The Bishop of Salisbury's letter for February

It won't have escaped many of us that this year, Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day. This may feel like an uncomfortable union.

Whilst we know that Valentine's Day is Saint Valentine's Day, the commercial reality of this occasion means that it has become a day of heart-shaped balloons and chocolates, red roses and looking your best for that romantic meal for two. This doesn't sit easily with the sombre, penitential tone of Ash Wednesday when flowers are removed from our churches, and we are brought face to face with our imperfections; our daily ability to turn from God. As a gritty cross of ash is marked on our forehead we are told.

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.

This stark, deeply humbling, yet powerful moment sets the tone for the season of Lent when we are called to step into the wilderness with Christ and therefore into a time of prayer, self-reflection, repentance and self-denial. Yet, nothing about Ash Wednesday or Lent is about dwelling in self-loathing or indeed an unforgiveness of ourselves for the times when we have turned from God. On the contrary, it is a time when we are re-directed and recentred on our absolute need for God – for God's forgiveness, for God's grace, for God's saving love made know to us through Jesus.

Maybe then Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are not poles apart after all. For it is in the wilderness of Lent, and indeed in the events of Holy Week that follow, that we see face to face the depths of God's love. A love that isn't expressed in fine dining or red roses, but the bread and wine of the Last Supper, the blood of Christ shed on the cross and the joy of the open tomb on Easter morning.


If you are sending Valentines cards, don't forget you can get your card stamped with a Lover postmark, in Lover village on the outskirts of the New Forest, the home of St Mary's church and Redlynch PCC. The villagers decorate their houses with love hearts and there is a café and shop too – it's a lover-ly day out!

I can remember when the village of Lover (pronounced Low-ver) still had a Post Office and the second week of February was busier than the run up to Christmas. Like many villages the Post Office has gone, but from February 7th to 14th and from 10am to 4pm they have a pop-up post office.

Mr Bates vs The Post Office movingly highlighted the plight of sub-postmasters and mistresses who were accused of theft and false accounting by the Post Office. It was the Horizon computer system, not the workers who were at fault. The programme provoked huge public outrage at the injustice faced by hundreds of innocent people. Government ministers were spurred into action. Wrongs will at last be righted and due compensation handed out. Justice at last. We hope.

In an episode of Inspector Morse Lewis asks his boss if he believes in God. The Chief Inspector replies that he sometimes wished he did, reflecting, 'A just God. A God dispensing justice. I'd like to believe in that.' Yet the justice of God is not often spoken about these days. It seems that the church is happy to trumpet God's love, but is all too often silent when it comes to proclaiming a just God.

That is a mistake. An unjust God who was indifferent to right and wrong would not be worth worshipping. 'The Lord loves justice' the psalmist assures us. And rightly so. Justice demands that all are equal before the law. Justice insists that the innocent are declared to be in the right and that the guilty are condemned. A good God must be just.

But 'a God dispensing justice' is an uncomfortable thought. After all, who of us can claim to have lived our lives according to the perfection demanded in God's law? When measured by that standard, the Bible admits, 'None is righteous, no, not one'. We will all therefore be held to account by a just God.

But isn't God forgiving? Yes, but not at the expense of justice. That is exactly why God sent his Son Jesus into the world. He came to fulfil the righteous demands of God's law on our behalf. Jesus suffered and died, bearing the penalty of our sin on the cross. It is on that basis that all who believe in Jesus are forgiven and put right with God.

The day will come when God will put the world to rights. He will overthrow evil and condemn unrighteousness. That day holds no fear for believers. They will stand before their Maker and Judge clothed in the perfect righteousness of Jesus. 'A just God. A God dispensing justice' is certainly worth believing in.

Edington Arts is celebrating the start of their tenth season on Saturday 23rd March with a full length (two hour) performance of Bach's St John Passion by the Oxford Bach Soloists and orchestra under their conductor Tom Hammond-Davies. The great international tenor Mark Padmore will be singing the role of The Evangelist. The performance is being generously sponsored by Edington Station Yard Ltd, and by The Three Daggers.

