relet the current High Street building.

**Peggy Dawn Heather WHITE** formerly of Market Lavington died at Salisbury District Hospital on 8<sup>th</sup> October 2022 aged 92 years. Her funeral and burial at St Mary's Church, Market Lavington was taken by Rev Keith Brindle on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

**June Elaine WIMBLEDON** of West Lavington died at Dauntsey House on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2022, aged 90 years. Her funeral and burial, led by Rev Marion Harrison, took place at All Saints' Church, West Lavington on 17<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

## West Lavington youth club update

As we move into the new year the Youth Club has re-opened. We continue to serve a dedicated group of young people in West Lavington and now have a successful night in Market Lavington. The new Monday night Market Lavington session is at the community hall from 7 – 9 for those aged in school year 6 and above. We have been well supported by other users of the hall, including the table tennis club who have kindly allowed us to use some of their equipment. We have also received kind support from St Arbucks in the village. It is really pleasing to know that the local community sees the benefit of a youth club and want to help support us to support the needs of local young people. We were pleased to have 13 young people from Market Lavington attend the first session. Our West Lavington nights, Tuesday for primary years 4 -6 and Wednesday for school years 7 plus, are now well attended by a regular group of young people. We are planning sessions for the term ahead and look forward to being able to get back outside once the evenings begin to brighten up. All our planned activities can be found on our Facebook page, along with photos of sessions.

As a registered charity we are overseen by a board of trustees, many of whom have been steering the youth club since its creation some twenty years ago. Having seen the youth club successfully re-open after the uncertainties of Covid-19 several founding trustees are now at the point of wanting to hand the baton onto the next generation. If you would be interested in becoming a trustee, or indeed assisting the youth club in any other way, please do get in contact. As a registered charity we do rely on the support of local people and local organisations.





It comes to us all. The children have flown the roost. You go to the cinema to see a superhero blockbuster. Batman, Superman, or some other character in a cape does battle with a baddie who threatens to destroy the world .

Skyscrapers crumble around them and taxis fly through the air. It's loud and visually stunning. Yet without the teenagers in tow it dawns on you that you're not really enjoying this stuff anymore. And anything in 3D just gives you a headache. Reached that stage yet? I have.

My favourite film of 2022 was probably Living, starring Bill Nighy as an ageing civil servant, Mr. Williams. The character's life is stuck on hold in a bureaucratic machine. County Hall where he works seems to operate with the sole purpose of stopping anything happening that would improve the lot of 1950's Londoners.

No capes are donned. No skyscrapers crumble, but the movie packs a powerful punch. Mr. Williams receives the devastating news that he is terminally ill. His first response is to try and live it up a bit with a trip to the seaside. But escapism fails to satisfy his desire to live out his days well, rather than just existing for the drudgery of the office.

What does it for Mr Williams is returning to work. He unites his team in a project that will actually do something for the ordinary people of London, a city that has not yet been rebuilt following the Blitz. The message of the film is that we find purpose in life by doing things that make a difference for others. The final scenes are almost unbearably poignant.

Jesus said, 'I have come that they might have life, and have it abundantly'. That's why he died for his people on the cross and rose from the dead. But Jesus' vision of abundant life isn't an endless round of parties, glitz and glamour. He called upon his followers to love their neighbour as themselves, to care for the sick and feed the poor. Life to the full is for those who believe in the Lord Jesus, die to self and give their lives in the service of others. That's living alright.

## **A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons**

I hope 2023 has started positively for everyone and despite the miserable weather, the evenings are getting a little lighter each day. If, like me, you have younger children you will be used to the countdown to Christmas starting at the beginning of September - allow me to cheer you up by saying, at the time of writing this, there are only 61 sleeps until Spring and even less by the time you're reading it!

As is always the case in winter, our roads are suffering hugely from heavy rain followed by freezing temperatures which cause any cracks in the road surface to explode. Parish Stewards and the Highways teams are constantly moving across the area patching-up potholes to keep the roads useable. I speak to many people who view this work as a "bodge job" and miss the point that this is exactly what it is designed to be. Temporary pothole repairs are carried out to get us through another six months until our roads reach the top of the county-wide resurfacing programme schedule. This schedule is a public document and provides a target date for large scale "proper" resurfacing repairs across the area. If you would like a copy of the document, drop me an email and I will forward it to you.

