#### Drove Lane, a reminder.

From time to time people complain about the top end of Drove Lane and ask the Parish Council, Wiltshire Council, and this time has even suggested writing to our MP about it.

The tarmacked section of Drove Lane and the pavement is the responsibility of Wiltshire Council, though the Parish Council does pay for occasional leaf removal from the pavement.

Beyond the tarmac, this is private access to houses and fields leading off it. This is not a footpath, bridleway or Byway. Anyone who uses the path without the actual or implied permission of one of the landowners is trespassing.

You can go up there to visit or deliver a parcel to a resident, but it is not a short cut from Kings Road to St. Barnabas School, the Elisha Field, or any of the houses or fields on the tarmacked section of Drove Lane.

It is as private as the shared Driveways of Kings Court, George Mews, and Strawberry Fields

Ebenezer Baptist Chapel was built in 1839. It was constructed by voluntary labour, using chalk dug out of the adjacent hillside. This original building only stood for 50 years. The present Church building was rebuilt on the same site.

The Church withdrew from the Baptist Union in 1990 and 18 months later joined the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches (FIEC). Ebenezer is also a Grace Baptist Church, holding to the Second London Baptist Confession, 1689. 'Ebenezer' is taken from 1 Samuel 7:12 and means, "Thus far the LORD has helped us." It is only by the help of the LORD that the gospel witness of Ebenezer Baptist

Church continues in West Lavington.

St Mary's Market Lavington Parishioner Update - December 2021

#### Dear Parishioners,

During 2021 we have been able to re-open St Mary's Church for regular services and for individual visits, as the restrictions associated with COVID-19 gradually eased. The prevalence of the new Omicron variant of the virus means that precautions will continue to be taken at church services, including wearing of face masks, maintaining a degree of social distancing and the need to sign the visitors register, or else scan the NHS locator QR code with your smartphone, using the NHS Covid-19 app. As previously reported, during the 2020 close down we had an opportunity to undertake some much needed work inside the church, to remove damaged plasterwork and expose the stone walls underneath to enable them to 'breathe'. This has been particularly necessary for the north wall, which has been badly affected by damp, however all the external walls are impacted by this problem. Additional work was required to be undertaken on the roof of the Vicar's Vestry, also to the roof at the northwest corner of the north aisle. The Vicar's Vestry roof in particular requires more work, which will need to be undertaken by a specialist team and this work is likely to incur significant cost to fix the roof.

The long serving oil-fired boiler is no longer operational, which means that we have had to deploy some oil filled electric radiators inside the church building, more to stave off damp, then to generate any significant heat. We have also deployed a dehumidifier to try and remove some of the damp inside the church building. We are investigating the possibility of installing solar panels on the roof of the church, but there are some significant obstacles to getting permission for this, given the grade 1 listing status of the building. During the colder part of the year we will not use the church building, but will divert services to St Barnabas at Easterton, as well as offering services in other churches within the benefice.

More recently work was completed on the clock in the church tower and we also completed some additional work in the tower to protect it from incursion by nesting birds, with more work still required to keep the birds out.

An itemisation of the various activities include:

We have repaired all the previously broken windows.

• We have obtained an electrical certificate. This is probably the first time we have ever had the electrical installations in the church tested, despite it being a legal requirement for a public building. Cost to remedy all the problems that have been identified with the electrical installation will be about £3,000.

• An asbestos survey has been completed. This has identified that there is asbestos in the church. Asbestos can only be removed by specialist contractors and a cost of around £1500 to £2,000 would be incurred for this.

• H&S work has been started on the Tower Stairs. While fixing the mesh in the bell chamber in the tower, we had an opportunity to do some cleaning up in the bell tower, but this will require more time. The condition of the bells and the bell housings will probably need to be checked by an expert.

We are commissioning the installation of a handrail beside the steps ٠ to the pathway at the south-east of the churchyard and hope to complete work on the bench seat located close to the African Bean tree with a view south towards Salisbury plain. The bench seat is not in good condition, so might need to be replaced, rather than repaired.

During 2019 we engaged a new Architect, with a view to taking some fresh perspectives about what is required to improve the church building. Most of the work that has been identified by our architect relates to items of maintenance, to ensure the integrity of the building for the next few years. To maintain the building properly requires both a significant amount of money as well as time from the volunteers, who support the church in various ways.

#### The Big Garden Birdwatch 2022

Last year we wrote about the survey that had taken place during a week in June in All Saints' churchyard West Lavington which sought to build a picture of the range of wildlife that is already present in the churchyard to assist in planning how to make it more biodiverse. Birdlife results were particularly poor.

This may not be surprising in view of the serious, countrywide, decline in the numbers of many birds, including many well known and loved species. Swifts and house martins have joined other insect-eating summer migrants that have been red-listed for some time. One regular, the greenfinch, declined so much that in 2021 it was placed on the UK red list, jumping straight from green.