Bach's account of the Passion from the Gospel according to St John is 'punchier' than that of the St Matthew, and the superb communication skills of both soloists and chorus will be used to most moving effect. The Oxford Bach Soloists have been performing the St John Passion on Good Friday in Oxford for many years, where it has become an iconic, essential ingredient of the preparations for Easter. This will be the first time they have performed the St John Passion during Lent outside Oxford, and we are delighted they have chosen Edington as their venue. Their recent London debut, with Bach's Christmas Oratorio, received a five-star review in The Guardian, whose reviewer said "This virile, collegiate approach to Bach is the most exciting I've heard in a very long time".



Ash Wednesday (the first Day of Lent)

The word "Lent" comes from the old English, "lencten," which means "spring."

Some Christians from more orthodox or traditional denominations fast during Lent. They begin with the wearing of ashes on Ash Wednesday and give up meat, fish, eggs and more for the 40 day period. Others choose to give up comforts or luxuries such as chocolate, junk food, social media or television.

For many Christians, Lent is a time where they make space to pray, read the Bible and reflect on God's love.

For others it is a time to give their time and money to make the world a better place.

Nurture Nature February 2024

It might sound like an oxymoron, but a dead hedge is a wonderful habitat that's full of life. Dead hedges provide hiding places and nesting habitats for all sorts of creatures, as well as food for insects. As it rots down, the nutrients are recycled back into the earth below, meaning your garden 'waste' needn't go into garden bins or bonfires. Creating a dead hedge is an ongoing activity, which can be added to every time you prune a tree or cut back a shrub. You can also work in a hedgehog house into the hedge base, as well as an open front nest box. There is every opportunity to get creative and artistic with a dead hedge - woody prunings can be woven in, and you can even grow climbers along the hedge for added wildlife value. What you'll need:

- Garden prunings
- FSC wooden posts (if using)
- Mallet (if using posts)
- Climbing plants (optional)

Wildflower seeds (optional). In nature, dead sticks, logs and leaves teem with life - they're as much a part of the ecosystem as the flowers, leaves and new growth we prize. A dead hedge is an upright structure of woody cuttings woven between vertical stakes. The stakes are usually the sturdier branches cut from trees or shrubs. They provide a tangled maze and a perfect hideaway for birds such as blackbirds, robins, wrens and dunnocks to nest and forage within. A dead hedge is the kind of feature you can build up bit by bit, month by month, whenever you do a little pruning or tidying around the garden. By giving your dead hedge its own place in the garden, you can keep the garden tidy and good for wildlife at the same time. Ideally, use straight lengths of branch, 3 to 5cm diameter, cut from the garden. If possible cut a point to the end and hammer into the ground in two opposite rows about 45 to 60cm apart and at 1 to 1.5m spacings between stakes along each row. Alternatively, you can use simple wooden garden stakes to get started. Begin by pushing woody prunings between the stakes. Over time, add more cuttings to the pile, weaving longer branches between the stakes and among the cuttings. Although, inevitably some twigs will stick out and look 'untidy', avoid the temptation to cut them back. They will make great perches for birds and even insects to sit and hold territory from. The next step is to add a little colour to your dead hedge. You can grow climbers through or over a dead hedge easily honevsuckle or clematis is a great idea. Or, how about creating a mini wildflower meadow nearby? Simply sprinkle some wildlife-friendly flower seeds around to attract bees and butterflies to your dead hedge area.

There was an interesting piece on Countryfile of 14th January 2024 on rejuvenating dead hedges and hedge building in general (BBC 1), which it might be possible to view on Catch-Up. Some topical info – the Asiatic Black Bear, Yampil, rescued from the bombed zoo in Ukraine where most of the animals were killed by Russian bombing, has now arrived at the Five Sisters Zoo in West Lothian to continue his recovery. At the other end of the scale you can watch the wonders of wildlife in our countryside by watching two clips on the internet – 'Tidy Mouse in Shed' in Kent and 'Man Builds Entire Village For Mouse He Saw In His Sheffield Garden'. Children will be absorbed by these clips. We wondered how walnut halves appeared in unexpected locations around the garden! Have a constructive conservation year in 2024.



COMMUNITY ORCHARD IS GO!

Orchards have played an important role in Communities for centuries, providing a focal point, a gathering space, a place where people and nature can successfully work together, with the bonus of a tasty treat each year.

