Praying for the People God Knows We Need

This autumn it has been a joy to institute and licence a record number of clergy to new posts and as well as being the beginning of new ministry for individuals, communities and parishes, these services represent the culmination of months of careful work. The appointment of clergy is one of the most important tasks of being a bishop, overseeing the right person appointed to the right place, not only fulfils the vocation of parish and priest, but also ensures faithful ministry now and in the future.

Sometimes the departure of a parish priest is sudden, sometimes it is planned whatever, the period of vacancy ensures time is taken to review the needs of a particular place or places, of a particular church or churches, to make sure that the defined task is realistic and forward looking. This can involve vision days and consultations with Patrons and other interested parties. The role needs to be accurately defined and the drawing up of a profile and advert a careful process, bearing in mind that some weeks well over forty church leadership posts are advertised nationally in the Church Times.

The recruitment and appointment process, co-ordinated by the archdeacon and our local office, involves careful managing, as applications arrive, shortlisting takes place and interviews and visits are organised. Patrons, parish representatives all participate in what is ultimately and most importantly a task of prayerful discernment as references are sought and read, candidates welcomed, and a day of interviews held. Presentations are made, homilies preached, and the local school visited. Then following appointment all the necessary checks are made before an announcement and plans for moving take shape, including the preparation of the house and organisation of the licensing service itself.

As often is the case much hard work proceeds a joyful celebration. Prayer is essential, and so often the temptation is to ask for the person we all think we want, when rather than trusting that God will provide the person God knows we need. I am forever thankful for all those who at the end of these processes come to the diocese to serve the church faithfully as priests. We welcome those who have arrived recently and continue to pray for parishes in, or soon to be in, vacancy.

'The past is a foreign country: they do things differently there', wrote L.P. Hartley. Just how foreign and exotic is the past was brought home to me the other week. My wife and I went to hear the author Tom Holland give a talk on his new book, Pax: War and Peace in Rome's Golden Age. In the opinion of Edward Gibbon, the era covered by this work (69-138AD) was 'the period in the history of the world, during which the condition of the human race was most happy and prosperous'. Not so much, perhaps, if you were a woman.

These days there is widespread outrage if allegations are made that a powerful man has exploited his position to gain sexual favours. #MeToo scandals have engulfed the words of politics, business, entertainment and the police. All that would have made no sense in ancient Rome. It was the expectation that rich and powerful men were entitled to pounce on anyone they pleased.

As a boy, Holland was fascinated by the heroes of Rome. To him they were the awe-inspiring apex predators of history. But as he grew up and immersed himself in the ancient world, the author found himself appalled by the monstrous cruelty and depravity of Rome's overlords. Holland realised that he was viewing the mighty emperors of old from the perspective of someone who lived in a culture that was steeped in the Christian faith. He tells that story in his previous work, Dominion: The Making of the Western Mind.

In his preface to Pax, the author describes the Christians living in the period of Rome's 'Golden Age' as 'Mesozoic animals in an ecosystem dominated by dinosaurs'. Those tiny Christian 'mammals' seemed pretty insignificant as they scurried around at the feet of towering T-Rex figures like the emperors Trajan and Hadrian. But they sparked a revolution that still affects the way we think today.

Christians held that men as well as women are made in the image of God. That is the basis of equal rights. Christ is pictured as a husband who loved the church as his bride and gave himself up for her on the cross. In the light of that the church upheld the importance of marriage and men were forbidden to use women just as they pleased. The #MeToo movement only makes sense in that context. In Paul's Letter to the Galatians we discover the meteorite that destroyed the dinosaurs. The impact of that meteorite is still sending shockwaves around the world centuries later: 'There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.' (Galatians 3:28)





We welcomed 5 new families to our setting this September, who have all settled really well. We also welcomed Miss Natalie and Miss Jemma to our teaching team.



We have had a busy first term, we started with the theme "All About Me". children took home books and filled them with photos of their families and home life, when they bought their books into pre-school, they were able to tell us all about their pictures. The children had fun looking at their reflections in the mirrors, looking at their features and then drawing amazing self-portraits. They also discovered all the ingredients and instructions to make playdough in one of the tuff trays and then set about making their own playdough. They measured out the ingredients, chose which colour playdough to make and then explored how best to mix and make their playdough.

On rainy days we put on our waterproofs and wellies and went on a "welly walk", this involved lots of puddle jumping and fun. We have also been on nature treasure hunts, collecting leaves, sticks and conkers which the children then used as treasures with playdough to make hedgehogs. The children took home paper bags and went on "Autumn treasure hunts" with their families and were excited to share their finds with their teachers and friends. We were able to talk about the colours, shapes and textures of our treasure and which birds we thought the feathers had come from. We have been carrying out some science experiments looking at what would happen when we mix mentos with cola, the children screamed and laughed when the liquid fizzed high up out of the bottle with the mentos flying out of the bottle too! We also experimented with milk, food colouring and washing-up liquid, the children were amazed with the effects as the washing-up liquid changed the surface tension of the milk causing the food colouring to make amazing shapes and patterns.