The most important thing where potholes are concerned is to use the recently updated MyWilts app or website to report them (or any other issue you spot). I reported two potholes using the app last week and within 48 hours the team had come out and fixed them. Not only does the app highlight issues, it allows us to retrospectively analyse data. I am keen to hold third-party contractors to account where road surfacing appears to be of poor quality. Being able to look back at the number of potholes reported in a specific section of road over the last year is a vital tool.

If you didn't see the Gazette & Herald article about Black Dog or the BBC Points West coverage you surely can't have missed discussions on Facebook! This last month I continued to lobby our Highways officers, the previous Cabinet member for Highways and his replacement, Cllr Caroline Thomas, and the Police & Crime Commissioner. It is clear to me that a speed reduction through the junction needs to be implemented alongside other proposed changes. Wiltshire Police is being consulted on a speed reduction to 40mph which all seven surrounding parish councils support.

I hope the Police will take note of recent incidents at the junction and see that reduced speed is a logical piece of the puzzle. In almost all cases, incidents are caused by people pulling out from the side roads in front of oncoming vehicles on the A360. Improving the angle of approach of the side roads, and the visibility splays, will help drivers better judge whether traffic is approaching on the A360 from either direction. If A360 traffic was moving at 100mph it would be impossible to safely judge whether it is safe to pull out. Likewise, if traffic was moving at 5mph it would be very easy. The logic follows therefore, that it is safer pulling out within a 40mph limit than within a 50mph limit. I have to say that Wiltshire Police has shown a renewed willingness to support us across the area recently and so I wait with hope for a positive response.

NEW SEASON BEGINS ON MARCH 18TH

The new season of Edington Arts concerts begins on Saturday 18th March with an afternoon of music from the young and extremely talented international De Beauvoir Trio.

The trio was formed in 2019 by violinist Enyuan Khong, with cellist Charlotte Kaslin and pianist Elisabeth Pion; they were recommended to us by the international music charity IMS-Prussia Cove, with whom we have had links for several years now. They were selected for the IMS masterclasses in April 2022, cementing their reputation as one of the most talented and exciting ensembles of their generation.

They have put together a programme for the afternoon which combines the ‘late great’ composers Beethoven and Dvorak, with short works by two female composers, Gabriela Lena Frank, and Lili Boulanger. Frank is Peruvian/American, and a giant of the contemporary US classical music scene, who as well as being mixed race Latina, has also overcome serious hearing loss. Lili Boulanger, a child prodigy, died in 1918 at the tragically early age of 24 having already demonstrated a genius which would have ranked her among the greats of 20th century composition.

The concert starts at 2.30pm in Edington Priory Church, and we hope you will stay on afterwards for tea and cake, and the chance to chat to these three sparky and very talented musicians.

**Separate bins for domestic upholstered seating to be introduced at Wiltshire’s Household Recycling Centres**

Following recent new guidance from the Environment Agency, residents will see new bins at Wiltshire’s Household Recycling Centres allocated for the separate disposal of upholstered domestic seating, such as sofas, armchairs, and home office chairs.

New Environment Agency requirements mean that certain items can no longer be sent to landfill and must be disposed of by incineration. In Wiltshire, these items will be sent to facilities that create energy from waste. The new rules have been put in place because some upholstered seating may contain Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) that are harmful to the environment if sent to landfill. POPs can be found in the fire-retardant chemicals used in the padding, linings and coverings of upholstered domestic seating.

Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) are chemicals that accumulate and remain in the environment for long periods and can have harmful impacts on wildlife and the wider environment if sent to landfill.