With this in mind, a few months ago, the local Tree Wardens sent out a poll on Facebook to see if there was still an appetite for a Community Orchard in the village. This was based on responses from the community back in 2022 from this magazine and other presentations last year, when asked what you would like to see in Community Park. The answer to the orchard was a resounding YES! The land identified as the potential site was within Community Park (where the rusty goal posts used to be) and so they went to the Parish Council for permission to plant on some of that land. The Tree Wardens would be very happy to help other Parishes, Community Groups, or Schools raise funds for their own orchard for the 2024/25 season.

The Parish Council gave their full support to the Tree Wardens to raise funds for the orchard and to improve the site, working with the Friends of Canada Woods and Community Park Group. Funding has now been awarded by the Tree Council and the planting will go ahead in late February. The site needs to be prepared and all those lovely people who offered help would be very welcome to come forward, fork and/or spade in hand from the 10th February.

The other news is Friends of Canada Woods and Community Park, having worked on behalf of the Parish Council since 2021, now has the status of Community Group and we will be working hard to plant the Orchard with the Tree Wardens, along with raising funds to improve Community Park in terms of accessibility, educational activities, games for young and not so young, seating to create places of reflection, bringing age groups together by organising Community events, while increasing habitat corridors and the biodiversity of the land and the woodland above.

The Community Group has also been busy making applications for habitat hedging and an opportunity to plant 5 fruit trees with a golden theme, awarded in celebration

of the Tree Council's 50th Anniversary of the 'plant a tree campaign'. We are hoping 5 people, who have shown community spirit, worked within the community for at least 50 years, or are living in the community supporting others or charitable causes, will each plant one of the 'golden' trees.

We are always happy to accept volunteers along with suggestions in line with the Community Group philosophy to add to the list of wants, so if you would like to get involved, please contact us in any of the ways listed below. There will also be the facility to donate for a project within Canada Woods and Community Park, or buy one of our lovely hoodies direct from the website to raise funds shortly. The trees had to be bought when the grant money came available, and will be delivered towards the end of the winter when they have the best chance to thrive. The layout of the community orchard has not been finalised and there will be other resources available on the site. The ordered trees are on semi-dwarfing stock, so fruit will be within reach of everyone of all ages. Hopefully within 3 or 4 years lunch will be being picked by people on their way to school each morning.

There have been a lot of reports, and evidence, of dog walkers not picking up after their dogs within this village. Within minutes of being in the field below Canada Woods yesterday, where children play, I had to clear up two heaps of dog pooh, just off the footpath and easily accessible, or stepped in! And I do not have a dog!

People, for goodness' sake... it is not that hard. You can purchase long handled poop scoopers if you have trouble bending down. Just because you do not walk in areas of Canada Woods for example, it does not mean that children playing games won't step, sit, or roll in your dog's pooh.! PLEASE PICK UP THE POOP!

Footpaths and bridleways

We are very fortunate to have so many footpaths and bridleways in and around our village, and on behalf of the Parish Council I'm setting up a working group to address issues related to them. We need to look at and assess the condition of each one, including stiles, and consider work to be carried out to bring it up to a better condition. It may be that we also have a working party that walks the paths and carries out light maintenance. I know that there are lots of walkers, dog walkers and horse riders that would like to see the conditions improved also. A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

2024 started with a bang and sparked lots of ideas for change, including proposals in Highways and Planning which will be of interest to us all.

Poor funding from central government has led to less gully and drain clearances by Wiltshire Council. Likewise, there has been no incentive for landowners to reduce water run-off from fields, and clear ditches. Wiltshire Council is putting an extra £1million into drain and gulley clearance, including a third vacuum machine, whilst DEFRA is looking at incentivising landowners. I am pushing for a long-term funding increase to acknowledge the fact that weather patterns are changing and we need to deal with more rain annually than we ever have before.

At Black Dog, the closure of the spur road north of the junction is a step closer thanks to the support of local residents, Parish Councils and the Highways team. I anticipate this being implemented in the next few months once the legal paperwork is complete (the Department for Transport ensures this isn't a straightforward or quick process!). A proposal for a huge change to our local countryside and agriculture came last month in the form of a planning application for a 200-acre solar farm in Potterne, Easterton and Market Lavington. Opposition is strong with many, including myself, asking why we are losing good land in which we can grow crops in order to generate electricity we cannot use due to grid capacity.

