Octobers Reflection

There have been a number of funerals recently in our Benefice. Each of course, has been significant for the families involved and in some cases, had a wider impact than on simply the close families.

Soon it will be Remembrance Sunday and we hear the names read out of the people who gave their lives for their country and their fellow men, it is difficult to imagine their funerals - some were buried with great ceremony and circumstance, others' graves were simply marked with wooden crosses in a corner of some foreign field, others still remain dreadfully anonymous.

But all funerals great and small, are interesting events.

They are where the living come face to face with death. A funeral forces us to think about mortality and occasionally even about how we live our own lives and what our own core beliefs about death are

What does death actually mean to us?

At this time of year John's Gospel is often quoted. He tells us "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends". And this, of course, is precisely what the gallant men and women have done in wars from the battles of Hastings to Helmand Province. And it is right that we should be extremely grateful to them all.

But a chapter earlier in the same Gospel in John 14, there is a different message, equally comforting. Jesus promises "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also."

This should give us a clue. Christ is promising us eternal life, that death has a purpose and that life continues. Thus our funerals, whether they are family affairs or great occasions or anonymous are all glimpses of what is possible, what is prepared for us. As Rossiter Raymond's poem puts it:

Life is eternal; and love is immortal; and death is only a horizon; and a horizon is nothing save the limit of our sight.

So funerals, whether personal or national, are merely a gateway into a new, painless and perfected life. And as such the fact of death is not gloomy or dispiriting but a time for remembering and celebrating the lives lived and a place in Heaven for us all.

Christianity in decline?

According to a survey cited in the Times newspaper, around 75% of Church of England clergy believe that the UK can no longer be called a Christian country. The latest census data bears that out. In 2011 the number of people identified as Christian was 60%, but by 2021 that had dropped to 46%.

For hardline secularists the decline of Christianity in our country may be an occasion for rejoicing. But as Rod Liddle argued in a recent column in The Sunday Times, what we're left with as Christian influence has receded is a more individualistic society, devoted to the pursuit of material gain. The trouble is that looking after number 1 and buying endless stuff online hardly satisfies the deepest longings of our souls.

Similarly, as Celia Walden reflected in an article in the Daily Telegraph, we've swapped the worship of God for the worship of self, "as a secular society, we've thrown ourselves into the cult of self, precisely because we're flailing, with no basic spiritual scaffold to keep us steady." Welcome to the brave new post-Christian world.

But if we broaden our perspective to take in the global picture, Christianity is not in decline. The faith is advancing in China, Africa, South America and even Iran. Here in the UK Rod Liddle points to the "rapidly growing numbers attending Pentecostal and evangelical churches — where eternal biblical certainties are still enjoined upon the worshippers".

The worship of self and wealth are poor God-substitutes. The eternal biblical certainties set before us the one true and living God who is worth worshipping. He is the God who sent his Son, the Lord Jesus to die for our sins and be raised from the dead that we may have the hope of everlasting life. Jesus calls us to renounce the cult of self saying, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."







A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns, Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

Planning is the one subject sure to fill a Parish Council meeting because, as residents, we care about what is being built around us. A starting point for decision making is a document called the Local Plan which has been revised by Wiltshire Council and is out for consultation from Wednesday 27th September. The Local Plan sets out the vision and framework for housing, infrastructure and land for employment growth for the next 15 years. Once adopted, all planning applications will be determined against the plan, making it the most important place-shaping document for Wiltshire. Wiltshire Council is holding 16 drop-in events at libraries and leisure centres around Wiltshire and a live webinar-style online event. More information can be found on the Wiltshire Council website. I urge you to take a look and have your say! Having had to repair an alloy wheel damaged in a pothole last winter I am pleased to hear that Wiltshire Council is to invest an extra £10m into road resurfacing to improve Wiltshire's highways. The £10m bonus is in addition to the £14m being spent this financial year on maintenance. The additional money will be spent on preventative maintenance and a road resurfacing programme including small, local repairs to the highways and verge repairs on rural roads. The B3098 from West Lavington to Great Cheverell is looking great, I hope that the same road between West Lavington and Eastcott will receive the same treatment soon. It is worth saying that Wiltshire Council was able to spend an extra £10m (whilst so many other councils are going broke) due to excellent financial management and budgeting through a very difficult few vears.