**Plastics are again on the Eco-agenda**

In January 2021, we wrote: “The fact that plastics are now a serious concern for the planet is evidenced by the fact that more and more governments are proposing measures to reduce their impact. Environmental pollution is one reason; it can take up to between 500 and 1,000 years for plastics to decompose in landfills and the chemicals that go into plastics during the manufacturing process can potentially leach out into our food, water and bodies. Another reason is that the manufacturing of plastic products affects the environment through carbon emissions and other types of airborne pollution contributing to global warming. Researchers worry particularly about the effects on children and what continued accumulation means for future generations.”

In January 2023, plastics are back on the agenda. Having already banned the sale of plastic straws, stirrers and cotton buds in England in its fight against single use plastic waste, the Government is now expected to announce the phasing out of the use of single-use plastic cutlery, plates and polystyrene cups, to be replaced by biodegradable alternatives. It is also thought to be looking at wet wipes and tobacco filters among other single-use plastics.

A spokesperson for The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) said:” We are determined to go further and faster to reduce, reuse and recycle more of our resources in order to transform our waste industry and deliver on our commitments in the ambitious 25-year environment plan.”

Environmental groups have welcomed this initiative and, as we’ve said in the past, each of us can choose not to use products containing plastic and purchase sustainable alternatives instead. As consumers, we can also look to make manufacturers change the way they produce by changing the way we consume.

Hoping that our 2023 will be as plastics-free as possible!

## St. Barnabas School

We have had an exciting start to the Spring term in Stonehenge Class. In our Talk for Writing unit, we have been exploring settings through our model text inspired by the story of The Secret Garden. The children have been using a range of ways to describe and bring a setting to life. The children have been using personification and metaphors in their innovation writing. In History, we have loved learning about the Shang Dynasty and the children are working on developing their knowledge in order to answer our big question 'How did a pile of dragon bones help to solve an Ancient Chinese mystery? We have also been learning about the important Kings of the era and how animal bones were used to communicate with the Gods. The children have enjoyed looking at some artefacts and discussing what they might have been used for. In Maths, Year 6 have been developing their arithmetic skills and have been exploring how to solve problems involving fractions, decimals and percentages. Year 5 have been using different methods to solve multiplication and division calculations. In Science, we have been investigating the properties of different materials and understanding how different mixtures are separated. The children are looking forward to planning and conducting experiments about evaporation and filtering. What a great start to the year!

In Savernake class so far this term, we have been exploring the model text 'The Egyptian Cinderella' which is a twist on the traditional tale, where the children have enjoyed learning and exploring with a focus on descriptive writing, ready for us to create our own independent descriptive story based on a traditional tale. In History we have been answering the big question 'How do we know who the Anglo-Saxon's were and what was important to them?' Which has included looking into how they became citizens of Britain, what their settlements were like and how they lived, and exploring historic artifacts. In Maths this term, both Year 3 and 4 have been learning about multiplication and division, which is also supporting the Year 4 children in preparing for their MTC in June. The children are also very much looking forward to starting whole class violin lessons next week! Finally, in Science, we have been exploring the big question 'How are sounds heard?' Which the children have thoroughly enjoyed investigating.

Silbury Class have been learning to write dialogue in literacy which they've have excelled at. It has included using inverted commas, question marks and exclamation marks. In History we've been learning about 'continuity' with the past which has included learning about toys from the 1960's which may have impacted upon children's toys and play today. In Maths children have been focusing on money and in Art they have been learning about print, transferring an image from one surface to another.

Sarum Class have got straight back in to some exciting learning after Christmas using the story 'Lost and Found' as a basis for Literacy. We've also used the amazing winter weather to help develop our understanding of cold, freezing and melting and linking this to Learning about cold places such as Antarctica. They enjoyed the challenge of making sledges and skidoos as well as planning an explorers trip and writing a list of things they would take with them. We have been 'photo detectives' and looking at how pictures give us clues about things that happened in the past and are looking forward to taking a walk into the village to visit the Market Lavington Museum and look at old photos of where we live later this term. Forest School sessions have continued across the school with some great artwork being produced using stones, leaves and sticks to show the changing Winter colours. We are so proud of all the children and the efforts that they are making to be the very best that they can be.

## Sports Facilities Survey



### Results