Another proposed change in Market Lavington came from an application for houses and a larger Co-Op. This came as no surprise since a hundred or so residents attended a presentation back in 2022 when the idea was floated. Since that meeting, I have been regularly asked when the new Co-Op will be built by excited locals! I am told a larger Co-Op has been supported by three-quarters of locals who took part in a survey last year. However, there is a lot for residents, the Parish Council and Planners to consider because the proposal is a deviation from the Neighbourhood Plan (voted for by locals) which earmarked the site for housing. I expect some interesting debate will follow! I have written about 5 Year Housing Land Supply before; a flawed target for building new homes. We have lost many Planning appeals because we have been kept from hitting the target through the manipulation of figures by unscrupulous developers. I am pleased to report our lobbying of Michael Gove has been a success and we now have a 4-year target (which we are exceeding). This should protect us from further overdevelopment in the Devizes area.

Finally, a potentially life-saving change in West Lavington. The defibrillator in the telephone box in Rutts Lane, which was due to be removed because of the loss of its required electricity supply, has been relocated to the wall of The Old Bridge Inn pub. Residents can now rely on a defibrillator in the lay-by in Littleton Panell, one at the Village Hall and another on Church Street. The Parish Council website has a map showing the exact locations.



Market Lavington Surgery

Closure of Urchfont Branch Surgery

Reluctantly Market Lavington Surgery has taken the difficult decision to close our branch surgery at Urchfont Village Hall on the 31st of December 2023. We appreciate that this might not come as a surprise to you as we have been unable to provide services there since the pandemic.

As you may know, the opening of the Devizes Health Centre was an opportunity for us, as an average sized practice, to reconsider how we provide care. This was with a view to us becoming more resilient and responsive to patient demand for appointments. To do this, we contribute some of our workforce to the collaborative team of clinicians who work at the Devizes Health Centre. Whilst we now have more clinical staff to provide this service and our routine appointments at the main surgery, we are unable to reintroduce clinics at Urchfont Surgery. We have not considered this option lightly and we hope that you understand our reasoning for the decision we have had to take.

We would like to reassure all our patients that our service will run as normal at Market Lavington, the practice is 2 miles from Urchfont surgery and is purpose built to meet the healthcare requirements of its patients. When the pandemic forced the closure of the Urchfont practice our patient base adapted well to the change and visited our main surgery without too much inconvenience caused. Any housebound patients registered with the surgery in the village continued to receive the same support and continuation of care in the community as before.

Therefore, the proposal to make the closure permanent is not without precedence as we have already had a significant impact trial period for the last three years.

We would like to thank the community of Urchfont for their support during our residency in Urchfont. We are saddened to leave our rural outpost but have had to put the needs of our patient base as a whole first and foremost, in our planned activity.

Local Nature Recovery Strategy January 2024 update

A vital part of developing the local nature recovery strategy for Wiltshire and Swindon is engagement with stakeholders.

Context

Local Nature Recovery Strategies (LNRS) are a new, England-wide system of map based strategies that will establish priorities and map proposals for specific actions to drive nature's recovery and provide wider environmental benefits. Wiltshire and Swindon's strategy will, for the first time, provide an agreed, coherent, and compelling approach to nature recovery, directing financial resources and organisational effort to where it is most needed. Wiltshire Council has been appointed by DEFRA as responsible for preparing the Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) for Wiltshire and Swindon.

Our approach

The main steps in developing the LNRS are set out below.

Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan Review

The Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan was made in May 2021, and covered the period up to 2026. During the recent review of the Wiltshire Council Local Plan (formally the Core Strategy) Market Lavington, as a designated Local Service Centre, and deemed capable of supporting new housing development, is currently required to find space for another 55 homes in addition to the land already set aside for development in the existing Neighbourhood Plan. In order to ensure that any further development proposals reflect local wishes in terms of location, design, and local need, we need to be proactive in planning for the future of our village. It is therefore considered that now is the appropriate time to undertake a review of the existing Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan. The first stage of the review process would be to form a Steering Group, made up of local residents and Parish Councillors.




