Bishop's Monthly Letter - March 2023

On Saturday 25 March, there are only 274 shopping days left until Christmas! This timely reminder comes not to send you to the shops, but to remember that there are nine months until Christmas comes round again. Nine months – for this day is the Feast of the Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary, when Mary was told by the Archangel Gabriel that she was to bear a son, and that she will name him Jesus. This day and indeed this month of March reminds us of God's preparations behind the scenes for our salvation. Each year we celebrate the fact of the Incarnation, of God being born among us, the Word made flesh, Emmanuel. Having an incarnational understanding as Christians means we understand God to be involved in our lives through the Holy Spirit, not just in March or at Christmas, but every day. Indeed, God is preparing the deepening of his engagement with the human condition everyday as we further the work of his Kingdom here and now.

To live the next nine months knowing within ourselves that God is preparing us for his mission now and in the future is a helpful way of life, for it means the God is already at work, whether we choose him or not and whether the society he came to redeem knows him fully or not.

Mary's response to this amazing news was 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' In what ways in this next nine months, can we say YES to the incarnate Lord? How might you be being called? As the Spirit moves within us, who do we need to say yes to, when before, our answer to someone else, often different from ourselves, is always no? How many days are left, before we all say YES to God?

Earth Hour - The Great Switch-off

At 8.30 pm local time on March 25th, people around the world will be switching off their lights for one hour!

This began in March 2007, as you may know, when more than 2.2 million individuals and 2,000 businesses in Sydney, Australia switched off their lights for one hour to raise awareness about environmental degradation and to encourage people to take action to protect the planet. This marked the beginning of the Earth Hour movement.

Earth Hour was first proposed by the WWF and today it is one of the world's largest grassroots environmental movements. It takes place every year with the same aim as it did in 2007 - to unite the world in support of the people and the planet. However, it has gone beyond switching off the lights for one hour. It is also a time for reflection on our impact on the planet and how we can make a difference, together. People join from their homes and local communities in over 190 countries and territories. In 2022, famous landmarks - from the Sydney Opera House to the Colosseum and the Eiffel Tower, stretching to the London Eye and to the Empire State Building - turned their lights off.

Joining in the big switch-off allows even small actions to make a difference because we're not alone. The next generation cares about tackling the nature and climate crises; every year, schools and youth groups across the UK mark Earth Hour. By raising awareness of this simple, but very significant, movement, we can inspire others around us to take part and show their concern for the planet. Says the WWF: "We all need nature. And nature needs us to stand up for it every day. By 2030, nature and wildlife could be recovering all around us. Our leaders have promised to put nature at the heart of climate action, to secure a safer future for all of us. Now we must make sure they deliver on their promise. Everyone has a part to play – and it starts with a single switch. Will you join us?" Cultural Christianity

Several years ago we spent our summer holidays in Carmarthen, West Wales. Disaster struck. I ran out of books to read. But ever the intrepid traveller I endeavoured to remedy the situation by popping into a local bookshop. Browsing the history section, a book with an orange and gold cover caught my eye. It was Rubicon by Tom Holland, who was originally from Salisbury. The book told the story of the rise of Julius Caesar. It was a bloodthirsty tale of ambitious men jostling to become top dog in Rome.

Caesar made a name for himself when leading the campaign to subdue Gaul. It is said that in pursuit of that goal he slaughtered a million Gauls and enslaved a million more. Today we would call him a war criminal and demand he be tried for his atrocities at the Hague. But the people of Rome hailed Caesar as a hero. The glittering prize of being appointed 'dictator for life' was bestowed upon him in 49 BC. Although his life was cut short when Caesar was assassinated on the Ides of March in 44 BC. At first Tom Holland admired the heroes of ancient Greece and Rome, but the more he immersed himself in that world, the more he was disturbed by their casual cruelty. The author realised that he was viewing the actions of the likes of Julius Caesar from the perspective of a culture that was deeply steeped in the Christian faith. Christianity teaches that all people are made in the image of God and are therefore worthy of dignity and respect (even Gauls). That was the basis of modern day human rights. Jesus said, 'blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth'. Caesar wouldn't have agreed with that. But today we champion the underdog and demand that the poor receive the help they need.