Mention CCTV to some people and they grimace and mutter something about "Big Brother". I have always been of the view that if you aren't doing anything wrong you don't need to worry; I feel safer with CCTV than without it. I mention this because last month one individual, who drove onto a football pitch and churned the grass up by doing "donuts", found himself in court pleading guilty to a criminal damage charge before being ordered to pay compensation to the parish council concerned. This was possible thanks to the state-of-the-art CCTV which covers the entire village hall building, carpark and playing field, and provided clear video evidence of the crime, including the vehicle numberplate and the driver sat in his car. CCTV is being used across all the villages by parish councils and residents to protect property on behalf of all of us. Our playgrounds, pitches, buildings, footpaths, and community spaces are part of the fabric of our community. It is right that we work together to protect them and I hope you will feel comforted by the fact that CCTV exists and action will always be taken against anyone damaging "our" community.

A final note – I'm really keen to gain as much crash data as possible related to Black Dog Crossroads to supplement the limited data held by Wiltshire Police from "serious" accidents. I have added a short survey to my website. If you have ever been in an accident at the crossroads, however minor, please complete the survey:



Nurture Nature October 2023

Forests and woodlands are the roots of our nation, and we need to cherish and protect them and increase their acreage more than ever. A recent report stated that the UK was well down in the list of countries supporting nature. This comes as quite a shock to many of us.

Cats and their impact on our native birds – the University of Exeter is conducting excellent research on the impact of cat predation on songbird numbers, which will assist cat owners to reduce their moggies' hunting behaviour with simple solutions . Such actions will help to save tens of thousands of songbirds across the landscape of the British Isles, and in our gardens and wild spaces. (

Readers – be early birds yourselves and listen to Tweet of the Day just before the 6 a.m. News on Radio 4. You will learn a lot of interesting information about our birds and species around the world generally. Autumn is the best time of year to plant trees and shrubs. Some of the bee magnet plants are abelia grandiflora, the sarcococcas, honeysuckles, including the winter flowering Lonicera fragrantissima, mahonias and sedums. As a follow up to an earlier article on swifts – developers, house builders and house owners can provide help to halt the sharp decline of this extraordinary species by incorporating 's

wift bricks' into new builds/extensions etc. Details can be found on the Internet. A few years ago one house holder had just made the final touches to a swift brick he had installed in the side of his house at a suitable height and aspect, and had hardly reached the ground off the ladder when an adult swift swept into this artificial nesting site and successfully bred. What a joy! One can also get nest boxes for house martins to be attached under the eaves of houses and other buildings. There are also swallow nests available for erecting in barns, stables and outhouses, even lean-tos.

A recent reader response to hedgehog sightings and diets is that it's best not to feed mealworms. So a trawl of the scientific research is on the enu. Proprietary hedgehog food and dog and cat food are recommended by hedgehog sanctuaries. However, it's wise not to leave food out overnight as this could encourage unwanted vermin. Another interesting response about birds and chimneys and flues was that on clearing out a blocked off fireplace during a house renovation the number of dead birds found at the bottom was staggering. So please consider having cowls fitted to your chimney pots and flues – cowls with sufficient close meshed wire around them to prevent birds from accessing stacks and flues, which should they succeed – will almost certainly lead to their demise.

We are again in the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness and spiders' webs are works of art. Please try not to destroy them or kill spiders in the house by vacuuming etc as they do so much good.

Whether it is destroying public gardens, setting fires in the sports pavilion, emptying litter bins in the street, picking at the new play surface, pulling up sign boards, stripping tree bark on private land, attempting to destroy park benches, abusing new play equipment to breaking point, or trying to prise open, and committing criminal damage to, the notice board in the High Street, these are all acts of vandalism which have happened in the last few months throughout this village.

There are facilities in this village, a great football club, youth club, guides, cubs, sea scouts and a youth council, for our young people to enjoy. There are three play parks and the Elisha Field and Community Park. As a Parish Council, we have an ongoing challenge to raise funds for additional sports facilities, upgrading existing facilities and development of redundant land, and pressure on the limited budget in having to carry out repairs caused by this vandalism is jeopardising the progress of these projects.

There is a real need to engage with our young people, and to encourage them in positive pursuits. 

CANADA WOODS

The Canada Woods regeneration programme will commence on the 2nd October. For your own safety and for the safety of the contractors there will be no public access to Canada Woods until the 4th November.

THERE WILL BE NO PUBLIC ACCESS TO CANADA WOODS FROM THE 2ND OCTOBER UNTIL THE 4TH NOVEMBER.