The time for the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch of 2022 is fast approaching and everyone is being encouraged to get ready to join in from 28-30 January. The largest wildlife survey in the world, the Big Garden Birdwatch has been running for over 30 years. Last year was a record year, with people more or less confined to their homes by Covid-19 restrictions. Over a million people took part and over 17 million birds were counted. As a conservation charity, the RSPB depends on the public's support to save nature and to look after places where wildlife can thrive. Taking part is a great way to help make a difference. It's terrific fun too and gets us closer as well to nature where we live.

You can request a free information pack to help get you ready and to identify the birds you see. Then all you need to do is to count birds in your garden or around you for one hour on 28, 29 or 30 January. Record the highest number of each species that you see land at one time and send in the results to the RSPB online or on paper. Our birds are in trouble. Our biodiversity too. A 2021 analysis indicated that the UK, with an average of only 53% of its biodiversity left, is in the bottom 10% of the world's countries and last in the G7.

We hope you will feel inspired to take part in the 2022 count – whether in your garden, churchyard, a park etc near you!

Wiltshire PCC Philip Wilkinson has launched the second phase of consultation: Making Wiltshire Safer which he will use to inform his new police and crime plan.

The next phase starts today with the public able to download a copy of the PCC's draft police and crime plan from his website and feedback their thoughts on the proposals.

The plan, which will be finalised in March 2022, sets out the PCC's pledges and priorities for Wiltshire as well as being the blueprint for Wiltshire Police's strategic policing and crime priorities until mid 2025.

PCC Philip Wilkinson said: "My new plan should directly reflect the needs and priorities of all communities and it is very much my vision to make Wiltshire a safer place to live and work.

Mr Wilkinson's draft plan was also informed by responses from public and victim confidence surveys, his election pledges, the UseYourVoice survey, which saw nearly 3,000 individual responses, as well as responses from more than 1,000 young people surveyed by his Youth Commission.

#### The new priorities detailed in the plan are as follows:

Priority 1 – A police service that meets the needs of its communities

Priority 2 – Reduce violence and serious harm

Priority 3 - Tackle crimes that matter to local communities

Priority 4 - Improve the experience of victims and deliver justice

During January, Mr Wilkinson will hold a serious of Focus Group sessions for invited stakeholders to comment on his proposed priorities and what that may mean in real life.

Alongside being able to download a copy of the draft plan and comment, the public can also attend one of four virtual public sessions where Mr Wilkinson will present his draft plan and ask for feedback.

Sessions, held on Facebook Live, are scheduled for the 6th, 13th, 17th and 26th of January from 6.30pm to 7.30pm.

More information on how to join the virtual public sessions will be promoted across the commissioner's digital channels. If you can't be there in person, you can submit a question beforehand via the PCC's website.

All feedback received will be considered and will directly influence the final police and crime plan, which will be before the police and crime panel on 10 March for final approval.

#### Bishop Andrew's Monthly Letter, January 2022

Our days are filled with calls upon our time and attention. Among the least welcome are the cold sales calls that intersperse our day – those anonymous, brief exchanges with callers who address us by the name of a long-forgotten tenant of our home, and with whom no kind of even fleeting relationship is possible. Several times a week, we might rush from the bathtub, meal table or meeting to pick up the phone, only to be asked whether we are the householder - and feel our heart sink and blood pressure begin to rise.

The poor fools who work in call centres have my pity - only because I was one of them for a while. I was selling advertising for a local newspaper. I found making cold calls so impossibly awkward, I even tended to depart from the usual script and began my sales pitch with 'I'm so sorry for bothering you', 'you probably won't want this', and 'you must feel free to say no, but I have to call you....' Just occasionally, this grovelling approach actually worked, and one could have a proper conversation. I lasted but five months on the job.

Then there are other calls: calls which are so surprising, so welcome, that life seems to open up with their appearance. These little epiphanies can come through the phone – in the good news of a job offer or an unexpected invitation. But, equally, they come in other ways: someone in need, for example, whose call upon our assistance somehow makes us more human; or perhaps in the form of a sudden revelation – like a film or piece of music, perhaps, which might fill us with a sense of expectancy, or expresses our yearning so deeply that we are renewed. These kinds of encounters not only inspire us, but they also ask something of us and call us forward into a different way of life.

'Behold', says the risen Christ in the Bible: 'I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice, and opens the door, I will come in, and will eat with him, and he with me.' Scripture invites us to imagine Christ as an unexpected caller: one who will not barge in, but patiently waits for our response. He does not want a minute of our time, or have an unrepeatable special offer, but comes to meet us so that we might follow where he will lead. The Lord's arrival in our midst is the wonder of this season: bearing the light of the world, he calls us forth. As with gladness so many have done before, may we also follow.

The Right Reverend Dr Andrew Rumsey, has been Bishop Of Ramsbury since January 2019. He was born in Marlborough in 1948, and lives there again with his wife and three children.

Both he and his wife have been involved in the Greenbelt festival for many years; and have also attended New Wine with the family in recent years. In July 2021 Bishop Andrew was appointed as lead bishop for church and cathedral buildings. He shares the role with the Bishop of Bristol, the Rt Revd Viv Faull.