Tom Holland doesn't claim to be a personal follower of the Lord Jesus, but he does recognise that some of our most cherished values derive from the Christian faith. His book Dominion: The Making of the Western Mind shows how the faith has shaped our culture. But it is one thing to admire 'Christian values' and another to actually be a Christian

The Christian believes that Jesus is the Son of God who died upon the cross for our sins and rose again from the dead. Jesus promises those who believe in him a place in his everlasting kingdom. Cultural Christianity may admire the faith for its benefits, often picking and choosing the bits it likes, while rejecting the rest. But the kingdom of heaven is not to be selectively admired from outside, but entered as a person is transformed on the inside. As Jesus said, "Unless a man is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Have you ever needed to use a car for just a few hours or day? Maybe you have a second car that isn't used much but costs a bomb to get through the MOT every year? The cost covers fuel / recharging*, insurance, tax and roadside assistance. Furthermore, each shared car club car also helps remove 8.5 private cars from the road, reducing the pressure on car parking spaces as well as helping our environment by tackling congestion and pollution.

Co Bikes are a great alternative to the car for many shorter trips including commuting, everyday errands and leisure trips. Plus, because they are electrically assisted, you can zip along and tackle hills, all without breaking a sweat!

In addition, Wiltshire Council wants to understand if residents would like to see secure, on street bike hangars for people who can't store their bikes at home or work.

Bishop Stephen's letter to all clergy in the Diocese of Salisbury following the General Synod vote to approve prayers for God's blessing on same sex couples. Dear sisters and brothers,

As you will know, General Synod has been meeting in London. This follows what many said was an honest and informative session at our own Diocesan Synod. You can read a short report of that synod session on our website.

It has been a challenging General Synod for all involved and for the whole church. I want to offer my deep appreciation to our excellent Synod representatives who have conducted themselves with dignity and partnership, in prayer. Despite how it may be portrayed in headlines or on social media, in my experience the Living in Love and Faith debate was one of quality, sensitivity and grace. Views and concerns were aired over a nine-hour debate which went into a second, unplanned day. One Member of Parliament commented on social media that Parliament could perhaps learn from the General Synod on how to do such things!

I made clear at our Diocesan Synod that I intended to vote for the motion and after listening to the long debate I did so, in company with the majority of each synodical House. I believe this motion, now passed, provides a way forward for the Church of England, offering greater pastoral care and welcome to those in a same sex relationship and keeping intact the existing doctrine of Holy Matrimony. I know that those who hoped for no change or for greater change will be disappointed with the outcome and I have heard the pain and grief that has been expressed by many on all sides. This has not been an easy road for anyone. Yet I believe that, over the whole lengthy process of Living in Love and Faith, we have modelled a new way of coming together, seeking to listen and understand one another more deeply, which will bear fruits in so many different ways. I thank God for the willingness of all those in our communities who have journeyed so courageously with us over these past few years. There is now much to do as we consider together how the decision will be lived out well in the months and years ahead, in integrity and with good conscience. I will ensure that you are kept informed of any discussions in the House of Bishops, as the draft texts of the prayers are considered in the light of contributions from General Synod. Draft prayers and pastoral guidance will be brought to the July Synod, and no prayers should be used before they are formally commended by the Bishops. I want to say again to you that those who wish to use the Prayers of Love and Faith and those who choose not to will receive equal support from me as your Bishop. I pray we may now have a time of reflection rather than reaction, and a reliance on well sourced information rather than rhetoric.

Regular users of Wiltshire Council car parks are being encouraged to consider buying a parking season ticket as a more convenient way to commute and to save money.

Having a season ticket can help drivers save approximately 50% on the daily rate at Wiltshire Council car parks. Currently a permit for central long stay Salisbury is £97 per month, which equates to £4.85 per day on a five-day week and £4.04 per day for a six-day week. The standard daily charge is currently £9.90. Savings will, however, vary depending on the car park.

Season tickets are available at individual car parks across the county, including those in Chippenham, Devizes, Melksham, Trowbridge and Salisbury, and are available in one-month, three-month, six-month or 12-month options.

Multiple cars can be registered on each season ticket, although the permit will only be valid for one vehicle at any one time. Season tickets are fully electronic and synchronised with Civil Enforcement Officers' handheld devices, so paper permits/tickets will not need to be displayed in the vehicle.

Cllr Richard Clewer, Leader of Wiltshire Council, said: "Season tickets are available in many of our car parks and provide the best way to save on your parking costs. It's also the most convenient for regular parking, as it provides unlimited access to the chosen car park, so you can park as often as you like, regardless of your reason for parking or time period being used.