We would like to thank all our families for their kind donations for our Harvest Food Collection which will be passed on to Devizes Food Bank.

We do have spaces for 2-year-olds and 3-4 year olds, for any new families wishing to join us at Lavington pre-school.

Thank you to all the parents who came, your input into your children's reading is so vital for their success and makes so much difference to their progress.

Our school council organised their first fundraising event last term with a hugely successful cake sale in aid of Wiltshire Air Ambulance. They were then able to present a cheque to the Wiltshire Ambulance when they visited us towards the end of term. All the children were excited to learn CPR and practice on dummies. The children were also introduced to the defibrillator and how it works, which is great as we now have a defibrillator in the School Office.

One of our favourite days from the term was our artistic 'Dot Day' which involved a whole day of arts and crafts inspired by different artists and using dots. We now have a wonderful display in our art bay that I hope many of the parents saw when we hosted our 'Fabulous Finish' assembly at the end of term.

We finished last term with our Harvest Festival at St Barnabas Church in Easterton. We walked together in the fresh sunshine and sang our favourite Harvest songs. A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

Another crash at Black Dog crossroads this month, thankfully, this one was relatively minor and nobody was injured. I wish to thank one of the drivers involved for contacting me and supplying me with photos and details. Yet again, just as those completing my survey have said unanimously, the accident was caused by a car pulling out from the Worton road into oncoming traffic.

I have yet to hear from *anyone* involved in an accident that was *not* caused by poor judgement or a lack of attention from drivers emerging from the side roads. This reinforces my opinion that traffic lights or a roundabout are unlikely to solve the problem, and in fact could make it *more* dangerous.

Currently it is very clear to drivers emerging from the Worton road that they do NOT have a right of way. They have a "hard stop" and must wait for a safe gap in which to join the A360. Drivers on the A360 who are familiar with the junction usually exercise caution, sensibly questioning whether the car they see sat at the junction is going to pull out. My concern is that as soon as you introduce a green light to A360 traffic you will lose that cautious approach. "Ah but what about the red light on the side road?", I hear you ask! The Institute of Advanced Motorists states that 57% of cyclists and 32% of car drivers admitted to jumping red lights on occasion. If a driver comes down the A360 with reduced caution because they have a green light in front of them only to have a driver (or cyclist) jump the red, the force of the impact is likely to be greater. The same goes for roundabouts; I would estimate at least once a month I find myself on a roundabout only to have someone pull out in front of me. We know driver error is the root cause of accidents at Black Dog and it would be dangerous to expect traffic lights or a roundabout to cure driver error.

Budget has been set aside by Wiltshire Council to improve Black Dog. The solution we are seeking focuses on moving hedges and fences to create better visibility from the side roads. Realignment of the junction will also improve visibility, whilst improved signage and surface treatment will warn drivers of the hazard. We also seek a reduction in the A360 speed limit to 40mph and the closure of the cut-through on the bend north of the junction.

I met with Council officers, the Cabinet member for Highways and the office of the Police & Crime Commissioner again last week and it was confirmed that officers are now seeking the support of surrounding landowners to enable fences and hedgerows to be moved. I cannot stress strongly enough how important landowner support is to this project.

The survey remains on my website (www.dominicmuns.co.uk/black-dog) so please let me know the circumstances if you too have been involved in an accident at the crossroads.

Lastly, I was very pleased to see Market Lavington Parish Council agree to continue to support the library within the Old School despite legitimate concerns over running costs. The library is very well used by Market Lavington, West Lavington and Easterton residents and the decision will safeguard the future of the library. Thank you to all councillors for their support.



Wiltshire Council held the last of the 16 in-person Local Plan drop-in sessions this week, but there is still plenty of time to have your say before the consultation ends at 5pm on Wednesday 22 November..

Devizes Area Local highway and footway improvement group (LHFIG)

Good news from the LHFIG:

- Congestion in the narrow High St opposite Trinity House: the LHFIG is elevating the
 issue to a prospective Substantive Scheme to get it above the level of the relatively
 modest LHFIG budget. The process will kick-off with a site meeting, possibly on the 8
 November 2023.
- 2. The No Cycling sign at the Broadwell end of MLAV 32: Highways Engineers accept that the sign should already be there as the counterpart to the one in New St, so they will pass the issue to the Highways Area Team who will thus action the requirement at no cost to Market Lavington Parish Council, including a new post if required.
- 3. Speed Indicator Devizes socket infrastructure on Church St / The Spring: LHFIG is happy to support one new socket for another Speed Indicator Devizes on the understanding that MLPC pick up 25% of the cost, the project estimated at < £1,000 so < £250 for the Parish Council. Previous works were based on a 50% contribution from the Parish Council. This will allow the device currently on Spin Hill to be used om two different sites.</p>