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

You may know that I hold the Education & Skills portfolio within Wiltshire Council, in addition to my role as representative of The Lavingtons. It was therefore a doubledisappointment to hear of the White Horse Federation's decision to change the post-16 education offering at Devizes School with huge consequences for Lavington School and our local students, present and future.

Years of work went into creating a sixth form for young people in the Lavington area and great progress was still being made. Lavington School was growing thanks to the post-16 offering and as a result our community could offer an additional pathway to our young people.

I am particularly interested in hearing from young people and their families who are impacted by this recent change, or those who moved into the area with post-16 education at Lavington School in mind. Please get in touch to share your thoughts. I am committed to supporting our local children and young people in their journey through education. I will do everything I can to ensure they have the opportunities that

their peers in neighbouring towns have in terms of A-Level and Post-16. I do not agree with our Prime Minister in terms of his ambition to see all students study some form of Maths until 18. We must understand that children hold individual skills and passions which need to be nurtured in schools to encourage great achievement. There is no "right" set of skills to hold, other than the basics required in day-to-day life. Some children will grow to be scientists or mathematicians, some to be musicians or athletes. Pushing all students to study mathematics will be detrimental to those with alternative ability and passion.

Good teaching is the identification of interest, passion, or ability in a subject, and the nurturing of that ability combined with direction. From Early Years to Further Education, the opportunities for young people to flourish exist at every step. This is why I want to see Lavington School students be able to explore an extensive range of subjects at school beyond the age of 16.

2019. https://sophieduker.com/calendar/ booking In the recent very cold weather some readers have seen bumblebees collecting nectar from winter flowering plants, such as winter flowering honeysuckle, mahonia, abelia grandiflora and of course - ivy. These will be the hardy British species prevalent at this time of year (February, March), probably the buff tailed bumblebee (bombus terrestris) or possibly the early bumblebee (bombus pratorum) with an orangy yellowish bum, quite common in gardens and parks in early spring. There has been interest from readers in the super highways of hedges and trees for wildlife and it's still the season to plant native trees and hedges which are best suited to the climate and soils of the British Isles. By planting berry bearing species such as blackthorn and hawthorn, elderberry, spindleberry, vibernum, wild cherry, dog rose and whitebeam, all essential plants providing valuable nourishment to conserve wildlife, and will help stem the decline of species and attract fauna, and the resulting floral displays will brighten up your lives too. Web searches of local nurseries and garden centres will help you source the species you choose. A word of warning from a recent national newspaper article : "Trees left to die in rushed planting schemes". The reasons being lack of aftercare and management. Watering of newly planted stock is essential especially in long spells of hot weather, (dribble hoses are ideal), seasonal pruning to encourage growth will be needed and maybe some form of electric fencing protection (or hazel hurdles) should you be visited by local deer and grey squirrels which can be very destructive too. However you will get much pleasure from watching your whips or larger stock grow and bulk out over the seasons and years, as the old saying has it 'Big oaks from little acorns grow". It's also frog and toad spawn time – don't you wish you'd dug that pond? One of the best features to attract a multitude of wildlife. Avian flu is still very much a concern of seabirds especially. Wetland reserves are reporting fewer numbers of winter migrants such as geese, swans and ducks and divers. Our native birds are still under threat too, so continue to keep birdbaths and feeders very clean. After a very wet at times, and cold winter, by Valentine's Day snowdrops are at their best, and crocii are flowering too, most parts of the South had not had rain for four weeks. With the Spring Equinox (20th March) not so far away – who will be the first to hear a cuckoo this year? Can you remember when you last heard one? The writer can't. There is a website for following cuckoos' journeys from deepest Africa to our shores. Also spare thoughts for the lot of wildlife in Ukraine, in the earthquake affected areas of Turkey and Syria, in the flooded areas of the Antipodes and in all the regions of the world where current wildfires have destroyed wildlife and their habitats. In 1871 one of the last Great Bustards in Wiltshire, and more than likely in the whole of the British Isles was shot. The taxidermist did his stuff and Otis Tarda was displayed in Salisbury Museum. Quite a few readers will no doubt have visited the Great Bustard Centre at Wexland near Netheravon, established in 2004 to restore this once native species to the British List. One can follow the history on the GB Group's website. Initial failures with eggs and birds from the Russian Steppes, (a BA pilot was very helpful on the transportation side!) Better success from 2014 with Spanish stock, and now in this decade this once extinct magnificent bird is now restored to Salisbury Plain and other parts of Southern England as resident. A great conservation success story.
